Formal Notice Served to End Town Centre **Outdoor Market**

Owners Give Traders a Month

The Town Council regrets to inform residents that it received official notice on 29th April 2014 that its agreement with the Town Centre owners, which enabled the market to operate in the Town Centre, has been terminated by solicitors acting on behalf of the owners, giving one month's notice as required by the contract with effect from 1st May 2014.

Effectively, this means there is no longer a site available in the Town Centre that the market can operate on.

Therefore, the Town Council had no option other than to give, in turn, one month's notice to the market operators, Newton Aycliffe Market Traders' Co-operative, to terminate the agreement that it has to operate the Tuesday

This notice had to be served immediately in order to give a month's notice to run concurrently with the notice to the Town Council from the Town Centre owners.

The Town Council has previously looked at options in or around the Town Centre to site the market, however only one site was identified adjacent to the Town Centre that may have been viable. following

Unfortunately, enquiries, it enquiries, it has been confirmed that the site identified is not available for this use. Therefore, the last market to be held in the Town Centre will be Tuesday 27th May 2014.

WE MUST FIGHT TO RETAIN OUR TOWN CENTRE MARKET

Dear Readers,

I wonder how many townspeople know about the intention to close our Tuesday Market held in the town centre?

While shopping there I was dismayed to hear this news from one of the stallholders. Apparently the owners of our town centre, Freshwater, have contacted them to say as from 1st June they can no longer trade in the town centre. Our Town Council had promised to discuss this matter, as they hold the market licence and gave the stallholders permission to be in the town, but up till now no one has been to talk to them face to face!

Some time ago the Market Traders were told their stalls were "looking scruffy" and it was thought they were modernised town centre! The market traders spokesperson contacted the Town Council and offered to purchase new covers for the market stalls at their own cost, and this offer was put to Freshwater but refused. They have also been told there is no other plot of land available near the town centre for them to continue trading as a market.

They asked about the piece of land which has stood neglected just over the road from Aldi. but were told this was private land owned by Durham County Council and has been designated for future use and could not be offered to them.

I visited our MP's office this morning soon after visiting the Marker Traders and Phil Wilson's aide Paul Trippett told me our MP would not be in the office until Friday, and the stallholders must contact him personally to arrange a meeting to discuss this

problem. During the last part of our regeneration the market traders where given a small area on Greenwell Road to trade from on a Tuesday. This was not ideal, but our traders struggled on through

let the townspeople down and still offer a service.

Most have no transport and cannot use public transport through ill health. What do you say to these poor people who rely on this Tuesday Market day, sorry but tough luck? There has been no public or press notice of this major change.

Is this because both the Town Council and Freshwater know how much controversy this will cause?

I received a telephone call from Town Clerk Andrew Bailey who informs me that the Town Council have their hands well and truly tied in this matter, as all they do is hold the licence for the Market. It is down to Daejan on behalf of Freshwater who have told the Town Council they want the Market to cease trading as soon as possible. There has been no public announcement about this as the Town Clerk has been busy writing letters to all the Market Traders as

lowering the tone of the newly all weathers determined not to he thought this was more important.

If enough people got their pens and paper out, and wrote a letter to County Hall maybe they would sit up and take notice, and offer the Market Traders this small piece of land available next to the

New STEM Campaign

The 3M manufacturing site at Aycliffe has pledged to work with local schools to encourage more girls to study the STEM subjects science, technology, engineering and maths.

The commitment is part of the diversified technology company's support for a new government campaign – called 'Your Life' encourage to greater participation among women in STEM.

NEWTON AYCLIFFE STUDENTS VISIT NEW BIOGAS PLAN



30 pupils from a Newton Aycliffe primary school ecame official 'Waste they Warriors' when visited the north east's only commercial food waste anaerobic digestion facility to see how leftover food is processed into biogas. The eco team from Woodham

Burn Community Primary School has been taking part in a food waste campaign created by Emerald Biogas to help schools understand the growing impact of disposing of unwanted Following a visit by the renewable energy company to the school earlier in March, where the pupils learned about the anaerobic digestion process, the pupils were given workbooks with activities such as designing a team logo, completing an animation of the anaerobic digestion process recording the food miles for the school's lunch, to develop their creative design, problem solving and mathematics

As part of the Waste Warriors campaign, they have also been recycling their own food waste produced at school in recycling bins to be processed at the plant. This week 30 Year Five pupils from Woodham Burn Community Primary School took a tour of the plant to see how their leftover food is digested and turned into green energy.

Operations Manager Paul Scott gave a lively tour, with the pupils captivated by all the processes, sights and sounds, including the depackaging machine, the large tanks where the bacteria feed on the food waste and

the post-digestion tank where the biogas is produced and turned into heat, power and fertiliser.



Once again the folly of selling our town centre to a private landlord has been proven. Ownership of a town's main shopping precinct should not leave the local authority or the will of the people powerless in such a situation!

PCC Chief **Monitors** Stop and Search

The Home Secretary, Theresa May, has responded to a public consultation on stop and search powers on police forces in England and Wales. More than 5,000 people responded to the consultation conducted by Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Constabulary (HMIC).

27 per cent of the stop and search records they examined did not contain reasonable grounds to search people. That means more than a quarter of the one million people stopped by police, carried out under the Police and Criminal Evidence Act last year, could have been

illegal. Locally, Durham Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) Ron Hogg monitors stop and search data to ensure equality in policing, as part of his scrutiny role across the Durham Constabulary area. During 2013/14, Durham carried out 12,074 of which 11,958 (99%) were of white

persons and 116 (1%) were from ethnic communities The 2011 census showed that white persons represented 96.1% of the population of County Durham and Darlington, therefore, stop and searches of white persons are slightly above the proportion of the population. In terms of stop and searches per 1,000 population, for white persons this is 20.1 and 4.8 for ethnic communities. Of the 11,958 white persons

stopped and searched, 1,241 (10.4%) were arrested as a result, compared with (11.2%) from ethnic communities.

Responding to the latest consultation, Mr Hogg said: "I expect everyone to be treated equally and I am happy that the force is not abusing the stop and search process in terms of targeting certain sections of community'





Motorway Breakdown

Road safety charity the IAM is advising on what to do if your car breaks down on the motorway.

• Plan ahead: keep a reflective iacket, warm waterproof clothes and a torch in your car. Put the number of your breakdown company and your membership number in your phone. Some breakdown services offer free mobile phone apps, often even if you are not a member. Use the phone's GPS system to find your precise location.

• Get out of the vehicle by the left-hand door and make sure all your passengers do the same. If you have a highviz jacket, put it on and make sure everyone is standing well away from moving traffic. If there is a safety barrier, wait behind it.

· Where possible, coast to

an emergency telephone. If you use your mobile phone, you may be asked to give the number on the nearest marker post, located every 100 meters or on a square blue sign every 500 metres.

• Don't attempt a repair on the hard shoulder of a motorway, call your breakdown company. • If you feel threatened by

someone, get in the passenger seat, lock the door and dial

• Be safe and be patient while you wait for help to arrive.

IAM chief examiner Peter Rodger said: "Breaking down is stressful, but be prepared by knowing what to do and when. Thinking about these things in advance will place you in a better position in case it happens and relieve some of the strain."


