Can You Put the Wag Back in Jim's Tail?

Dogs Trust Darlington is appealing for a dedicated dog lover to be a temporary foster carer for one of its canine residents who has recently undergone surgery to his tail. Jim, a medium-sized crossbreed, came to Dogs Trust Darlington about a month ago after being found as a stray. Sadly he had to have part of his tail removed and is urgently looking for a temporary foster home where he can chill out away from kennel life, without too much disturbance, to allow his tail to heal. Sue Embleton, Dogs Trust Darlington Rehoming Centre Manager, explains: "Volunteer foster carers on our Home from Home scheme provide a lifeline for dogs who need some extra TLC. Some dogs cope with kennel life better than others, but for those who struggle or like Jim are recovering from surgery, being in a temporary home can make all the difference, helping them to relax and aid their adjustment into a new home. Families will receive our full support and advice, and will be equipped with everything they need such as food, bedding. Any vet fees will also be covered by Dogs Trust. If you're an experienced dog owner, have lots of free time, and live locally to the rehoming centre, please get in touch if you can help." "All dogs on the Home from Home scheme need to be cared for during the day and not left for longer than four hours - Jim is so friendly and cuddly but he needs to be constantly distracted from aggravating his tail injury. Ideally we're looking for people who don't have young children and no other dogs, to give his tail a chance to heal." The Dogs Trust Home from Home initiative is designed to give extra care to dogs that find kennel life stressful or have not had much experience of living in a home environment. These dogs, so often overlooked by prospective owners, are given a safe and loving, temporary home until they feel back to their happy selves and are ready for a permanent home of their own. They may be puppies, older dogs or dogs that aren't coping in a kennel environment and need some special care to get their tails wagging again! Lazy Aycliffe Drivers

Dear Sir,
I have been driving for more than two thirds of my life, and one thing I have noticed more than ever is how lazy drivers have become, adopting an 'I DON'T CARE' attitude. There are those who can't be bothered to indicate, ones who cut corners in and out of junctions and straight over mini roundabouts and this also includes Police Drivers. On Thursday 7th May at approximately 2:15pm I

followed a police white Ford Transit Van, and on it's approach to the roundabout the driver straddled the white line separating the two lanes without indicating. The driver turned right onto Shafto Way, again with no indication to show the vehicle was leaving the roundabout. If the police don't indicate their intentions, how can we expect other drivers to do so?

NORTH EASTERNERS NOT KEEN ON FOSTERING

Why aren't people in the north east so keen on fostering? Only 21 per cent would consider fostering now or in the future, according to a poll released by the Fostering Network, compared with 24 per cent of the UK population. Yet north east residents are confident about fostering and their ability to be foster carers. The YouGov poll, published to coincide with the start of Foster Care Fortnight, found 69 per cent felt positive about foster carers and the work that they do. Moreover 26 per cent said they thought they were very or fairly likely to be accepted as foster carers if they applied within the next two years.

Commenting on the findings, Foster Care Fortnight co-ordinator James Foyle said: "Foster carers across the north east do an amazing job providing homes, stability and security for thousands of children every day. "But we need more of them. North easterners seem positive about fostering and confident they could do the job, now we need to encourage more to come forward and see if they have the skills to foster." Care leaver Clare Marshall,

who was fostered in the north east, said: "The support of my foster family helped me believe in myself and follow the path I wanted to take. My proudest moment was definitely getting into university."

"I've now set up my own business and am newly married - I'm living proof that a stable foster family can make all the difference in the world." There are over 3,200 children from north east England living with foster families on any one day. The Fostering Network estimates that a further 450 foster families are needed across the north east

this year alone, particularly to look after teenagers and children with disabilities, as well as providing homes to groups of brothers and sisters. This year's theme for Foster Care Fortnight is "guess who fosters", with the aim of smashing stereotypes about who can and can't foster, and highlighting the skills and qualities actually needed to become a foster carer. 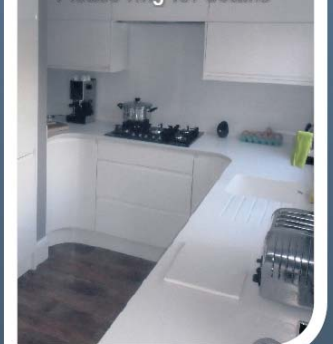

THE IMPORTANCE OF EUROPE AND THE ELECTION

I am aware the euro-elections - which take place next week - are the Cinderella elections of British politics, ignored by many, and used as a protest vote by others. This is a disaster for the North-East, for few people appreciate the extent to which our survival as a region depends on the European Union.

FUNDING: Over the next five years, the North-East will receive £660million 'Transition Funding' from the EU to stimulate economic growth and counter deprivation. By contrast, our own government has abandoned us to our own devices.

Whilst the Tories give funding and powers to our nearest regional neighbour Scotland, and have actually increased funding to some southern councils, they have halved funding to North-East councils, and abolished the Regional Development Agency altogether. The government had to be lobbied to apply for the Transition Funding, and still refuses to apply on our behalf for European Youth Guarantee money, which would guarantee all young people under 25 access to a job, apprenticeship or training.

TRADE: The North-East's domestic economy is not wealthy enough to kick-start internal economic growth, so our region depends on foreign trade - the North-East is the only region in the economy which exports more than it imports. So it is not just huge inwards investors such as Nissan and Hitachi that need the European link - many North-East firms across the region depend on trade with Europe. We already struggle to compete with the much-stronger economy of the south-east; any disruption to our links with Europe could tip us over the edge into economic meltdown.

RIGHTS: We have a Coalition government which believes in a low wage economy - it supports things like zero-hours contracts, agency work and part-time jobs, because it believes that the way to attract the 'wealth-creators' is to offer them a low-paid workforce without working rights. So the Tories have reduced our rights-at-work, legal aid etc., until we approach a situation where most of our protections come, not from British law, but from EU directives. Stigmatised by the right-wing press as EU 'red tape' which is 'holding back British industry', these in fact are the rules which protect your hours-at-work, safety, equal pay, time off, maternity rights and many others. Why do you think many right-wing politicians are so desperate to leave the EU? Because exit from the EU's 'Social Chapter' will allow a bonfire of our rights. I appreciate that many people - on the principles of sovereignty and 'interference' - want Britain to leave the EU. That would simply be an economic and social disaster for the North-East. On the contrary, more than any other region in the UK, it is vital for the North-East that Britain works energetically WITH Europe.

So THE LAST THING WE NEED in Europe are UKIP MEPs, who will simply disrupt or do nothing, or half-hearted Tory MEPs who ally themselves with

some of the nastiest right-wing parties in Europe. Rather, it is essential - whatever your political opinions - that we elect Labour MEPs, who will join

the left-wing coalition in the European Parliament, and ensure that the EU's powers are exercised on behalf of its people.

I understand one reason for closing the market is that the management company won't allow the market stalls to trade on the new pavement area! Why?? Does that mean we shouldn't walk on it either? As somewhat of a contradiction; the Advertiser



series on 3.5.2014 states:
• "over the last 5 years Freshwater has transformed the tired shopping area into a modern and open environment".
To be honest, it doesn't look that much different to me, although some stores have had new pvc windows installed. It has always been an open environment, albeit in an oblong format. The new pavement area is a huge improvement, although I don't think Freshwater started work 5 years ago, I

thought it was much later
• "New retailers including Aldi and Wilko's have opened stores and existing businesses have been encouraged to expand" Well, the Tuesday market is just one of the "existing businesses" who have traded for 30+ or so years I believe, so why is it being closed down? Also, people coming to the market visit the stores around them too (Tesco, banks, £stretch, Boots, Boyes, coffee shops etc), so they gain (indirectly) financially too when the market operates
• "The town centre was closed in and we wanted to open it up and make it a more attractive and friendly environment" but - it is still closed in!
• "Councillor Bob Fleming asked whether the market would be re-launched" Surely you re-launch something that has been out of action, but the Tuesday market continued to trade near Boots throughout all the building work, under ("the oppressive") and dry cover of the ("removed") canopies
• Councillor Fleming "was told professional market companies had been approached for advice on how to attract new traders" I think the term this is an insult to the traders, past and present, insinuating they are not professional! This comment also implies that the Tuesday market will continue to operate and again is a contradiction in terms
• Closure of the Tuesday market will lead to loss of income - for all the traders after so many years of devoting themselves and their products to us

It is now clear that the Town Centre owners, dissatisfied with the current management and appearance of the current market, want to introduce a more modern and higher quality set-up to attract more stallholders to Newton Aycliffe. People are aware that the market has dwindled to a few stalls and they don't look too appealing even though they have provided a good service to the townspeople. Suggestions that they improve their stalls were unacceptable due to the high cost of replacement. The Town Council are only the licenceholders and have no say in the standard or administration of the weekly market as this is managed by an association of market traders. The Landlord grasped the nettle and decided to end the current arrangement and the stallholders received the required notice to quit so that they could start again. The question now is how long before the market returns and will they be successful with their new strategy? If the cost of rental of town centre shops is anything to go by we must fear the worst as it is likely the cost of renting a stall will be too high for market traders. THE RIGHT WAY TO BIN IT

Residents across County Durham are being reminded to 'Bin it right' to make sure their recycling can continue to be used to make new products.

The six month 'Bin it right' campaign will encourage residents to put the right items in the right bin to stop recyclable material being contaminated and spoiled by items that can't be recycled.

Recycling assistants will also be on hand to give advice to households in areas where recycling contamination is most common.

The majority of householders place the correct material in the right container and the amount collected for recycling has increased by

over 30 per cent since the introduction of alternate weekly collections in 2012.

But last year, nearly 10 per cent of the total material collected for recycling was non-recyclable. This included nappies, pet waste and food.

Councillor Brian Stephens, Cabinet member for neighbourhoods and local partnerships, Durham County Council said: "It is essential that all items, from a used tin of beans or glass bottle to nappies and pet waste, are put in the right bin or box so recyclable materials are free from contamination and can be turned into other products.

"Recyclable items should be washed and squashed where possible and placed loose in the recycling bin without being bagged. Items that can't be recycled such as food, pet waste and nappies should be bagged and placed in the rubbish bin.

"We would like to thank residents for recycling household waste items and hope to clear up any confusion about what goes where to give a better understanding of which items can and cannot be recycled. Contaminated material not only reduces recycling rates but also costs the authority about £100 a

tonne in alternative disposal."

The awareness campaign forms part of an advisory system to improve recycling. Where there are repeated incidents of recycling contamination in household bins, residents will be notified directly by letter and the issue of a bin sticker.

Council Commitment to Tackle Smoking

Durham County Council has renewed its commitment to help residents improve their health by giving up smoking. The authority's leader, Cllr Simon Henig, has signed the Local Government Declaration on Tobacco Control.

It means the council will work with its partners to reduce the number of smokers in the county, highlight the negative effects of smoking and develop a plan to tackle health inequalities.

Cllr Lucy Hovvels, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for safer and healthier communities, said: "By signing this declaration, Durham County Council is showing its commitment to reducing smoking prevalence and reducing the health inequalities, death and disease caused by smoking."

The declaration has been endorsed by the Public Health Minister, Chief Medical officer and Public Health England.

Newtonian's First Novel Receives Good Reviews

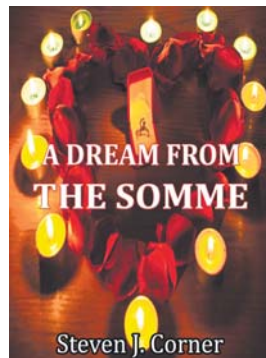

Cllr Arun Chandran said: "Eddy Adam and I firmly believe the County Council should allow free use for the existing market traders on that site until such time as the land is actually sold or the new market is set up in the Town Centre following the final phase of development."

PAYING THE PRICE FOR ENVIRONMENTAL OFFENCES

More than 130 people are paying the price for committing environmental offences in County Durham in March. Durham County Council's neighbourhood protection team tackles issues including fly tipping, dog fouling, littering and anti-social behaviour.

In March the team issued the following fixed penalty notices:

- 89 for littering
- Ten for dog fouling
- 35 for failing to respond to requests to clear untidy yards and gardens

There were five prosecutions for non-payment of fixed

penalty notices, issued for failing to respond to requests to clear untidy yards and gardens, and eight prosecutions for non-payment of fines for littering. 145 advisory letters were also sent out to the owners of untidy properties and three for those who allowed dogs to stray.

Ian Hoults, neighbourhood protection manager with Durham County Council, said: "We always aim to respond to concerns from within local communities and such environmental offences significantly impact upon and blight our villages, towns and rural areas."

Six offenders were also prosecuted for fly tipping offences. Fines have ranged in costs with one offender being ordered to pay as much as £330. Ian added: "Fly tipping is a serious offence and we prosecute those who illegally dispose of their waste."

"Householders have a duty of care to use a registered waste carrier to make sure rubbish is disposed of properly without being dumped. We investigate incidents to find evidence to link the fly tipping back to those who dump it."

Town Petition for Boundary Change

Great Aycliffe Town Council is in the process of seeking a Community Governance Review from Durham County Council in order to alter the present boundary of Great Aycliffe Parish, to incorporate the area known as Eldon Whins, currently part of Middridge Parish. There are several reasons for this proposal. The area is immediately adjacent to Newton Aycliffe, appearing to be naturally part of the town, and will be developed for housing in the future. Residents of the new housing will utilise the services within Great Aycliffe. In addition, the area was originally identified as being part of the expansion of the new town and was purchased

by the Aycliffe and Peterlee Development Corporation for that purpose. The Town Council is required by law to provide a petition, which must contain a minimum of 2088 signatures obtained from electors who reside within the current boundary of Great Aycliffe Parish, requesting a Community Governance Review. The petition is available for signature at the Town Council Offices; in addition Councillors will be calling on residents to obtain signatures. Once the required number of signatures is obtained, this Town Council will forward the petition to Durham County Council for consideration.

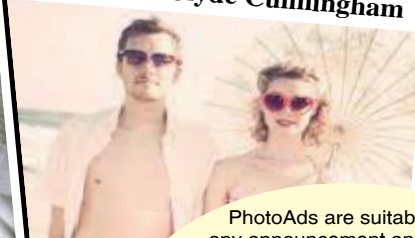
