Why Not an Indoor Market? LET'S USE DERELICT LAND FOR TEMPORARY MARKET

Council urged to release land dormant 30 years

The following report by Counc Arun Chandran was given to the Town Council in support of his motion that: "Durham County Council allow temporary use of the vacant and derelict site adjacent to the Cubby for use by the market until such time the site is sold or the Town Centre owners facilitate a new market in the town centre, whichever comes first'

Madam Chairman, Members holder no choice but to give of the Council

Cllr Eddy Adam and myself convened this meeting at short notice with the consent of yourself and Cllr Bob Fleming Leader of the Council because the time factor necessitated urgent action.

This Council heard at its meeting of the Policy and Resources Committee on 16th April, (minute 104) that the agents for the Town Centre Owners had indicated that the market will not be allowed on its original site at the present time until all snagging works were completed, in addition the agents also advised the Town Council that they require improvement to the stalls and layout of the stall areas in order to provide a visually attractive market that is in keeping with the improvements and capital investments that has taken place. The Committee

resolved that the report part of which contained exempt information, be received. That the Council does not subsidise the market. negotiations continue with the appropriate parties in regard to the provision of a market.

Shortly after that meeting we were informed that the Town Centre owners had given one months notice to close the existing market. The Town Council had then, as License

immediate notice too, in order to comply with contractual obligations

So in actual fact, the Market was being closed down until such time as the Town Centre owners finished the final phase development of the Town Centre including the demolition of Churchill House and some shops due to commence about June this

year. The Town Centre Owners had indicated that they wanted to continue a market in the Town Centre at a later date, and were looking at that provision possibly through professional Market Management Company.

If you look at photos taken by Ken Robson Chairman ACORN Residents Association at my request yesterday you will see that the market is clean and tidy. It compares favourably in that respect with say the Market at Stockton where the Town Centre has been refurbished and those Stalls have not been required to upgrade to stainless steel or bright new coverings. The problem that remains is two fold:

1. Given that we cannot as a Town Council subside the Market as a private commercial venture. do we have anywhere else the existing Market Traders could carry on their trade whilst awaiting the completion phase of the Town Centre and a new Market established. answer to that is Yes.

2. If yes, then we have a duty to try to make that temporary provision, in the interests of trying to keep the existing market alive and facilitate it for the people of our Town.

I believe, that Durham County

Council, who received £7.9 million for the sale of the former Avenue School site to Tesco, and who run other Markets in County Durham whilst making no provision for our Market in Newton Aycliffe (leading to double taxation, in which the people of Newton Aycliffe pay for Market provision for the rest of County Durham but receive nothing in return regarding our market) ...that they have a duty to help out.

I believe that Durham County Council should allow Great Aycliffe to use the derelict site next to the Cubby free of all costs, including rates, until such time as they have an actual buyer for that site, for the Market to temporarily trade, or until such time as the Town Centre Owners are ready to establish a new market in the Town Centre which ever

comes first.

I would argue the following that given that Durham County Council want to sell this land

derelict land, I suggest that we

as a Town request they remove

The traditional facilities were provided, but there were problems with the Fireworks Display and the Mayor indicated the council were reviewing the Great Aycliffe Show where there was possibility of replacing this weekend event with a series of community activities at other venues over a week

Town Meeting held The Council will continue to partner town groups to procure and improve facilities. It will also support the Youth Council and provide grants for this age group. The Neighbourhood Plan is an important project which will be ramped up in the coming year. The Council's

Austin Manager Dan another reported good year with savings made and revenue increases, but warned the future looked dire as Government cuts continue to decimate the council finances bringing serious challenges to the council's income and expenditure.

Budget pressure will mean increases in Council Tax, efficiency savings and in services. reduction Fortunately due to prudent management of their finances in the past the Council faces the government cuts from a strong position and will not need to make severe cuts themselves until after 2015. In fact they have been able to peg any increase in Council Tax for five years.

The council is subject to an annual inspection of its finances and as in previous years it has received a clean bill of health on all aspects as a result of the hard work and commitment of Councillors, management and staff

"Good" Ofsted Report for Emptier Town Centre **Changed Aycliffe School**

Stephenson Way Community Primary was the subject of an Ofsted inspection at the beginning of the summer term and are delighted to report that they were awarded a "good" judgement by Ofsted.

The two day inspection was the first Ofsted visit since significant changes The since since significant changes at the school in early 2013. During that period, the school converted to academy status, becoming part of Tudhoe Learning Trust in the process. At the same time, the senior leadership of the school was changed with a pay headteacher and deputy. new headteacher and deputy headteacher appointed. The rate of improvement onset

by these changes was noted in the report, stating "the school is improving quickly because leaders and the Academy Trust have high aspirations and an accurate understanding of the school's strengths and weaknesses" and that "Pupil progress and attainment have improved rapidly over the past two years" almost exactly corresponding with the switch to academy status.

To form their judgements, inspectors focussed on four areas: the achievement of pupils, the quality of teaching, the behaviour and safety of pupils, and the leadership and management within school. During their visit, Ofsted deemed that the school achieved "good" in all four of these areas. This outcome indicates that every aspect of school is working well to ensure pupils are well prepared for the next stage of their

education. Ofsted determined that "the quality of teaching in the school is good" and is having a positive effect on the pupils' achievement across all Key

Stages, stating: Speaking about the Early Years Foundation Stage: "In the safe, caring and happy area, children settle quickly and, by the end of Reception, all groups of children make

good progress".
"Attainment in Key Stage 1 and predicted pupil outcomes show a strong improvement" "Pupils make good progress overall across Key Stage 2"

The school's focus on reading was also positively received, noting that "reading has a high profile in school and a good range of resources support this" and that due to this, "pupils express an enjoyment in reading".

The report makes note of the high levels and effective use of support the school provides, noting that the individual support the school provides "is very successful in raising the achievements of pupils".

Behaviour was described as having undergone a "considerable transformation over the past year". The new leadership team's strategies for improving behaviour are described as "massively impressive with an impact on all areas of school". Inspectors observed pupils to be "polite, well-mannered and show respect for each other and

The school received glowing praise from parents, who were given the chance to voice their opinions of the school by speaking to inspectors or through a questionnaire. The feedback and data received by the inspection team led them to conclude that "parents are overwhelmingly supportive of the school" and that all parents "feel their children are safe, happy and well looked after". The school is immensely proud of its strong links with parents and the community and was pleased to have this officially recognised.

The hugely successful sports and PE programmes were praised, reporting the school has "broadened the successful range of sporting activities" having a positive effect on pupils' physical and lifestyles". This official recognition is the latest accolade of a programme that's had a fantastic impact on sporting performance over the past 18 months and seen the school with high levels of representation at sporting

The Head Teacher, Mr. Cassan said "Everyone involved with the school is pleased that we have been recognised as delivering a 'good' service for the local community. We will now strive to provide an outstanding service for the community we serve."



Residents young and old feel intimidated and unsafe using these underpasses and are crossing the busy road instead. One resident reported being blocked in by youths and was very scared for his wellbeing.

I asked in February if the underpass could be at least cleaned, as it serves several infant and junior schools, a nursing home and is used by dog walkers and people going to from the town centre.

John Reed head of technical services Durham County Council said the new lighting has been designed and is being made by a local company, cleaning and painting will start in the next few weeks and this underpass is first on the list. Let's see how long this takes. Philip Clark, Chairman,
