#### £16,000 TO BE SPENT ON LIGHTING

Two programmes to extend street lighting in the newer areas of the town and the in-dustrial estate are being dustrial estate are being started by the Development Corporation.

Sodium lighting is to be installed on Burnhill Way, Agnew Way, Bluebell Way and the footpath between Middridge and Horndale, at a cost of £5,680.

On the industrial estate, £10,696 is to be spent on lighting and pavements on Preston Road, Coatham Ave., and the Howden Road link.
