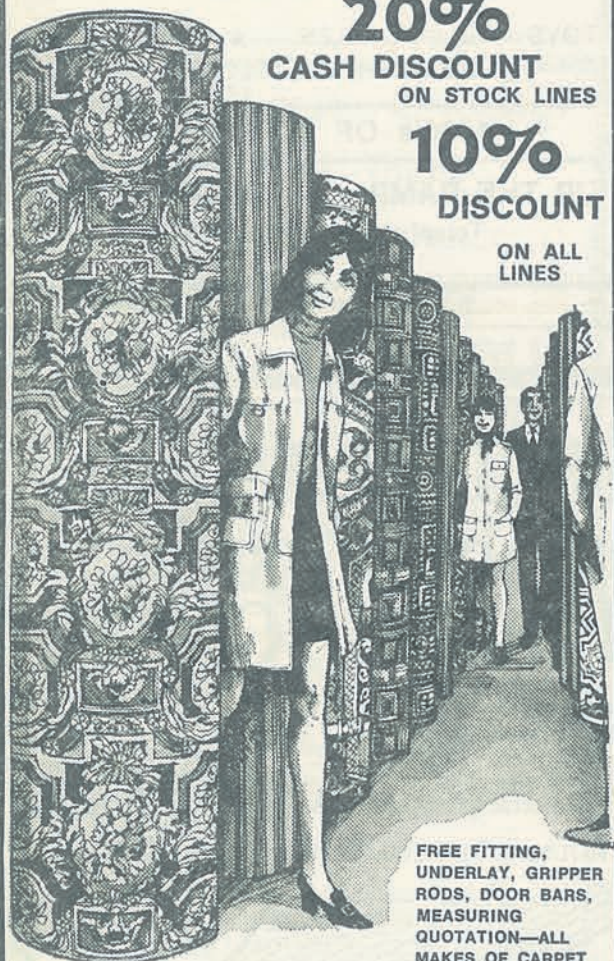

NEW STORE TO BE BUILT IMMEDIATELY TWO MAIN CAR PARKS CLOSED

THE ANNOUNCEMENT that Fine Fare begins development of its new £2.1m Superstore combined with a multi-storey car park brings delight and criticism.

Newtonians generally accept the news as a major step forward in the development of our town centre and welcome also the 200 jobs the store will create.

But, as readers will see from information carried in this issue, this development, starting Monday, entails closing both main town centre car parks, and shopkeepers particularly are critical of the consequences.

They accept in the long term that the multi-storey car park to be built at the rear of Harold Taylor's Garage, will be a boon, but question what happens during the two-year building programme.

The Chamber of Trade meet again next week to assess the situation after a week of the closure. The traders knew a Department Store was planned and that a car park would be lost, but had no idea about the multi-storey car park and the loss of two car parks.

This they assert has been a well kept secret. Newton News have since discovered the Town Council did not know either and only found out by chance when ringing to ask permission to land HMS Eskimo's helicopter on the car park this summer.

ADC spokesman agrees there will be "minor inconvenience" but well worth it considering the end result. "In any event, said Mr Cole, other car parks serving the

town should prove adequate facilities and are no more than 5 minutes away from the shopping area."

The criticism of lack of notice and consultation is explained by the fact that the ADC were not certain the whole scheme would be acceptable to the developers and once it was agreed, had made plans for an immediate start.

"It is better to announce a project when it is certain and avoid the disappointment of a scheme which is publicised widely and does not come off," said Mr Cole.

ED.: Space does not allow a full report on Fine Fare's proposals in this issue. Full details, including an artist's impression of the new development, will be included in our next edition.

Accompanying the choir is Richard Hayton (bass) and Alan Morrison (cornet). Alan is champion soloist of Great Britain.

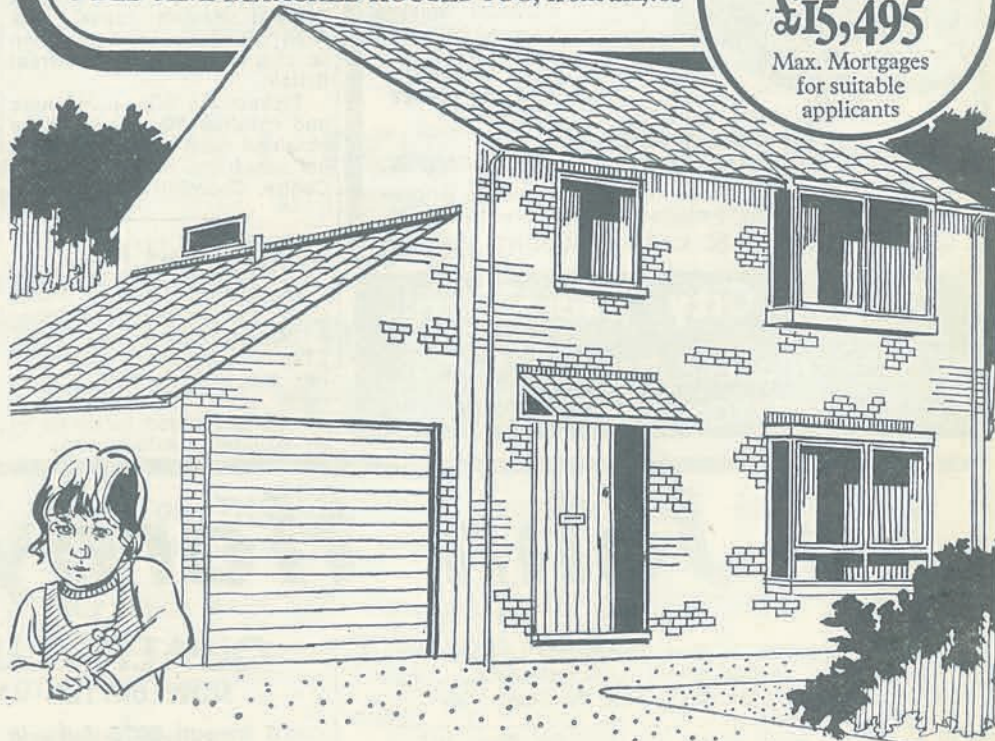

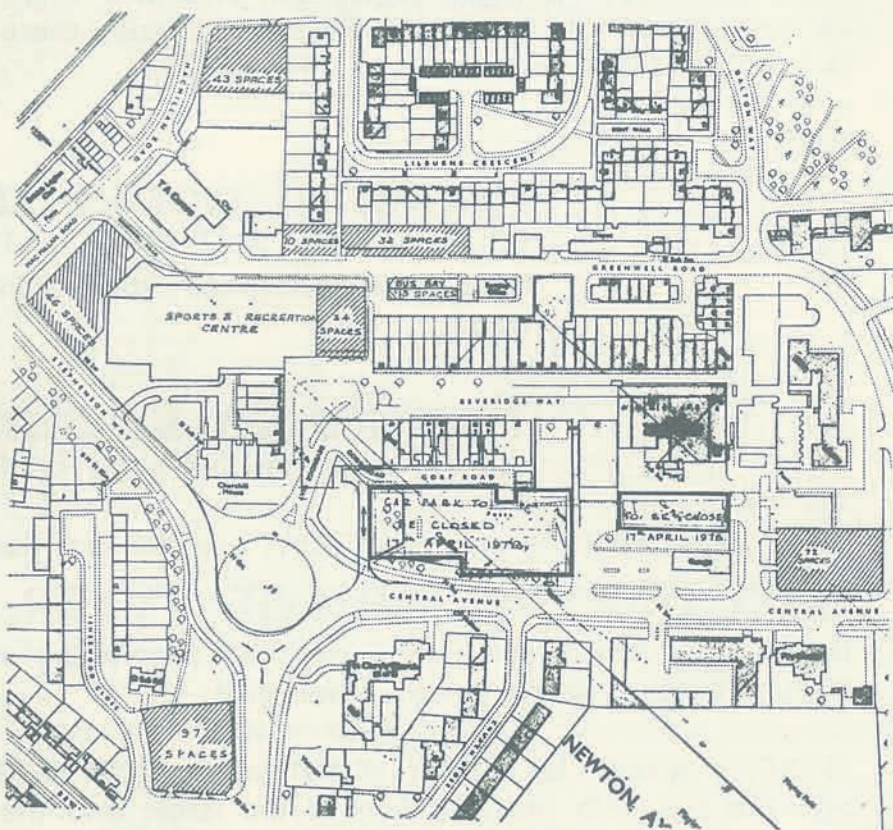
SATURDAY TEA TIME ?

TOWN CENTRE CAR PARK CHANGES



From Monday, April 17th, the two main town centre car parks providing 116 spaces will be closed while development of the new Department Store and Multi-Storey Car Park takes place. This will be in effect until Summer 1979 when the new 260 space car park is opened.
