

After the news there will be a look ahead to programmes and news of "AGNES" an idea dreamed up by the Station Manager Harry Rowell to form a group in which every listener to ACR is an automatic member. "AGNES" stands for AYCLIFFE GOOD NEIGHBOUR ENTERPRISE SCHEME, and the simple idea behind it is for people to help one another by being involved in "AGNES", e.g., during the winter period we hear a call to help the aged, especially when the cold weather is on. Through "AGNES" the listeners to ACR can help old people by making a simple phone After the news there will be le by making a simple phone call to alert the Radio Station of this persons dilema. The station will then call the appropriate body. Likewise it may be that one of ACR's listeners will spot a neighbour who is obviously under the weather and is the type who will not call the Doctor, so therefore to help without interfering, they can call ACR, and much the same as before ACR will contact the appropriate body. It must be stressed however that ACR will act only as a link and will not do anything other than make phone calls

#### and contacts. BETTER SPIRIT




