# Think again Sedgefield

## Aycliffe is special case

Sedgefield District Council's policy state-  
ment in our last issue on the sale of  
houses to sitting tenants is unsatisfactory.

Newtonians waiting for  
news on this matter are bit-  
terly disappointed that Sedge-  
field have no plans to sell.

Hopes rose when the  
Government re-introduced  
permission for new town  
tenants to buy their houses at  
concessionary prices.

Most towns are selling, in-  
cluding our sister town, Peter-  
lee, but Sedgefield District  
Council, who took over the  
town's housing stock from the  
ADC in April, are holding  
back for reasons explained in  
their statement.

Sedgefield persist in look-  
ing at the District as a whole  
when it is well known Newton  
Aycliffe has special social  
considerations which need  
particular attention.

"The Council cannot make  
a special case of Newton Aycliffe," said Coun. McCourt,  
chairman of the Policy and  
Resources committee.

The Council seem to be for-  
getting that the new town  
suffers from an imbalance in  
the ratio of owner occupied  
houses to rented property.

In broad terms 75 per cent  
of Newton Aycliffe housing is  
rented, while the rest of the  
district is less than 50 per  
cent.

This indicates we need to  
be brought into line with the  
district before being con-  
sidered as part of an overall  
policy.

There is provision for more

private housing to be built in  
our expansion programme...  
but can we ever hope to build  
enough to catch up?

And what chance even  
future expansion with County  
Council proposals that New-  
ton Aycliffe's growth be cur-  
tailed?

Unless S.D.C. change their  
minds it could be a decade or  
more before we attain a hous-  
ing situation enjoyed by most  
towns in this country.

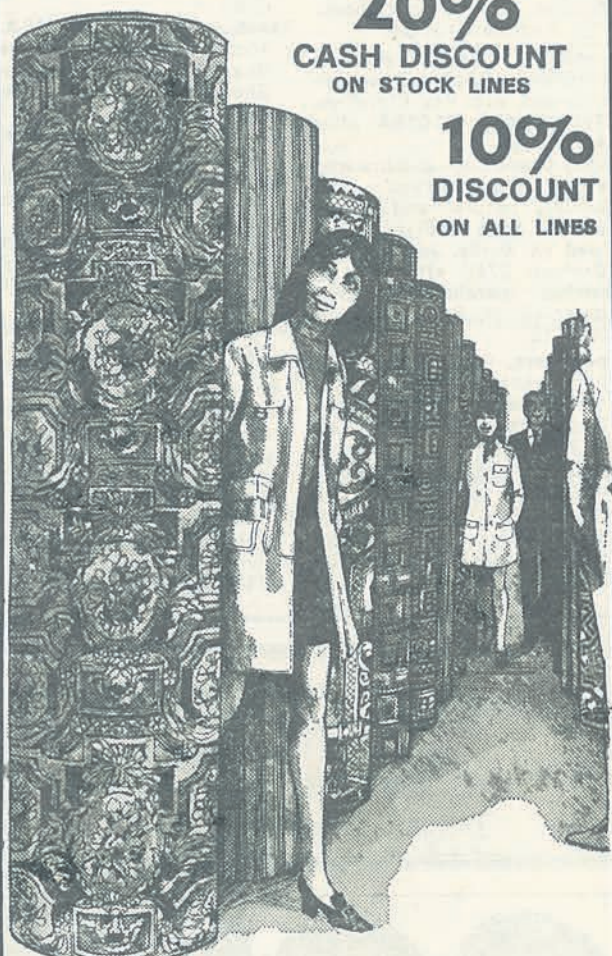

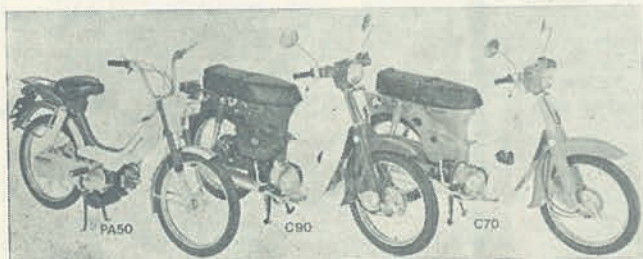

### MENTAL ILLNESS IN NEWTON AYCLIFFE

Dear Sir,

Since we of Newton Aycliffe MIND opened our club for patients recently discharged from mental hospitals and for the lonely, anxious and depressed people of our town, we have found that there are a lot of people who need help.

We have a large membership for our Monday afternoon and Thursday evening clubs. The aim of the clubs is to make us forget our troubles for a few hours. We play games and generally enjoy ourselves.

For anyone who wishes to talk about their problems some members of the committee are always available for private conversation, but this is done away from the Club.

Now that we are established and doing fine we wish to broaden our committee, preferably with people who have a genuine interest in helping others, people who can laugh and have fun and also listen when required.

When you look around at our town things seem okay, but we have found a lot of unhappiness and despair, nearly everyone knows someone who is lonely, or suffering from anxiety or depression, a very common illness in this day and age.

How many people are prescribed tablets such as valium, arivan, etc? We have been told that Newton Aycliffe has a very high suicide rate. Our little town where everything appears very modern, and where we have every amenity.

People need help and we need help! Do you think you are the sort of person who can spare some time to serve on our committee, to help us make our friends and neighbours live's happier?

We do not stop at the clubs. We have weekend get-togethers, we have had one coach trip and hope for more, and we have made many friends. We call when people are ill and try to give help when needed.

There is also the work of MIND (The National Assoc. for Mental Health). In October we become affiliated to MIND and then our work really begins. As a committee working for MIND there is lots to do, so think carefully for we are asking for your time.

# SALE OF HOUSES WOULD SAFEGUARD TOWN'S PROSPERITY

Michael Irvine, the prospective Conservative Parliamentary candidate for Bishop Auckland, has called on the Sedgfield District Council to sell Council houses to tenants who wish to buy them, provided the tenants pay a reasonable purchase price and accept restraints on re-selling their houses within a short time.

Mr Irvine, who was commenting on the recent statement on Council house sales by Coun. P. W. McCourt, chairman of the Policy and Resources Committee of the Sedgfield District Council, said he was anxious that tenants throughout the Sedgfield District should have the opportunity to buy their homes, but he was particularly concerned by the situation in Newton Aycliffe.

"There is at present," said

Mr Irvine, "a considerable shortage of moderately-priced private housing in Aycliffe, and the demand for it is increasing with every year. The availability of private housing is an important factor in the decisions of many companies considering whether to set up in Aycliffe. If sufficient private housing of the right kind is not available, firms may decide not to come to Aycliffe and jobs and investment will be lost to the town."

Mr Irvine alleged that the refusal of the Council to sell Council houses to tenants had a further damaging side effect. Unable to afford the price of private houses in Aycliffe, many of the town's most promising young people were leaving and going to Darlington, where terraced houses could be bought for £7,000 or 8,000 and then improved

with local authority grants. If it was Council policy to sell Council houses, these young people, instead of moving to Darlington, might well stay in Aycliffe, take Council tenancies, and later, when they had established themselves, buy their houses from the Council.

The sale of Council houses,

said Mr Irvine, would not only help in attracting people and industry to Aycliffe and safeguarding the town's prosperity, it would also save maintenance costs and provide money which could be used to boost the Council's own housebuilding programme.

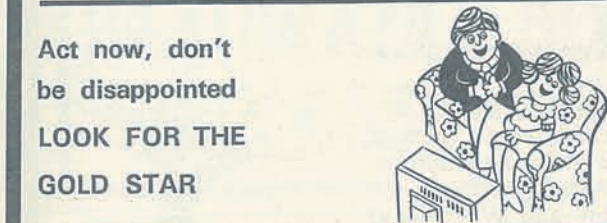
