# MORE FACTORY SPACE TO LET

AYCLIFFE NEW TOWN is letting factories  
as fast as they can be built because of a  
boom in small industries setting up in the  
town.

Since April, 42,000 square feet of space has been occupied with employment building up to 130 jobs. And this follows a year when employment in County Durham new town rose by more than 500.

The space is in two 21,000 square foot factories which, with a unique design, subdivide to allow industrialists to choose the size of unit which suits them.

Now Aycliffe Development Corporation is starting to build two identical factories and already nearly a third of the space, which will be available next spring, has been 'spoken for' by industrialists wishing to expand.

Aycliffe already has a prosperous industrial estate, employing nearly 10,000 people, with many large, internationally known companies such as GEC, Flymo, Union Carbide, Colston and Perstorp Waverite. And now it is becoming even more successful as a base for indigenous industry where small local companies are setting up and growing quickly.

Taking advantage of this interest from small companies, Aycliffe Corporation designed and built two 21,000 square foot units in Northfield Way on the town's industrial estate. The design meant a range of unit sizes from 3,800 square feet upwards was possible within each building, giving an industrialist the flexibility to choose the right size of unit for his needs without being cramped or wasting money on space he didn't want. The factories were completed in April and today they are both full with six companies occupying space ranging from 3,800 to 9,500 square feet.

Work has now started on two identical units nearby.

They should be ready for occupation early next year and are likely to be let at around £1.30 a square foot.

The popularity of the town — and the factory designs — is shown by industrialists having taken options on 11,400 square feet of the space from the drawing board before building even started.

# COUNCIL SAY THANK YOU

Durham County Council wish to thank the thousands of people and the many groups and organisations who have commented on the Structure Plan's proposals for the future development of the County.

Booklets outlining the Structure Plan's proposals were distributed to all homes in the County and exhibitions were held in the County's main towns to illustrate the proposals.

Over 13,000 comments have been received on the Structure Plan's proposals — 7,700 in response to the County booklet, 4,000 in response to additional booklets

distributed in the Darlington and Durham City areas, 1,250 from visitors to the exhibitions and 150 from groups and organisations with an interest in the Structure Plan.

Seven thousand 300 people visited the exhibitions with Durham City (1,600) and Darlington (1,400) being the most popular venues.

All the comments received are now being analysed and will be reported to the County Council shortly. The comments will help the County Council determine the policies for the Structure Plan, which, when finalised, will be submitted to the Secretary of State for his approval.

We three Octogenarian comrades wish to pay tribute to the memory of one of Newton Aycliffe's most worthy Citizens, the late Edward Clifford Brooke, who ended his earthly pilgrimage on 8th August. Cliff was one of the earliest attenders of the Natter Club, which meets weekly in St. Clare's Church Hall. His character and influence made a contribution to the success of this social get together which has continued over the years. In earlier years living in France he acquired a command of the language, and latterly dabbled in Spanish. In our association with him he seemed to give up in despair of his efforts to introduce us to these subjects. Often his Yorkshire accent and dialect was a little beyond us, but comradeship never failed, and we were never slow to appraise his worth.

He was a man of many skills, industrious and of infinite patience. Physically handicapped he was a wonderful example to all handicapped persons. Idleness and boredom were unknown to him. At the September 1970 Natter Club Handicrafts Exhibition he took over a large section of bench for his exhibits, which included needlework, heraldry and photography, etc. His needlework won for him highest praise from ladies similarly interested. He was a dedicated churchman and all alone would spend hours at the church organ in his efforts to win for himself the joy of sacred music.

We salute Cliff, the fine Christian gentleman that he

was, and pray that he will ever be fulfilling himself in the atmosphere of the spirit and his eternal home.

## CAUSE FOR CONCERN

Dear Sir,

I am writing to you to express my concern about three matters regarding our town.

The first is the absence of adequate footpaths on the very busy stretch of Burn Lane between the junction with Westmorland Way and Sid Chaplin Drive. The likelihood of serious or fatal injury to pedestrians should have been obvious to the Highways authority. I hope and pray that no accident occurs at this spot, but if it should, responsibility will rest on the shoulders and consciences of the members of that authority. It would be idle for them to plead that the present hazard is a temporary one; death or serious injury is not temporary.

I should like to urge your readers to tell their local Councillor, County Councillor and Member of Parliament to have this danger removed immediately.

The second matter is the absence of short-term parking facilities near the Town Centre. Shoppers need car parks limited to one hour and adjacent to the shopping centre. At present car-parking space is usually occupied by cars which are there all day. The third issue is the mini-roundabout at the junction of Central Avenue, St. Cuthbert's Way and Stephenson Way. Converging traffic from Central Avenue and Stephenson Way is masked by the remains of the previous roundabout. This quite unnecessary danger ought to be removed.
