'COMPETER' SUPPLIES AL ATTRACTING industry THE ANSWERS

by computer — that is the aim of a new selling method devised by Peterlee Development Corporation.

Officers in Peterlee will now take a portable computer terminal with them when they go to see industrialists in the United States, Scandinavia, Germany and Japan.

"The industrialist gives a few details about his proposed proposed investment phases, — and these are typed into the computer. 'Competer' immediately prints out the actual grants, loans and other concessions he is likely to get if he locates in Peterlee.
