COMPASS' PROJECT TO END

Dear Sir,

On the 7th February, 1977, "COMPASS", a Job Creation Scheme, was launched. The aims of the Project were to discover the areas of need in Newton Aycliffe and link persons or societies which re-quired help, with those who were able to offer assistance to them. The project was initially due to end on September 16th, 1977, but was so successful it was allowed to continue until October 13th, 1978. Regretfully this Friday, October 13th, 1978, will be the end of the "COMPASS" project.
