# ADC GET GO-AHEAD FOR INDUSTRIAL GROWTH

AYCLIFFE AND PETERLEE Development  
Corporations will be going all out to bring  
more industry to the North East following  
months of uncertainty about the future of  
the North East New Towns.

Their efforts, which have  
already led to thousands of  
jobs and millions of pounds  
of investment, are being  
stepped up following a  
Government directive to "con-  
tinue their industrial develop-  
ment functions with all pos-  
sible vigour."

Mr Garry Philipson, Manag-  
ing Director of Aycliffe and  
Peterlee Development Cor-  
porations, said: "We have  
had quite a lengthy period of  
uncertainty following the Sec-  
retary of State for the En-  
vironment's review of the  
future of Britain's new towns.  
That has now come from Mr  
Guy Barnett MP and we have  
a clear directive to concen-  
trate on industrial develop-  
ment for the foreseeable  
future."

It seems logical that hous-  
ing for workers must be pro-  
vided at the same rate as jobs,  
therefore can we assume the  
town's expansion programme  
for a population target of  
45,000 is to be maintained?

Does the Government direc-  
tive reject the County Coun-  
cil's Structure Plan aimed at

stunting Newton Aycliffe's  
growth?

The ADC are now looking  
forward to a fruitful period of  
accelerated industrial and  
commercial development  
based on good relationships  
and close co-operation with  
the local authorities.

In Peterlee, the industrial  
land extension obtained in the  
summer is now being pre-  
pared for development and  
the future industrial land  
needs of Sedgfield District,  
which includes Aycliffe, are  
currently being examined by  
the local authorities and the  
Development Corporation.

"We were particularly  
pleased to see that Mr Bar-  
nett's statement complimented  
us on what we have achieved  
so far — we have companies  
from all the major industrial  
nations in Aycliffe and Peter-  
lee — and we are confident  
that we will be able to carry  
on assisting in reducing un-  
employment in this area which  
is suffering more than most  
from the effects of economic  
recession," said Garry Philip-  
son.

## OLDE TYME RETURNS TO AYCLIFFE

Sedgfield District Council  
add another amenity to their  
weekly programme at Newton  
Aycliffe Recreation Centre by  
starting an Old Time and  
Modern Sequence Dance  
every Tuesday evening in the  
Recreation Hall. Learning  
session commences at 7.15  
p.m. until about 7.45 p.m. for  
beginners and walking through  
new dances. At 7.45 p.m. the  
dance commences and except  
for a 15-minute break carries  
on till 10.45 p.m.

The dances done and taught  
comprise of Old Time  
Waltzes, modern sequence  
waltzes, quicksteps, foxtrots,

## £20 MILLION WAITING TO BE TAPPED

Dear Sir,

Having recently heard on the radio that local councils were not taking advantage of the sum of £20m. available from the Government to assist them with their problems of serving their communities as they would like to, prompts me to ask if our own Council is considering having a slice of this "cake."

There must be several problems which are shelved due to lack of finance. The one that concerns me is the meagre allocation of bus tokens. Being more or less a monthly "customer" to the Darlington hospital I find that at 72p a trip it soon takes its toll out of my allocation. It must be well known that several other towns issue passes which allow people unlimited travel during off-peak periods, on the other hand it has been stated that to issue a pass with the holder's photograph pasted on is far too expensive.

The arithmetic of this argument does not equate with the

facts. Does the Council ever have unused tokens returned to them? Do all the pensioners even travel on the buses?

If not, what happens to the tokens? Personally I have been offered tokens in return for services rendered, and it is rumoured that they may be purchased at half their face value.

The issue of passes would cancel this expensive abuse. The initial cost of producing the passes may sound prohibitive, but after that all that remains is stamping a renewal date.

So can we dip into this £20m. kitty which could go towards solving my, and other people's problem, and at the same time differentiate between the needy and the greedy. Thanking you for granting me this space.

## COUNTY COUNCIL CAN SOLVE THE PROBLEM

Dear Sir,

I read with interest Father Anderson's further letter, published in your columns on 27th October, and perhaps you will avail me of the courtesy of your columns so that I can reply to everyone concerned as well as Father Anderson himself.

I have, needless to say, sent a copy of this letter directly to him.

I readily take his point that there is no footpath on the east side of Burn Lane, and we are trying to see that one is provided. As Father Anderson has already pointed out, however, we have no powers to do works of this kind which are now the responsibility of the County Council. We have written to the County Surveyor on the subject, but aside from the difficulties of physical provision and surveying (there is a ditch alongside the carriage-way for much of its length and a high embankment adjacent to the lane as it rises from the burn towards the town) there is the obvious problem of funds: in common with many authorities the County Council currently has a restricted budget and the question may be one of priorities.

By way of adding to the case for the footpath we have sought comments from the police, who as you know are keenly concerned with road safety, in the hope that they will endorse the provision of a footpath.

### SIGNS

Finally, we have in the meantime ordered footpath signs which will, I hope, at least direct people towards the western footpath until the eastern one can be made available.

Regarding car parking, I was glad to hear of Father Anderson's support to the idea of keeping at least some of the car parking spaces reserved until 9.30 a.m. so that

they should be available for shoppers, but we agreed with the Chamber of Trade that we would allow a reasonable period of time for the other measures we had introduced to work and we had to honour our obligation. I think, however, that the time has now come to reconsider the matter and we are conducting a review on which a final decision can be based.

### IMPROVEMENT

In view of the comments we have had from Father Anderson and from others about the mini-roundabout we have been looking closely at traffic behaviour over the past few months, including peak hours and the hours of darkness. The conclusion we have reached is that traffic behaviour has much improved since the roundabout was first opened, which has at least helped to reduce the danger to both pedestrians and drivers. We do, however, agree that a pedestrian refuge should be provided in Stephenson Way near the crossing point adjacent to Churchill House: we have discussed this with the County Surveyor and there are grounds for hoping that he will be providing a refuge as a short term measure.

We share Father Anderson's view that there should be bus lay-bys in Central Avenue and St. Cuthbert's Way, and for that matter in Stephenson Way also. Here again, however, the County Council is the responsible authority and as I understand it their view is that there ought not to be general provision of lay-bys. We will raise the matter with the County Surveyor once again, but I cannot of course forecast the likelihood of success.

## DISTRICT COUNCIL AIM AT SECURE DEVELOPMENT

Dear Sir,

In your issue of the 27th October you gave the entirely misleading impression of the respective roles of the Development Corporation and Sedgfield District Council.

May I point out to your readers that the Development Corporation will, in any event, be wound up sooner or later. My Council are concerned that when this happens which ever agency is to be responsible for the management of the industrial estates owned by the Development Corporation there shall be adequate funds to enable the continued expansion of industry.

My Council are constantly in touch with the Aycliffe Development Corporation to monitor the take-up of industrial land, and will be discussing steps to ensure that shortage of land is not a hindrance to industrial development.

ILL EQUIPPED  
As the law stands as at present the Industrial Estates of the Development Corporation will on dissolution pass to the New Towns Commission. My Council fear that this remote body will be ill-equipped to foster the con-

tinued development of Aycliffe and progressive renewal which will always be necessary on the Industrial Estate. My Council are working to secure continued industrial development at Aycliffe.

It should also be appreciated by your readers that the Structure Planning Authority will have considerable influence over the future development of Aycliffe. My Council will seek to secure through goodwill and co-operation with the authorities involved the continued success of industrial development in Aycliffe, and will have very much in mind the availability of "unlimited funds."

# CAR ENGINES — MADE TO MEASURE

High performance engines made to measure — that's the aim of Nigel Priestley, an engineer who has opened a new factory in Aycliffe, Co. Durham.

Everything from replacement engines for the family runabout to tailor-made units for Formula 2 racing cars are on offer from Priestley Precision Engineering at their new 3,200 square feet factory in Whinfield Drive.

Yet, just a few months ago, Nigel Priestley was hard at work at the other side of the made-to-measure market — in the textile trade with Courtaulds.

Mr Priestley (27), belongs to a textile family from West Yorkshire, but his interest in engines — and in competitive motor racing — led him to become an engineer with a small company in Leeds, specialising in vehicle engines.

"I then joined Courtaulds as a technical manager but I have always wanted to have my own business and decided to combine this with my interest in car engines," said Mr Priestley.

"Aycliffe Development Corporation had a factory of the right size available, so I moved in."

His factory, equipped with the latest and best in grinding, turning and boring machines is already getting orders from motorists and competition drivers for work on crankshafts, cylinder heads and blocks, and will soon be offering a range of replacement engines.

"My main interest is in high performance engines," said Mr Priestley. "I have my own Lotus 7 which I rebuilt completely with an engine which develops 140 bhp, and

I have developed a 2 litre, 16 valve racing engine for rally and formula 2 cars. There is a big market for these in this area." Business is so good that Mr Priestley hopes to be employing four people by the end of the year.

And what does he see in the future? An Aycliffe Formula 1 racing car,

"That's a bit out of my league, but I would be very interested in getting together with a chassis designer to build a clubman type sports racing car with my own suspension and engine, that really is my ambition," he said.

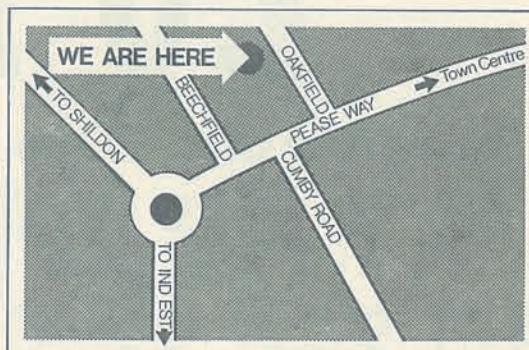
