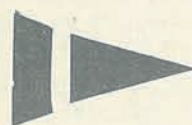

FLYMO BOAT IS CHAMPION!

The first of a number of new sculling boats to be loaned to leading and potential British scullers by Flymo Limited, manufacturers of the world's first air-cushion mowers, was used to record a victory at its first outing.

Malcolm Carmichael, of Leander Rowing Club, used the boat to become Amateur Champion of the Thames by winning the Wingfield Sculls. He won by 29 seconds — about 10 lengths — and had the highest praise for the boat.

Flymo Managing Director Peter Bullock said the plan to make boats available on loan to British scullers for international events and training followed discussions with Glyn Locke (Racing Shells) Ltd., of Henley-on-Thames.

Several of the boats will be used by National Squad members in training for the 1980 Olympic Games in Moscow.

The project has a two-fold purpose: Support for a new British-made sculling boat to project it into the international rowing scene; and making boats available to leading and embryo British scullers or people unable to afford their own boats, or members of clubs which cannot allocate funds for craft for single scullers.

The new boats incorporate features expected of the best European-built shells as well as using unique fabrication methods and materials for strong, lightweight construction. Each boat is built to the individual sculler's own requirements as regards size, weight and ancillary fittings.

Ergonomic considerations include fine adjustment of riggers, slides and stretchers for height and rake to match the individual's physical characteristics.

AYCLIFFE RACING CAR ON DISPLAY IN TOWN CENTRE

Adrian Russell had his first win of the season in the Ay-cliffe Team Russell March 782 on Sunday, taking the Steele-Dixon Trophy at Silverstone.

He won the BRSCC National Formula Libre Championship round over the club circuit.

And Adrian, who came within a second of the lap

record, is now confident he has the Aycliffe car race-ready at last. A fortnight before he took 8th place in the tough European Formula 2 Championship round at Thruxton.

David Hunt, brother of James, has joined the Aycliffe Team Russell as a trainee mechanic. He has been recruited for the team, which is sponsored by Aycliffe Development Corporation, to gain mechanical experience before embarking on a motor racing career of his own.

And already 18-year-old David has been finding out about the tough life of a race mechanic, having been involved in last-minute pre-race gearbox and engine changes

on the team's March 782 car.

A keen racing spectator, David left school in December and, although he has a university place waiting for him in Edinburgh in October, he hasn't yet decided if he will take it up.

"I spent three years kart racing and watched James at most of the British meetings where he competed," said David. "When I decided to think about a racing career I asked Adrian Russell and was delighted to be given a job. It is hard work but I am enjoying it so far."

David hopes to drive in Formula Ford events next year but isn't sure if he will be seeking a team driving place or going it alone with his own car.

But isn't it rather demanding to be following a world champion brother?

"It is both good and bad," said David. "It could well be an advantage in trying to find a sponsor but it can also create problems when you are in the limelight without wanting to be."

David is working under the team's chief mechanic, John Mansfield. John (19) has been with the team since he left school nearly two years ago.

"Keeping a car in racing condition is very much a full time job," said John. "We

work five days a week at Adrian's car showroom and there is a race pretty well every weekend during the season."

The Aycliffe car was out again on Monday, May 7, in the Aurora round at Mallory Park and will be making a special appearance in the BRSCC Formula Libre event at Croft — the north east circuit — on the 13th. A large turnout of Aycliffe people is expected for this event.

The Aycliffe Team Russell are promoting their racing car with a super competition for children this week.

In co-operation with the Aurora Toy Car Company and Hardings Town Centre Toy Shop a valuable prize is open to be won by the fastest lap on a toy race track.

A racing set, value £55, goes to the winner, along with a trip with mum or dad to Donington race circuit to see the Aycliffe car in action.

The winner and his parent will be chauffeur driven down to the track and get an opportunity to feel the excitement of car racing at first hand.

Newtonians will have a chance to see the car, which represents Aycliffe, this Saturday when it is on show in the town centre.
