SEDGEFIELD DISTRICT COUNCIL are following Government directives, pending legislation, and are considering the sale of Council houses to sitting tenants.

However, there are a few snags to iron out, not least the question of finance and who will give mortgages — and to

will give mortgages — and to what extent.

Sedgefield are looking into this aspect and other items which worry them prior to making any decision.

Meanwhile letters have been sent to all tenants asking if they are interested in huving

if they are interested in buying the property they occupy.
This survey will give an in-

dication to the initial response the Council can expect, and give them some idea as to the extra work and staff to administer applications.
If everything goes through

smoothly tenants of 20 years can expect the maximum 50 per cent discount on market

It is envisaged that tenants who have resided in their property for 2 to 3 years will

receive a 30 per cent discount and 33 per cent for 3 to 4 years, with an extra 10 per cent for each year of tenancy.

The Government are seeking a ratio of 70-30 in favour of owner occupation.

of owner occupation.

The national average at the moment is 60-40 in favour. But in Sedgefield District Council area the trend is reversed — 60-40 in favour of rented Council property. In Newton Aycliffe itself the ratio in favour of Council property is very much higher. It is quite evident the new town is well out of step and

town is well out of step and the new legislation will help correct the situation.

Yet our MP, Derek Foster, whilst not against the sale of Council houses to sitting

tenants in certain circum-stances, warns that the Gov-ernment plan to sell off large numbers of Council houses at knockdown prices will leave huge bills to be picked up by

the taxpayer, the ratepayer or the Council tenant.
"Only the best Council houses in areas predominantly owner occupied will be sold," he said.

He states that sales will benefit long standing, betteroff tenants and that poorer tenants will not be eligible to afford to buy or cope with the total cost of

owner occupation.
It is also clear that Sedgefield District Council do not see the sale of houses as a simple matter.

There is no doubt that if Newton Aycliffe rented property was still under the control of the A.D.C. sales would have begun immediately.
Sedgefield insist on treating

this issue as a District matter despite the high ratio of Coun-cil houses in the town.

It is unfortunate, but this will mean a long delay before those who wish to take advantage of the generous concessions can make any plans.

There was some doubt that the car park would not be

The store is modern, alry and well laid out.

Some commodities have been excluded from the original list of items to be sold, some reduced in quantity, and others, including the sale of wines, beers, etc., postponed. Insufficient room is the

sale as expected and no cafeteria. Whether they will be introduced at a later date will depend on demand. But shortage of space would mean that something else would have to go to make room. The food area is immense

and there is no doubt that prices are considerably cheaper than supermarkets.

Meat is a particularly good buy and compare with prices paid a year ago.


