Council houses for sale at last

Now that the Government "Right to Buy" Act is law, Sedgfield District Council have reluctantly commenced the sale of council houses, to sitting tenants.

Meetings were held this week in the Avenue School to explain to tenants how the Government scheme works and how they can benefit. Almost 1,000 people attended the meeting and put

questions to Sedgfield District Council officials. They heard how they can qualify for up to 50% discount on market value of the houses they occupy.

Councillor Roberts is angered by the dithering of Sedgfield District Council on the matter of house sales and is anxious everyone takes full advantage of what he calls the "greatest piece of wealth distribution this country has seen."

He writes the following:-

As almost everyone knows tenants of more than three years standing now have the right to buy their house.

With rents continually going up there are few who can afford not to buy. People who bought last time are paying mortgages of £11 to £16 per month while tenants are paying rents of this amount for similar houses in a single week.

Points of importance

All tenants in council homes for the last three years will get a 33% reduction.

An additional 1% for each year in any local authority house in the country as allowable up to a maximum of 50%!

Application is simple and normally does not require a solicitor and is made on form RTB 1 available from the Housing Department.

All tenants must be replied to on form RTB 2, conceding the right to buy, within one month.

Tenants have the right to take the council to County Court for any infringements of the 1980 Housing Act.

At the public meetings Sedgfield District Council Labour Group stated that they intended to put a restrictive covenant making tenants apply to the council for any changes and internal alterations.

We believe that this is unjustified and a breach of natural law and ought to be resisted so we intend to obtain a ruling in the courts to prevent this and any other restrictive covenants being imposed.

If you believe that the S.D.C. have placed too high a valuation on your property you have a right to have your home valued independently by the Government District Valuer.

Mortgages

100% mortgages are a right you have from the District Council provided you have the minimum income qualifications.

If you are over 60 years of age you will basically only have to pay the interest on the mortgage.

You have an option to buy your home at a fixed price within two years if you don't qualify for a big enough mortgage to enable you to buy outright immediately.

Other members of the family (up to three) that live with you can buy jointly.

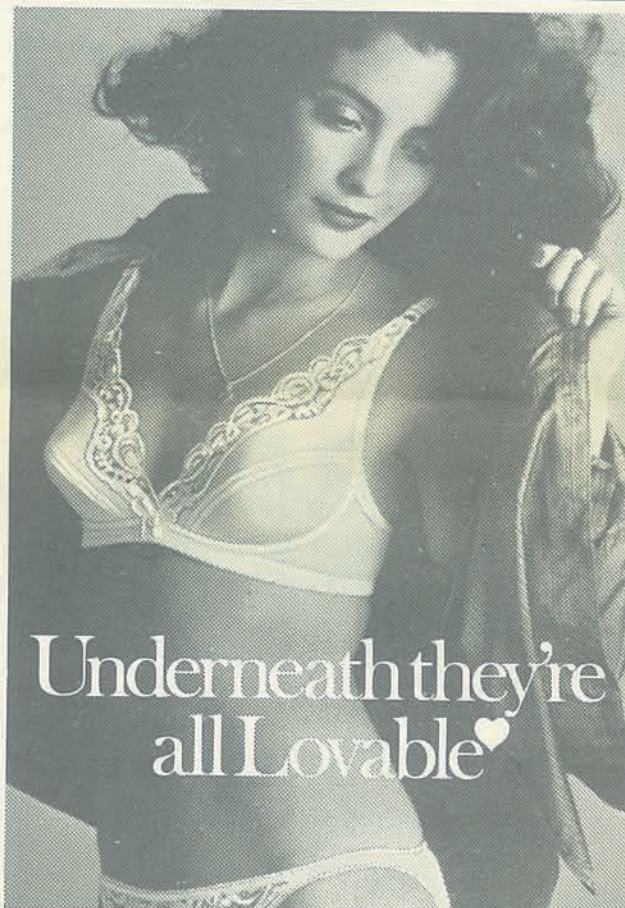

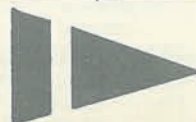

PROFIT DOUBLES ON PARKING METERS

RAC survey shows £10m a year income

Parking meters now swallow nearly £10 million a year, according to an R.A.C. survey published today.

It reveals that 22 of the 39 local authorities covered make a profit which, up to March 31 last year, totalled £14.7 million - an increase

of £2.4 million 'on the previous year's total which was more than twice as much as the profit for the year 1977/78.

Mr. Tony Lee, the R.A.C.'s Director of Public Affairs, said: "These figures show that, since many authorities have made large profits, there should be no reason for them to raise charges and so increase the ever inflating cost of motoring, particularly at a time when motorists are feeling the squeeze."

Trade

"Those authorities making losses should take a close look at their operations to see whether they could cut their expenditure and not seek to make up the deficits by imposing higher charges which could have adverse effects on trade and business interests in the city centres - including facilities provided for leisure purposes such as restaurants and theatres - by encouraging motorists to take their custom elsewhere."

The survey shows that up to 31st March, 1979 a total of £75.2 million had been handed over by motorists in England and Scotland in parking fees since meters were first introduced in 1958 - nearly £10 million more than at the end of the year previously.

There are no meter schemes in Wales.

Operating costs during the same period amounted to over £64 million compared with £56.5 million the year before.

Of the 20 London boroughs included in the survey, only seven made profits but these totalled just over £12 million of which £7.5 million was raised by the City of Westminster where nevertheless it is now proposed to increase meter charges to an unprecedented 60p an hour.

Elsewhere Brighton, Bristol, Leeds, Manchester, Plymouth and Sheffield are the leading profit making authorities with surplus incomes all topping £250,000.

Mr. Lee added that some authorities were planning to use the meters in a new way to increase the revenue - by selling the right to advertise on them.

"Whilst this may be a controversial idea for reasons not directly concerning the interests of motorists, for instance the effect on the amenities, The R.A.C. is endeavouring to ensure that any additional income obtained in this way will be used for the motorists' benefit to finance off-street car parks."

"An assurance has been obtained from the Department of Transport that the statutory restrictions on the use of meter profits are regarded as applicable to such advertising revenue as well as money paid by motorists."

Rally Car to promote Peterlee

A new company selling specialist motor sport components has been set up in Peterlee. And Swift Marketing, the brainchild of three Co. Durham car enthusiasts, is also helping to promote the new town to the spectators at major rallying events in Britain.

Their Sunbeam Talbot rally car, run by partner David Robbins - one of the region's top drivers - competes under the Swift Motor Sport Peterlee banner.

The three men behind Swift David Robbins who works for the CEBG; Charles Temple, a Local Government Officer and Malcolm Lanes, who has been in the motor trade for ten years - came together because of their shared interest in motor sport.

They began Swift Marketing two years ago, running it part time from home selling alloy wheels by mail order.

Demand

"Demand was sufficiently high for us to consider making it a full-time operation" said Malcolm Lanes, "so we approached Peterlee Development Corporation for a factory."

From their 1,250 square foot factory in Armstrong Road, Peterlee, Swift are now marketing a wide range of specialist components, wheels tyres and suspension units, mainly for motor sport vehicles, by mail order. Business is good with orders from Sweden, Holland and Ireland as well as all over the U.K.

"Naturally we advertise very widely and it is important for us to get our name and location known," said Mr. Lanes, "This is

really where the rally car comes in and how we are selling Peterlee as well."

"The car which is rallied under the Swift Motor Sport Peterlee banner is a mobile test bed for the equipment we sell and our potential customers who attend the major rallying events can see how good it is by David's results."

Top ten

And David Robbins results are certainly helping business. He is constantly in the top ten in his class in the Castrol Autosport National Rally Championship and has competed in the R.A.C. Rally and other international events.

In fact, it is beginning to seem as though the north east new towns and motor sport go together. Aycliffe, Peterlee's sister town, sponsors a Formula 2 racing car in the International Aurora series, to sell its name to prospective industrialists.

John Petrie, County Road Safety Officer today announced the start of a new road safety publicity campaign called PEDESTRIANS — GET THE HABIT — STOP — LOOK — LISTEN.

He said that "None of us like anyone to mention our bad habits but the careless habits of pedestrians in Durham County were leading to well over 600 casualties each year."

The main problem is that many of us are always in a hurry going to work or when we are shopping and we forget to STOP — LOOK — LISTEN before we cross the road.

The good habits Mr. Petrie would like us to adopt are:-

1. Always remember to STOP — LOOK — LISTEN
2. Always try to cross away from parked cars - DRIVERS CAN'T SEE YOU - YOU CAN'T SEE THEM
3. Be especially careful judging the speed of traffic from the left - ALWAYS GIVE YOURSELF TIME TO CROSS BOTH SIDES OF THE ROAD
4. Parents should regularly ask their children to explain and demonstrate the Green Cross Code. You could be surprised how quickly children can forget this life saver.

NEW TELEPHONE NUMBERS FOR DINSDALE

Over one thousand Dinsdale telephone numbers will be changed at 9 a.m. on Monday 13 October when the present four figure numbering scheme is changed to six figures by prefixing existing numbers with 33.

For example DINSDALE 2190 will become DINSDALE 332190.

The STD code will also be changed to 0325.

All customers whose numbers are to be changed have been notified and the new numbers will be shown in the next editions of the Yellow Pages and Alphabetical directories.

The changeover to six digit numbers will incorporate DINSDALE into the DARLINGTON linked numbering scheme and this will enable calls between Darlington, Dinsdale and Aycliffe to be made without using a dialling code.
