NEW SQUASH COURTS OPENING AT SCHOOL AYCLIFFE COMPLEX

A MAJOR DAY of sporting entertainment — with top footballers, golfers, and two of the world's best known squash champions — will launch a new sports facility for the area on Sunday.

Great Aycliffe Town Council is opening an extension to its Sports and Leisure Complex at School Aycliffe housing four

international class squash courts.

The £125,000 extension will be opened at noon by the Mayor of

Aycliffe, Coun. Mrs Enid Meadows.

The courts are unique in Britain being made in laminate which is virtually maintenance free. They were manufactured by Perstorp Waverite of Aycliffe in its Swedish factory and one of the courts was given free.

During the afternoon New Zealander Bruce Brownlie, the fourth ranking squash player in the world, and Gawain Briers, Britain's number one, will give an exhibition match, play four Durham County players and hold a squash clinic for members of the public.

Phil Chance, Recreation Organiser for the Town Council, said: "There will be a really top class open day with experts in just about all the sporting activities which are on offer at the centre.

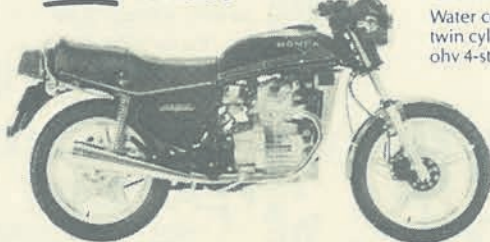

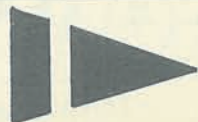

Denis Healey to speak at constituency meeting in Shildon

Dear Sir,

I write on a joint basis on behalf of the Bishop Auckland Area Fabian Society and the Bishop Auckland Constituency Labour Party to invite your readers to a public meeting which is due to be held in the Shildon Civic Hall on Tuesday, 18th November, between 7-9 p.m. The subject is: "Into the Eighties with Labour" and is organised as part of our recruitment drive and campaign against unemployment.

The main speaker will be the Rt. Hon. Denis Healey, MP, who, as

you are probably aware, is one of the more prominent members of the Labour Party and is tipped by many as being the likely successor to Jim Callaghan as leader of the Parliamentary Labour Party.

Denis Healey entered Parliament as MP for Leeds South East at a bye-election in 1952, and for Leeds East in 1955. The posts held during his impressive Parliamentary career include: Secretary of State for Defence (1964-70); Chief Opposition Spokesman on Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs (1970-72); Chief Opposition Spokesman on Treasury Matters (1972-74); and Chancellor of the Exchequer

(March 1974-79).

The Member of Parliament for Bishop Auckland, Derek Foster; and possibly Bert Twigg, Regional Organiser of the Labour Party; will also be addressing the meeting. I can assure you the event will be one of major local and national significance.

A.D.C. "KEY COURSE" SUCCESS ENCOURAGING FOR THE FUTURE

The key to starting a new business — or being better at the one you have — is a course run by Aycliffe Development Corporation.

As the 20 week course for people interested in business approaches its end, the area is likely to have gained four new companies, two expanding businesses and half a dozen people who are now running their com-

panies more efficiently than they were before.

Key Course was started in June. Under Gerry Kirkwood, a lecturer at Teesside Polytechnic, the course has covered finance, taxation, marketing, Government incentives, and general business viability. For two hours a week between 20 and 25 people — housewives, factory workers, company directors — have

attended the sessions at Aycliffe Recreation Centre.

Ian Wiggett, Industrial Liaison Officer with Aycliffe Development Corporation, who organises Key Course, said: "The fact that so many people have remained interested in the course speaks for itself."

"The results are also excellent. I expect four of the people attending to be starting their own businesses during the next six to nine months, two have used the course to help them expand their companies and half a dozen wanted to be better at running their businesses. The rest are ordinary people who are just interested."

"We will be running the course again next year, probably starting in January and I believe we will get just as much interest the second time."

One of the people who is drawing up plans to start up in business is Bryan Armstrong of Aycliffe, a 46-year-old former technical manager in an engineering company. A former draughts-

man, Mr Armstrong was made redundant at the end of June.

He says: "The course has helped me understand the background to starting a company and the taxation rules. It would have been very difficult indeed for me if this course had not been run."

Mr Armstrong is now drawing up his business plans. He will be offering a service of advice and practical help to companies who do not have their own draughtsmen or designers.

"I will probably start at home but hope to get premises in Aycliffe eventually," said Mr Armstrong. "With the recession many many companies cannot afford to employ their own technical staff but require the services of technical people."

Dentists in the North-East will now be able to get top class ceramics and chrome-cobalt work done for them without having to leave the region — also thanks to Key Course.

Bob Taylor has been in business in Aycliffe running a dental service for around three years. "We did

basic denture plates, crowns and inlays for dentists in the area but I could see a need to provide the really specialist services — bonded porcelain bridges and chrome-cobalt plates," said Mr Taylor. "This sort of work just wasn't done in the North-East."

"I wasn't confident about expanding in that way so I went to Key Course. All the financial and paperwork details were explained

in simple terms and my expansion would have been more slower without the course."

Mr Taylor has now taken on a partner, German-trained Errol Deare, at his Aycliffe Dental Services premises in Ricknall Avenue. "We are already getting business from as far away as Aldershot because of the high quality work we are able to do," concluded Mr Taylor.
