MAJOR CHANGES IN OUR COMMUNITY RADIO

AYCLIFFE Community Radio — our experimental broadcasting station set up under the Home Office Licence in 1978 — will keep going for at least another year.

Major changes in the format of broadcasting are, however, taking place in an attempt both to establish more community involve-

ment by recruiting local people to compile and present programmes and to develop revenue from advertising. As a result of this, the

present station manager and his assistant are being made redundant and two new posts, General Manager and Production controller, are being created.

Mr Don Eltringham, the secretary of the ACR board, said: "We feel that the fundamental changes proposed are necessary. There is no doubt that our present broadcasting standards are highly professional but the Board feels that we must have more Aycliffe people involved and that the only way to achieve this is by restructuring day to day control.

Although Aycliffe Development Corporation has been the prime financial backer of the radio station, we are, in theory at least, also raising money from advertising commercials. We would not expect that the station could, however, become fully financed by advertising, but we believe a lot more could be done in this field."

The Board is currently advertising for a General Manager who will not necessarily be a broadcaster but will be primarily involved with running and promoting the station and raising advertising revenue.

The Production Controller will supervise programming and training of volunteers, who will be recruited.

Although the present Home Office licence expires at the end of 1981, it is likely that a further licence will be granted if the radio station can be seen to have a greater community involvement and is in a position to raise funds.

Harry Rowell and his son Peter, who have been running the station, have shown how high broadcasting standards can be raised on a very small station. We will be attempting to ensure that these standards are maintained but feel it is equally important that Aycliffe people learn to use the station for themselves," said Mr Eltringham.

We understand the Rowells have applied for the new posts, so if they are successful, it may not be the last we hear of them.

152 ENTRIES IN LITERARY COMPETITION

The Sid Chaplin Literary Award 1980, run by Aycliffe Development Corporation, has been won by a 29-year-old clergyman from Hartlepool and a 26-year-old estates officer from Peterlee, who will each receive a prize of £100.

The short story competition is aimed at stories with a new town background and has run for four years.

"The six judges were completely divided over an outright winner from the 152 stories entered and the only fair way was to award two prizes," said Sheila Brown, newest member on the panel of judges and Board member of the Corporation.

The winners and five runners-up received their awards on November 25th at a ceremony in Churchill House, and author Sid Chaplin made the presentations.

Runners-up include a whisky warehouse manager from Glenrothes who receives his third award, and a retired headmaster from Darlington who takes his second award in the competition.

Two ladies, one a newly retired school teacher living in Crawley with her first attempt at writing, and the other, also 60, a writer from Stockton and Middlesbrough's Evening Gazette poet laureate of the year.

A special award also goes to a young man of 8½ years from Glenrothes for a most delightful story from the youngest ever story writer in the competition.

The junior section winner, who receives a cheque for £25, and runner-up, both 15-year-olds, will be presented with their awards when Sid Chaplin visits them in their Newport Pagnall school.

Temperatures rise over town's swimming pool

A lot of adult swimmers have complained about the temperature in the Recreation Centre swimming pool and believe the economics to reduce heating bills will save nothing if they result in less people using the facility.

There are a few instances where people have forsaken their local swimming pool to travel to Darlington and Bishop Auckland for their warm swim.

We contacted the Recreation Centre who insist the water temperature has remained unchanged and is maintained at a level of 81°.

Mike Page, manager, regrets swimmers are going out of town, and feels the reason may be the temperature outside the pool and then, only affecting the early

morning customers.

"Economies have been made by covering the pool at night and switching off heaters outside the pool overnight. But the water is kept at 81°, the level at which all swimming pools in the area are kept," said Mr Page.

"It is a fact the temperature outside the pool in the mornings may feel colder these days, because of the need for economy, but it is only for a short time each morning," the manager added.

It seems we have spoilt our swimmers over the years and now that economies have to be made they must suffer a little, but maybe this is preferable to having to pay more to swim.

FLYMO AGREES TO BUY DUBLIN MOWER FIRM

Flymo Limited, Europe's largest manufacturer of powered lawn mowers, has agreed to purchase Special Services Co. Ltd. of Sutton, Dublin.

The move coincides with the pending retirement of the founder of the company, Mr Terry Buckley, who will continue his involvement in a consultative capacity.

Formed in 1946, Special Service Co. Ltd. is a leading distributor of outdoor power equipment in Eire. It has distributed Flymo products since 1964.

Announcing the agreement Flymo Managing Director Mr Peter Bullock said the purchase was agreed to prevent change in ownership which may prejudice Flymo operations in Eire.

It would also strengthen and extend opportunities for distribution of the expanding range of outdoor products from the international Electrolux Group of Companies including Flymo Limited and the recently acquired Norwegian-based A/S Norlett

Group. Norlett is Europe's largest manufacturer of cultivators as well as a major producer of conventional rotary and cylinder mowers.

Mr Bullock said the Flymo organisation would also be able to take advantage of anticipated economic development in the Republic.

Purchase of the Dublin firm would help Flymo Limited more easily achieve increased sales, profits and market share targets next year (1981). These are well above indicated record sales this year where the Flymo increase in the United Kingdom market share is more than five per cent in spite of intense competition.

On Christmas Eve, there will be a celebration of Holy Communion at 11.45 p.m., and a further celebration on Christmas morning at 10 a.m. (not 10.45 a.m. as previously advertised).

Ninety-nine years ago a major restoration of St. Andrew's Church was undertaken on the initiative of the Vicar, Rev. C. J. A. Eade, by the London architect Mr Ewan Christian, at a cost of £3,000. Until that was well underway, it was universally believed that St. Andrew's Church dated from the 12th century. When the plaster was removed, it was discovered that the earliest parts of the church were, in fact, Saxon. The Saxon stonework, and in particular, the corner stones of the former Saxon nave — which was extended in the 12th century — can be clearly distinguished.

There are two pre-Conquest stone crosses in the church, as well as other pre-Conquest stone fragments of various sizes.

After the excitement among archaeologists of the last century, St. Andrew's seems to have returned to comparative obscurity. It was even passed by for decades by those responsible for listing historic buildings. But once again St. Andrew's is in the public eye because it has now officially become a building of "special historic or architectural interest — Grade 1".

Only about four per cent of listed buildings are classed as Grade 1.

We expect a trickle of visitors, some from overseas, to become more of a flood in 1981, and especially 1982 when we celebrate the centenary of the restoration of the church and 1200th anniversary of the first Synod held at Aycliffe in 782.

Coach and Horses win pool contest

On Friday, October 24th, Miss Ethel Milner died in St. John of God Hospital, Scorton. Miss Milner was the first head teacher in Newton Aycliffe and her first school was in four flats in Bede Crescent. It opened on September 10th, 1951, when 28 children were admitted. She moved to the present Sugar Hill Infant School on 13th April, 1953 where 321 pupils were of Infant and Junior school age. When the Junior school was completed she continued as head teacher of the Infant department until her retirement on April 30th, 1973. Miss Milner was cremated at Darlington on October 28th after a service at Muker. Past and present members of staff attended the cremation.
