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AYCLIFFE CAMERA CLUB GETS UNDERWAY

Thirty-one interested persons attended a meeting on Wednesday, 1st April, held in "The Cubby", the purpose of which was to form a Camera Club.

NEW WALKWAY AND SHOPS FOR TOWN CENTRE

WORK COMMENCES next month on the construction of a walkway above Beveridge Way Shops.

The new pedestrian way will run from Barclays Bank and connect up with the existing ramp at Hardings.

It will also link up with access to the multi-storey car park, provide improved shopping facilities and give protection from bad weather for ground floor pedestrians.

The former flats at this level will be converted to shops and offices.

And new services, including a dentist, chiropodist and a solicitor have already indicated interest in taking over the new units.

There are hopes that the large "L" shape premises, formerly occupied by Wentons, could be

work with speed and consideration for the shopkeepers and their customers.


The building programme is approximately of six months duration with completion expected for Christmas.


There is bound to be some inconvenience while all this activity takes place and it is hoped people will understand the situation and make allowances.

The end result will be well worth waiting for as there is no doubt this scheme will improve the flow of pedestrians and give the town centre a more interesting appearance.

The new walkway may even help to relieve the ugliness of the ramp which many people insist is too big and heavy-looking for our town centre.

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NEW CAMPAIGN TO HELP SMALL BUSINESSES

A 1,000 guinea campaign aimed at new small manufacturing companies has been launched in Newton Aycliffe. A package of

assistance ranging from 300 gallons of heating oil to letterhead design and printing is on offer by the town's Development Corporation in

a bid to encourage more industry to the town.

The target of the Aycliffe campaign is the new businessman struggling to raise enough cash to get started. The 1,000 guinea prize will be offered to every small company starting manufacturing in the town's industrial estate.

Aycliffe Development Corporation hopes the prize will better last year's record of 16 new small companies which moved to the town employing 61 people and occupying nearly 40,000 square feet of space.

Tony Cooper, Aycliffe's Director of Estates, said: "With the recession the most active industrial sector has been small businesses and we have been concentrating our efforts there. One of the

problems facing small companies — especially new ones — is finding enough money at first for all the little things you need to start in a new factory. There's heating oil, electricity connection charges, lighting, a telephone, water meter, letterheads, factory sign and legal costs. When you add it all up it comes to well over £1,000.

"The fact is that £1,000 is sometimes just too much and the businessman decides to wait instead of proceeding. We are giving him all of these things up to a 1,000 guineas limit to allow him to go ahead immediately.

"In addition we are throwing in a year's membership of the Teesside Small Business Club, conference room facilities and a guaranteed place on our Key Course for new business people."

Anyone opting for the 1,000 guineas scheme will still qualify for a rent free period of 21 months. Interested people should contact Mr Cooper on Aycliffe 313221.

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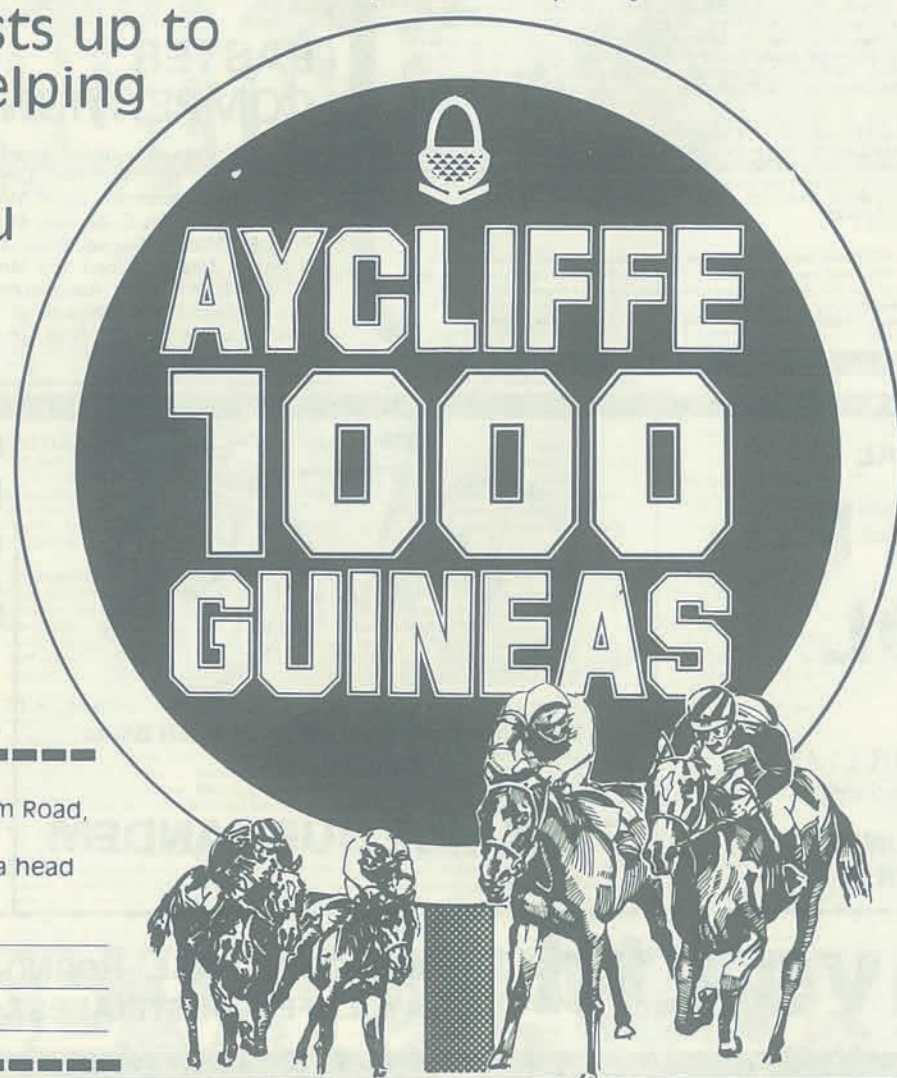

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District Council reply on maintenance for housebuyers

Dear Sir,

You appear somehow or other to have gained the impression that this Council has written to tenants who have applied to buy their houses, informing them that they cannot now have any repairs, repainting or maintenance work completed in their homes. If this were the case then I suppose your article could perhaps be considered to have some degree of merit or justification attached to it, although even in those circumstances the use of emotive language such as "spiteful backbiting" and accusations that the Council has "never shown any enthusiasm over the sale of Council houses" and that the Council is "looking for a loophole to crawl through" would call for a response from any fair-minded and responsible local authority.

Let me once and for all time nail this lie and emphasise to you that the Council will continue to carry out all of its statutory obligations as a landlord as they are laid down in the 1961 Housing Act. These require the Council to keep in repair the structure and exterior of the dwellinghouse and the installations in the house for the supply of water, gas, electricity and sanitary conveniences, together with installations in the house for space heating and water heating. In simple terms, this means that the Council, like any landlord, is responsible for ensuring that the property is kept wind and watertight and is provided with the amenities required to keep it in a habitable condition. The Council

will meet these obligations in accordance with its normal maintenance policy and will carry out those repairs which are regarded as high priority repairs as quickly as possible, but we have to be fair to all and we cannot carry out low priority repairs to houses to be sold, whilst other tenants await the carrying out of high priority work. Is this unreasonable? I think not and am sure the majority of your readers would agree with me.

Nor do we see it as reasonable that we should be asked to expend our scarce financial resources on carrying out improvement works to houses where Right to Buy notices have been served on the Council at a time when houses which are occupied by people who wish to remain as Council tenants also require modernisation and improvement, and we are not being allowed by the present Government to spend as much in this direction as we would wish. This is particularly the case when Right to Buy notices were served between October 3, 1980 and April 2, 1981 and where houses as a result have to be valued as they stood in August 1980 and we are not allowed to reflect the cost of improvements in the sale prices.

With regard to your comments concerning delays I wish to stress that the Council is operating the Right to Buy provisions and is NOT seeking to delay sales. The Government has however saddled us with a system that is both complicated and time-consuming. Each application needs to pass through no less than 30 different stages before reaching completion of a sale. Despite this we have been subject to unfair and uninformed criticism in the local press with accusations of delay.

No Council can have done more to assist its tenants in the first step to buying their houses. The response has confirmed this and well over 2,300 tenants have sent in their forms. Over 230 offers have already been made and the first sale completions have now taken place. With the numbers involved, the staffing situation and the complex system we are required to operate, it is inevitable that applicants will feel frustrated but I regret that it is simply not possible for us to proceed any more quickly than we are: what I can say is that the responsible Government Department has made no criticism of this Council's handling of house sales; our staff have gained such a reputation in the Region in regard to the complicated process which has to be followed that other Councils frequently come to them for advice and guidance.
