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# Building scheduled for old town roundabout

THE NEWS that building is to commence on the site of the old town centre roundabout brought protests from various sections of the community.

Town Councillors, who previously opposed the scheme, were foremost in opposition to the ADC's revised plans.

Some shopkeepers are also up in arms, mainly because they fear the competition more shops bring, and will mean an increasing threat to the livelihood of those already in difficulties due to high rent and rates.

All businessmen are living in very difficult times, and the high rents being asked which are out of all proportion to the purchasing power of Newton Aycliffe, do not help matters.

The purchasing power is poor because too many people shop in

Darlington, where there is a wider choice. But will more shops in Aycliffe stop Newtonians travelling to this popular market town?

Newton Aycliffe is fast losing the service of its private traders. The last few years has seen private shops close down or cut back at an alarming rate, and one wonders when the ADC will recognise the danger signs.

Or do they want a town centre full of national chain stores?

The fact is that national companies are the only ones able to afford the luxury of trading in Newton Aycliffe. But it is also a fact that the same nationals are quick to close a shop that doesn't come up to expectations.

It is our view that they will soon realise this and it won't be long before we have many more vacant shops. It is difficult to understand why the ADC persist in a policy which is detrimental to the success of our town centre.

On the industrial front they are pouring money into promotions and incentives to create jobs — even one-man concerns get help. Commerce and shops employ people, yet they get no help whatsoever — instead they suffer from punitive rents.

The shopping precinct of any town is an important factor in attracting industry. It must have an interesting and pleasant shopping environment and while the ADC are attempting to improve the aesthetic quality of the area it will not succeed without a good mix of shops and services.

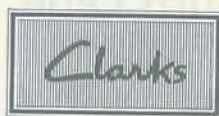
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# AGNEW ESTATE GETS FOODSTORE AT LAST

Eddie Highfield and Alan Dargue have opened a foodstore at Parsons Centre, bringing to residents of the area a valuable and long awaited service.

This is the second foodstore for this enterprising partnership, having taken over the Washington Crescent shop a year ago.

The Parsons Centre shop had been vacant for two years, failing to attract a businessman to set up a shop until Eddie and Alan made their decision to expand.

The District Council accepted their rent tender and after fitting out the premises opened up in mid-May — much to the relief of residents of the Agnew area who have to trudge to the town centre for everything.

“We have received a very good reaction from the first customers and feel sure everyone will find our service and prices acceptable,” said Eddie Highfield.

The shop is open every day and even sells Sunday Newspapers. The partners say they will not attempt to compete with the odd few items that Supermarkets sell as loss leaders.

“We will just ask a fair price for our service,” said Eddie.

This policy may prove successful as many small shops have gone broke trying to compete with superstores.

A number of shoppers are beginning to realise how little they save on a full grocery bill, and a recent survey showed that by taking into account travelling costs, an average shopper saved only 13p by shopping at superstores.

Agnew residents may feel it is worth paying that little extra for convenience and service.

## New £½ million road opened

A new road which provides a direct access from Aycliffe to the north — and opens the site of a former medieval village for the establishment of a new community — was opened last week.

The road, an extension to Burnhill Way, was formerly opened by the Chairman of Sedgfield District Council.

The new road which, with a new roundabout, cost £500,000, and will provide a more direct access for industry and residents to Aycliffe from the north. It also gives access to the new 18-hole golf course — due to be completed later this year — and also opens up a route to old Woodham Village.

Woodham Village was a settlement in medieval times but became depopulated, apparently due to the “Black Death”. The site Aycliffe Development Corporation proposes to develop is very close to the old village.

Already a hotel site is being marketed close to the golf course and building will shortly begin on the first of the private housing developments there.

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# RADIO ACTIVITY ON 'C'

**AYCLIFFE COMMUNITY RADIO** is active, and in more ways than one. From the 1st of June, Aycliffe Community Radio starts broadcasting from 7 a.m. through to midnight, which means you can hear your own radio station virtually any time of the day on Rediffusion channel 'C'.

Michael Searle, general manager, says: "We can now offer a real service to the community by expanding on our current schedule and format." Transmission starts at 7 a.m. with the breakfast show 'Aycliffe Reports' hosted by A.C.R. news editor Richard Denning. Richard heralds from Kent and has a wide and varied experience in broadcasting. Many of you may have heard him reading the news on Radio Tees when they take the Independent Radio News from London, or in fact you may have heard him on the BBC's external services, or regular visitors to London would have heard him on BBC Radio London, or LBC. With him on the breakfast show will be Mark Huitson, a local lad from Aycliffe who joined the station as a newsroom trainee recently.

The days transmission continues through the morning and afternoon with Richard organising the days news output. A.C.R. has a very versatile newsroom, capable of producing not only the stations local news output but sub editing the national and international news. "Rather than just picking up local news headlines," said Richard Denning, "We are Aycliffe, so therefore Aycliffe stories when available warrant more than just headlines." The news team also research many of the items heard in the programmes.

After the breakfast show at nine, Mike Searle will present three hours of easy listening music until twelve. The programme, produced by Gary Lowe, will include music, local features, and information aimed at people, perhaps with young children, working in the home. Between twelve and five Peter Rowell introduces the afternoon programme. This show is not really the marathon it seems, as between two and three o'clock A.C.R. will be carrying 'Woman's Hour'.

But some of the station's old favourites will be retained. The Know Your Town quiz will appear between twelve and one and the new schedules see the re-introduction of the popular 'Beat The Intro' music game.

After five o'clock, the station is largely given over to volunteer presenters with easy listening music through to midnight. News bulletins will be broadcast every half hour between seven and nine. From ten o'clock there will be five minute bulletins on the hour until seven p.m., including national and local news. Also news headlines will be read by the programme presenters on the half hour.
