Full contact karate is the fastestgrowing and most exciting spectator sport of the 1980s. It is the ultimate fighting sport. It combines the best of western fighting tradition with the more spectacular techniques taken from the Oriental fighting schools.

It is important to define fullcontact karate within a framework, in order to understand better why it is such a fresh and innevatory sport, while at the same time being part of a long established tradition.

It's an undisputed fact, fighting is the world's oldest sport. It probably commenced when some overzealous caveman clubbed down a foe with ungraceful brutality while his chorts applauded from the sidelines. Today, fighting is conducted in a square called a ring where man's primitive, animalistic tendencies are more safely and innocently revisited. The important distinction of course is that it is conducted as a sport under strict rules and regulations. No clubs allowed.

History then has taught us that unarmed fighting encapsulates as an entertainment form man's basic instinct for survival. For that reason man continues to improve himself by seeking new modes of combative conduct within the ring. His newest offspring is full-contact karate which, to many devotees and fans epitomizes survival of the fittest.

Contact karate is the latest expression of man's wish to identify with two superbly fit fighters engaged in a contest of strength, ability and speed. Full contact is new, exciting and easy to understand.

We have mentioned in passing that full contact is the synthesis of what is best and most exciting in Western and Oriental fighting Broadly speaking a contact fighter uses his hands and feet to punch and kick his opponent. This is not as vicious as it may sound. Firstly all fighters must wear special gloves, similar to boxing gloves, and 'contact' boots, foam pads that cover the upper part of the feet. Shin pads are also worn, a groin protector is obligatory, as is the gum shield. Secondly it is forbidden to strike an opponent by using knees or elbows. This could lead to serious

New full-contact, in particular professional contact fighting, is run by experts who care deeply about the future of the sport. In many cases they were senior martial arts instructors and fighters themselves. They know that the growth potential of this new sport The serious enormous. promoters have taken over from those after quick money, who had jumped on the early bandwagon, doing more harm than good.

The Professional Karate Assoclation is the biggest promoter of full-contact events worldwide. As such it has an image and a reputation for integrity to live up to. Under PKA rules all fighters must undergo a medical check-up before and after each fight. The Association rules state clearly what blows and kicks are not allowed, the length and number of rounds, the criteria by which judges must score points. In fact PKA rules cover all aspects of fullcontact, to ensure that the sport will not degenerate into untidy

An interesting aspect of fullcontact is the use of hands and feet. Hands, in particular, are used in a way more akin to boxing than karate. The 'chop' or knife hand blow is impossible to execute with gloves. Besides it is a dangerous echnique. A newcomer will notice the fighters bobbing and weaving boxers, exchanging jabs,

It must be understood that lea techniques are very tiring. Kicks involve the whole body more completely than punches, they are also more powerful. A young or inexperienced fighter finds it easier to trade punches and just throw a kick or two, keeping the opponent at a distance. To avoid this 'lazy approach to full-contact, PKA has ruled that all fighters must kick a minimum of eight kicks per round. This makes for a much more spectacular fight.

In order to win and to avoid injuries, fighters must be exceedingly fit, supple, and They train very indeed. Running for miles, hours of bag work, kicking and punching, suppleness training. They must study tactics and strategy. These men must be complete athletes.

Thousands of people write to the European Branch of the PKA enquiring about training dates of events, techniques, of clubs. addresses professional Karate Association is optimistic that full-contact will be 'The Kick of the 80s.'

In Newton Aycliffe the sport is already well established under the competent coaching of Mr B Norman who runs regular courses. The next session is to be held in the Recreation Centre on Sunday, 26th July, 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. A number of British champions will demonstrate and discuss the art of full-contact karate.
