MODEL RACING CAR GRAND PRIX

A NEW EVENT in the motor racing calendar — the Aycliffe International Grand Prix — is being held on September 12 and 13 in the new town.

More than 100 cars will take part — and none of them will have anyone behind the wheel!

The event is for radio controlled model cars in the Formula I and GT categories and is part of a two day "Wheels" festival.

Also included will be a mammoth indoor scalextric display, commercial vehicle rally of vintage lorries and buses, mini motor show, military vehicles

display, Army display, control racing exhibition and industrial fair.

The weekend festival, organised jointly by Aycliffe Development Corporation and Atlas Express, is expected to attract more than 10,000 visitors to the town.

Aycliffe International Grand Prix is the largest invitation event in the radio-controlled model car racing calendar this year. It is expected that 120 drivers from all parts of the UK and Northern Europe will be present for the two-day event for GT and Formula I cars. A 200 foot by 100 foot circuit has been specially designed by the North-East Radio Control Car Club for the Atlas Express car park on Aycliffe Industrial Estate and grandstand seating will be available for approximately 1,000 people.

Auto jumble

For those who wish to have a go rather than just watch the experts an indoor Scalextric circuit — occupying 1,400 square feet — will be on display in a nearby factory.

Enthusiasts of commercial and military vehicles will have a display and rally on the Sunday including vintage lorries and buses, single and double decker buses and a range of military vehicles. On the Saturday a sale of auto jumble with particular emphasis on parts for the rare vehicles will be held in an adjacent factory.

The modern motorist isn't being ignored either. Sherwood Trucks will be organising a mini motor show with a wide range of new cars on display. The Control rally team will also be represented.

For the railway enthusiast arrangements are being made to run vintage bus trips to the Timothy Hackworth Railway Museum in nearby Shildon on the Sunday. It is hoped, subject to availability, to have a trip by rail in a coach pulled by the locomotive Sans Pareil.

Industrial exhibition

Other events open to the public will include an industrial exhibition in the Great Aycliffe Town Council Sports and Recreation Centre — which will also be open for light meals and refreshments.

Aycliffe is well served by hotels for visitors and competitors in the model car racing will be able to take advantage of a temporary caravan site near the festival area.

Programmes for the event are available from the Arts and Information Centre in Churchill House from September 1.

Parents and teachers object to school amalgamation

The proposals to amalgamate Elmfield Infant and Junior Schools under one headmaster has met with fierce opposition from parents and teachers.

At a well attended public meeting those affected heard of the planned amalgamation to take place next year.

Details were very vague, but it is understood that eventually, as numbers attending decrease, only one building will be used to accommodate infants and juniors.

A lively discussion was held, but the fears of parents were not allayed. Most share the opinion that this move will have an adverse affect on the standard of education at Elmfield.

The public meeting concluded with the proposal that they "oppose the amalgamation of the schools and wish them to remain as they are," which was passed unanimously.
