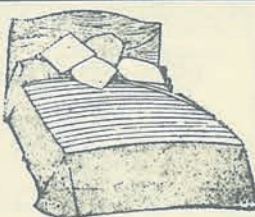

WAITING LIST FOR AYCLIFFE SHOPS

'Local trader moves to prime Darlington site,' read the banner headline in the August 28th issue of Newton News. Readers of this news sheet can be forgiven for wondering if there are any shops still occupied in Aycliffe town centre after reading that and the many similar stories of high rents crippling the town's traders.

Should they believe their eyes rather than their newspaper? Is every shop unit really occupied?

Yes, reader (and editor). There have been eight new local enterprises in the last 18 months. Two shops have expanded and two

new regional businesses have moved in.

Another two local shopkeepers are negotiating extensions and there is a waiting list of traders wanting to move in.

Rents are going up to realistic levels given the demand, the volume of trade and inflation. Have you noticed if the prices in the shops where the rents haven't gone up are still the same as they were 20 years ago?

The campaign in the Newton News appears to be attempting to hide the facts.

Aycliffe is a highly desirable place for shopkeepers and the rents are not deterring traders from coming here and, in most cases, remaining and growing.

CORPORATION SHAKE - UP LOSES 50 JOBS

The reorganisation of Aycliffe and Peterlee Development Corporations has been completed with 50 members of staff being made redundant.

Against the background of Government cuts we had to ensure the continuing efficiency of the two Corporations in bringing industry to the region. The new structure will be introduced immediately with the redundancies taking place by the end of October 1981.

Reorganisation was decided upon by the Corporation's board in June following an independent report on the likely effects of staff turnover and Government enforced reductions in manpower between now and the target date for the dissolution of the two Corporations at the end of 1985.

In all, 50 people, 22 based at Aycliffe and 28 based at Peterlee, will be made redundant. Of these, four have opted for early retirement and all but one are

voluntary. The staff member involved in the one enforced redundancy has opted to work the notice period to which he is entitled under his contract and he has been promised consideration if a suitable vacancy occurs within the new structure during that period.

The Corporation have honoured all contracts of employment in full and the trade unions representing employees in both towns are satisfied with the agreed redundancy terms.

The reorganisation has involved the disappearance of the existing Technical Services Department, the two Estates Departments, Public Relations and Social Development and the creation of a joint Development Department and a joint promotions and marketing unit.

Of the existing management team, both estates directors, the public relations officer and the social development officer have been made redundant.

Arthur Cocker, former director of technical services, has been appointed director of development; Don Eltringham, former Chief Finance Officer, has been appointed director of finance and the post of head of promotions and marketing is being advertised.

After the redundancies take place the Corporations will employ 152 people, 41 permanently based in Aycliffe, 45 in Peterlee and 66 joint. It is felt that the much increased emphasis on joint posts will enable the most efficient use of resources and expertise.

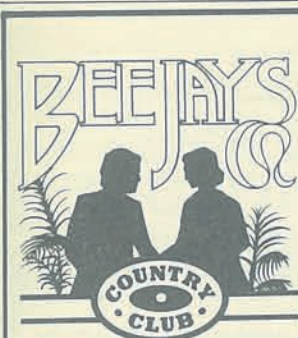
