A BONFIRE WITH A DIFFERENCE

A bonfire with a difference was lit on November 5th when Mr Howard Chadwick set alight two fire check doors on some waste ground in Spennymoor.

Mr Chadwick was demonstrating the effect of "Pyrostop", his new product which he intends to manufacture in Newton Aycliffe. The demonstration compared the fire resisting qualities of a standard 20-30 fire check door (BS476) and a door injected with Pyrostop.

Pyrostop will be made by a new company — Pyrostop Ltd. — which will operate from a new 3,000 sq. ft. factory unit on Aycliffe Industrial Estate. Mr Chadwick hopes to be employing 50 people or more soon after he takes occupation of the factory at the end of November.

ADC MAY BE ON THE MOVE

AT ONE OF THE regular Consultative Committee meetings last week the Aycliffe Development Corporation revealed to the District Council they had an offer to lease a substantial part of Churchill House with the prospect of 30 new jobs.

With this in mind the ADC are seriously exploring the feasibility of moving out completely and taking over a factory unit on the Industrial Estate.

The factory would be adapted to provide all the ADC requirements

under one roof, i.e. administration, promotion and exhibition areas.

The ADC had previously planned to move into the new town centre office block, leaving the cheaper block of offices in Churchill House to be let to outsiders. They recognised that rental of the new building would be high and therefore not help to attract tenants and office jobs.

As the ADC's prime role is industrial promotion, the idea of moving to the Industrial Estate is sound, providing the move is not too costly.

Astronomical

An enormous amount has been spent over the years on the many changes in Churchill House. Recent expenditure on the top floor executive offices has been astronomical, with the carpeting alone purporting to cost £12,000.

Something more modest is called for now that the ADC have only a limited time in Aycliffe.

There is no way Newton Aycliffe tax payers can control ADC spending, and unlike our elected Council their books are not open to public scrutiny and criticism.

Pirate driving schools move into Aycliffe area

Dear Sir,

Referring to the article in the Evening Despatch on Thursday, 22nd October, relating to pirate driving schools in this area, I would like to endorse the remarks made by Mr Dowson, Mr Seaman and Mr Farley with regard to certain schools offering cut price lessons.

I am not afraid of fair competition but any school that has to resort to cut price tactics and gimmicky advertising are putting themselves in the same category as the flash market boys in Petticoat Lane, London, on a Sunday morning.

The genuine motor school does not have to lower his or her standards to this degree and will

readily show their credentials to prove that they are registered approved Department of Transport driving instructors. If they cannot produce one of these then they are not fully qualified and are only learning the art of teaching themselves.

I have been informed that there are schools in this area who are teaching two and three pupils at a time. How can they justify full and correct individual tuition with this sort of system. I have also heard of a case where a pupil obtained five driving lessons in five weeks. He had five different cars and five different instructors, none of who had any sort of history of his previous lessons, and to cap it all, no lesson was longer than 50

minutes as travelling time was included in his lesson.

Obviously this sort of practice is taking place in this area and as a result we find out that the cheapest priced lessons may turn out to be the dearest in the long run. My advice to anyone wishing to take lessons as well as asking the price per lesson make quite sure that the person teaching you is properly qualified to do so and not just a trainee instructor.

It is not just the job of a driving instructor to only get a person through the driving test but a genuine one will endeavour to pass his or her professional skills on to the pupil in the hope that what is taught will be retained and possibly reduce accidents to make the roads a safer place.

No plans exhibited for building on roundabout site

Dear Sir,

It must have been of considerable interest to many of your readers to know that the Aycliffe Development Corporation has sold the 'roundabout' site to a private developer, who has shown great personal enthusiasm for the scheme, and whose final plans are now being approved.

But one finds it rather surprising that the ADC has not put on exhibit its proposals and plan, and invited Newtonians to express their comments before work has actually started.

The artist's impression of the proposed office block, shops, and public house is thus somewhat difficult to follow, since the existing clock tower does appear to be wrongly placed in its relationship to the proposed redevelopment.

Be that as it may, the inadequacy of landscaping and footpaths around the buildings which concerned the District Council, does seem to be borne out in the artist's impression of the scheme.

A small paved area in front of the proposed office block and shops would have enhanced their position architecturally, and be a safeguard for people stepping off

the pavement on to a main road.

The redevelopment on this 'roundabout' site is bound to affect greatly the existing shops and offices in the vicinity with regard to the amount of daylight they receive. These buildings are sure to be considerably overshadowed by whatever work is erected in such close proximity.

One wishes the private developer every success in his re-planning, remembering how exceedingly attractive the floral roundabout used to be, and with the soaring clock tower beyond creating a delightfully pleasing approach to the town centre.

Sired by Sagaro (three times Ascot Gold Cup winner), the new acquisition will also be trained by Robert Armstrong at the same Newmarket stables as MooreStyle and is likely to be raced over longer distances later in the 1982 flat season.

WOODHAM BURN NATURE TRAIL OPENS OFFICIALLY

On Wednesday, 11th November, a contingent of top brass from the Government, County Education Authority and the Town and District Councils officially opened Newton Aycliffe's own "nature trail."

The Woodham Burn Nature Trail has been developed for the interest and use of the residents of the area and particularly to assist the schools in their task of developing in children a greater respect for and awareness of their environment.

It is convenient and easily accessible and is a rich resource for use in encouraging such development.

The non-specialist teacher should have no difficulty in following the trail with a class, as there should be sufficient information within the teacher's notes to cover the basic work. The proximity of the Burn should enable frequent visits to be made throughout the year so that the work can become an integral part of the curriculum of the school.

The setting up of the trail has been made possible by the enthusiasm for environmental work in St. Mary's R.C. Primary School, the appointment of project officers in County Durham by the Keep Britain Tidy Environmental Education Project, the support of Durham Education Authority and the generosity and technical assistance of the Great Aycliffe Town Council, Sedgfield

District Council and Aycliffe Development Corporation.

Initially the trail was the idea of Mr Brian Smith, teacher of top juniors in St. Mary's. Work has included much walking of the trail and necessary research involved in the writing of the teacher's notes, junior work books and general information leaflets. These have been prepared by Gillian Poole, project officer with the Keep Britain Tidy Environmental Education Project and senior supervisor of the County Durham project. Much of the art work has been produced by another project officer, David Pearson, and assistance with identification of wild flowers, etc. was given by Anne Collin, Anne Coulthard and Rachel Turnbull.

Service for the deaf

The evening service at St. Clare's Church next Sunday will be specially conducted for deaf and hard of hearing people.

An interpreter of sign language will be present and it is hoped that all people in Newton Aycliffe who suffer deafness will accept a warm invitation to attend.

Vicar of St. Clare's, Granville Gibson, believes this is the first time a church service of this type has been offered in Newton Aycliffe and feels it will benefit not only deaf people, but everyone who joins in the service.

The service commences at 6 p.m. on Sunday, 29th November.
