After two well attended Public Meetings supported by over 50 local clubs a Newton Aycliffe Sports Council has been duly

The Local Sports Council has been formed to represent sporting and recreational activities within the Newton Aycliffe area. It cannot fulfill its aims unless it is strong, active and truly representative. For these reasons it is most important that each club becomes a member and gives its support and knowledge.

An important link can be established between organisations, local authorities and the Sports Council (Northern Region) by support, attendance at local Sports Council meetings and other functions.

Objectives

Formal objectives are: 1. To consider and advise upon sports facilities within the Newton Aycliffe area and advise upon such other beneficial development as may be decided.

- 2. To encourage and develop the playing of all games and sports and to extend the benefits of recreational facilities to all members of the community.
- 3. To take such steps as are appropriate to encourage school leavers to continue to take an active part in sport.
- 4. To maintain up to date records of sports organisations and facilities throughout Newton Aycliffe and to disseminate information concerning them.
- 5. To co-operate with all statutory and other bodies in the

furtherance of the objects of the Newton Aycliffe Sports Council and to encourage the exercise of all statutory and other powers under which physical recreation facilities can be acquired or improved, and to promote extension of such powers.

- 6. To raise by subscription or other means, funds for the furtherance of the objects of the Newton Aycliffe Sports Council.
- 7. To apply the income and property of the Newton Aycliffe Sports Council whencesoever derived solely towards the objects of the Newton Aycliffe Sports Council and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise by way of profit to members of the Newton Aycliffe Sports Council.

The officers are as follows: Chairman: Coun. Tom Spensley; Vice-Chairman: Mr M. Thornton, Greenfield School; Secretary: Mr P. Chance, Recreation Organiser, Great Aycliffe Town Council; Treasurer: Mr R. Simpson.

Moral Help

Advice on problems, support, consultation, putting organisations in contact with a source of expert guidance on a particular problem.

Financial Help
