GREAT SUPPORT FOR AYCLIFFE 10K ROAD RACE



Hundreds of runners took to the crowd-lined streets of Newton Aycliffe last Sunday as this year's 3M 10k and 3k races got underway. The annual event is organised by Aycliffe Running Club and attracts entrants for the 10k run from all across the North East region and beyond. This year's winner was Ethiopian athlete Wondiyie Fikre Indelbu, who swept home in a time of 30:51 mins, just 13 seconds short of the course record. It was the second consecutive year that the 2012 Paralympic Games 1500m silver medalist had taken the Aycliffe crown. First home in the women's competition was Dawn Richardson of Quakers Running Club, who finished in 40:43. Now in its 17th successful year, the race is sponsored by 3M Aycliffe, Great Aycliffe Town Council and INEOS. The ongoing popularity of the event was evident from the number of entrants testing their speed around the course. Some 333 lined up for the start of the 10k run with another 102 taking part in the more gentle 3k fun run that preceded it.

Gig-pit review: "Normally I wouldn't bother with a new band but in this case it's line up convinced me it would be worth a punt. The band comprises some heavyweights of the local scene with Steve Smith (Hocus Pocus and Whodlums) on drums, Pete Tunnah (Hocus Pocus) guitar, Patrick on vocals (NEDC), Phil bass (ex This Machine) and Alan (ex Prognosis) on keyboards. Without any fuss straight into David Lee Roth "Living in Paradise" and then Foreigner's "Feels like the First Time. We then had a parade of lesser covered tracks interspersed with good old cover band tunes. Journey, Jefferson Starship's "Jane", Van Halen, Ozzy "No More Tears", Bad Company "Good Loving Gone Bad", Whitesnake's "Is This Love" and Wings "Live and Let Die" or was it Gun's "n' Roses? A short interval then the second set and we had the greatest hits of Python Lee Jackson, a Thin Lizzy number, a long Marillion number very reminiscent of Rush and showcasing Pete's excellent guitar playing. I know you shouldn't have favourites but he is my favourite local guitarist. I had also forgotten how good Phil is on bass. It's good to see him out of retirement. "Whole Lotta Rosie" ended the set keeping the cheesemakers happy before departing into the night. It was a good night and it is always a pleasure to see a band that has a keyboard player and this only adds to the variety that every punter needs. The crowd loved it and that's the important thing".

Greenfield Arts & Durham University Win National Award

What if...? A Greenfield Arts and Durham University project to encourage learning amongst young people has won a national award.

The National Co-ordinating Centre for Public Engagement (NCCPE) announced What If...? as the winner in the 'Engaging Young People' category, at a ceremony in the Natural History Museum, London on Wednesday 11th June.

The aim of the What if...? Project was to encourage young people to explore their own curiosity and interests to determine their own personal learning. The project, managed and developed by Greenfield Arts with researchers at Durham University, encouraged a group of Greenfield Community College students as part of a STEM club to work with theatre makers Unfolding Theatre and researchers from Durham University to be curious about science and the world around them. The judges said of this project:



"We loved the way that the children led the project. They weren't treated as 'empty vessels' - it was their curiosity that drove the project and opened up the world of research."

In collaboration with Greenfield Arts, teachers from Greenfield Community College, theatre makers Unfolding Theatre and scientific researchers from Durham University, the students were challenged to develop and direct an interactive performance piece aimed at engaging and inspiring their peers.

The performance piece challenges audiences to explore their own curiosity, and investigates the research, personal journeys and daily experiences of contributing scientists. So far, it has reached over 2000 people in school and community groups via a school tour in July 2013 and performances at local theatre festivals including Darlington's Jabberwocky

Market. Katy Milne, Director of Arts and Creativity at Greenfield Arts said: "This is a fantastic achievement for this successful project. It is great to see the hard work of all of those involved recognised in this way, especially the young people as the project was completely led by their curiosity. The power of the ongoing partnerships involved in the project created a safe nurturing environment for this to flourish and again combined the strength of the arts and sciences effectively to inspire curiosity in others. Well done to all!"

John Womersley, Public Engagement Champion for Research Councils UK, said "It is great to see so many examples of the valued contributions that UK researchers make to society. When people think of public engagement, what usually comes to mind is the need for researchers to share their findings. Of course that's hugely important, but the entries to this competition show a much richer range of two-way engagement that can bring much deeper benefits both to research and society."

Good Work by Volunteer Litter Pickers



Dear Editor, The Heighington Parish Litter Pick Group on Saturday 14th June carried out the monthly litter pick on the verges of roads around Redworth, School Aycliffe and Heighington.

The group, shown in the photo was somewhat depleted as several members were away on holidays, family visits, supporting England at Lord's and on Mayoral duties. The eight set about collecting 20 bags of litter with several discarded large items, and also found two places with fly tipping. Since the start of HPLG in 2005, 3700 bags of litter has been picked but with little decline in the amount of rubbish people throw onto roadsides.

They keep going and hope that the small clean-up is making a difference to the environment. This time Miles Jackson, seen in the photo with his family, a pupil of Hummersknott Academy joined the team. He is doing the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award Challenge and chose litter picking as one of his voluntary services in the community task.

This was Miles' first outing and he was amazed to find so much litter thrown away

particularly cigarette packets, drink cans and paper coffee cups that appear to emanate from local fast food outlets. Miles found the picking tough and challenging but will be on the next pick on 13th September. There will be a two month break as the grass on the verges is too tall for a safe pick. HPLG will restart its monthly litter pick on the second Saturday of the month and will be pleased to welcome participants including any Scouts and D of E candidates wishing to gain badges or challenge awards.

The next pick will be on 13th September between 10am and 12.00 noon. There are meeting points where help and tools are handed out: Heighington Village Hall, 2 Main Road in Redworth and at Old Farm Cottage in School Aycliffe. Refreshments will be served in Heighington Village Hall after the pick. For more information please look out for posters around the Parish. Dear Sir, I was delighted last week to see the Newton News talking real sense about the market situation.

Whilst I appreciated the motives of the people who were campaigning to retain the existing market, I was never happy about a proposal which sought to do so by putting it on a piece of waste ground. Newton Aycliffe needs and deserves a bustling, high-quality market in the new town centre. So what we want to see now is the Town Council and the town centre owners working together proactively, in partnership, to try to achieve that.

That leaves - as the Newton News pointed out - the issue of what we do with the undeveloped land on the corner of Greenwell Road. As a prime site at the entrance to the town centre forum, it needs and deserves a high-quality development appropriate to the new town centre. So what we need to see here is the County Council proactively marketing it as a development site.

This will need, first, grasping the nettle of what we do with the Cubby and, then, preparing the site to the point where it is fit to put on the market. I am nervous about how long these matters can take, but I am certain that we need to start on them both as soon as possible.

Second Class Workers

Dear Editor,
The 'mobile workers' laws are supposed to allow manufacturers to acquire workers at peak season, without encumbering employers with contractual obligations and employer tax liability they would otherwise be responsible for in permanent contracts.
The law also states the maximum duration a person can work before they must be considered regular workers, and the minimum time between contracts before they can return to the employer as a 'mobile worker'.
The trouble is, these laws that are there to accommodate a temporary boom in production, are being cynically manipulated by some of our area's largest employers, to keep production costs at a minimum in on-going production forecasts. I've spoken with a number of employees working through recruitment agencies for a number of employers, subject to the 'mobile worker' laws. The accounts I've heard have been identical in every case. It is bad enough that an employee should struggle on a permanent contract earning the punishingly low minimum wage. The mobile workers' are pushed further into abject destitution, typically earning poverty wages for only 6-8 months of the year. At peak season, they are without notice required to work punishingly long hours, and see little of that extra income in their wages because of the pro-rata tax system. Many 'mobile workers' work

through injury and illness because time off would see them 'released from their contracts' as many have witnessed happen to their former colleagues. The workers I spoke with had to work through the recent season of bank holidays for standard time, while workers employed directly by the company enjoyed a paid public holiday off work.
The facilitators of this practise are largely parasite employment proxies such as recruitment agencies. While it is legal, I for one feel deeply uncomfortable and ashamed at what I've witnessed in local industry. Some employers are to be applauded for offering proper contracts and decent terms and conditions to all of their employees, while others secure contractual rights for a small number of retained employees, and treat their 'mobile workers' as second class citizens.

PAYING THE PRICE FOR DOG FOULING

More than 250 people have paid the price for dog fouling, dropping litter or not clearing rubbish from their yards or garden. Neighbourhood wardens issued them with £80 fixed penalty notices in April and May in enforcement action to protect the environment. Ian Houl, neighbourhood protection manager, Durham County Council, said: "It is really important that we respond to the concerns of our communities and this action shows that such anti-social and irresponsible behaviour will not be tolerated and will be clamped down wherever it

is reported or witnessed. This covers everything from people who illegally dump waste, do not clean up after their dogs, leave litter or refuse to tidy up gardens and yards
"We want residents to continue their playing their important part by reporting such incidents to us in the first place. All reports are treated with the strictest confidence." Figures for the two months show wardens issued 207 fixed penalty notices for littering, 48 for failing to respond to requests to clear untidy gardens or yards and 17 for dog fouling. One case

of fly-tipping resulted in a prosecution. Stray dogs with micro-chips were traced to their owners and others were taken to kennels and found new homes if not claimed within 14 days. Proposal to Merge Sunnydale with Greenfield College

Proposals for Greenfield Community College and Sunnydale Community College to become one school are out for public consultation.

Both are currently run by one governing body and are just over two miles apart with Greenfield in Newton Aycliffe in Sunnydale in Shildon.

Durham County Council proposals would mean the closure of Sunnydale but pupils would continue to be taught on both sites.

If agreed, Sunnydale Community College would close as a separate school on December 31 2014 with the enlarged Greenfield Community College starting from January 1 2015.

Sunnydale was judged to be inadequate with serious weaknesses after an Ofsted inspection in April this year. Although it has capacity for 954 pupils there are currently only 400 enrolled, meaning 57 per cent surplus places.

Greenfield was highlighted as a good school by Ofsted in 2012. Most recent GCSE results show Greenfield to be above the national average and Sunnydale below.

Carol O'Neill, head of education, Durham County Council, said: "We have been working closely with both schools to look at the best forward in raising

educational standards. Having considered the need to act quickly following the current position of Sunnydale in terms of low attainment and progress, these proposals will ensure that students in this area of the county will have wider opportunities for educational improvement

"The single Greenfield school would make use of accommodation on both sites to provide improved curriculum provision."

The governors have agreed that the Headteacher of Greenfield will be the Executive Headteacher across both schools from

September.

Parents from both schools have been sent detailed consultation documents and response forms for views to be received by July 25 2014. A series of meetings have been scheduled for both schools from next week and there will also be community meetings at both schools.


