New Two Mile Footpath Links Town with Shildon

The past and the future come together with work starting on a new public path linking Shildon and Newton Aycliffe.

The route comes full circle tracing the route of the former Stockton and Darlington railway line ending up on the doorstep of Hitachi who are bringing rail building back to Co. Durham with plans for a £82m train factory providing 730 jobs. When it opened in 1825. the original line was the first public railway to bring together passenger and goods traffic and steam locomotives.

Now the route will provide a new two-mile path for pedestrians, cyclists, horse-riders, mobility scooters and families with push chairs. The route will be a three metre wide tarmacked path which will be low maintenance.

and Sustrans at the Newton Aycliffe end of the new pathway.

Open to the public later this year the route comes alongside other improvements to the existing network to create a more comprehensive network for walkers and cyclists.

Cllr Neil Foster, Cabinet member for economic regeneration, said: "It is fitting that that this important corridor is brought right up to date at a time when there is major rail investment in the county. It will be a link not only between the two towns but also with the past and future. The path will also make active travel a viable and sustainable option to getting to school, work and

Durham County Council has been working closely with the landowners Network and has provided £350,000 funding. A further £300,000 has come from the government via Sustrans Links to Communites Fund. The path comes within the Local Motion campaign area, backed by Durham County Council, to promote sustainable transport and healthy lifestyles throughout south Durham.

The Stockton and Darlington Railway operated in northeast England from 1825 to 1863 and the first line connected collieries near Shildon with Stockton-onTees and Darlington. The movement of coal to ships rapidly became a lucrative business and the line was soon extended to a new port and town at Middlesbrough. Hind, enhancements manager at Network Rail said: "We're pleased to be supporting this project which touches on railway history, and will provide a great new pathway for cyclists and pedestrians

"As part of this project, we have installed a new fence, to help make sure people who use the new path and the railway are kept safely

More Volunteers Needed to Clean the Lakes



Chairman and Secretary of Friends of West Park, Ken Robson and Arun Chandran along with Andy Anderson meet every Sunday at 9am to litter pick Woodham Burn adjacent to the Park, then at 10am litter pick the whole of West Park

Around 11am they enter the top lake and spend a few hours raking out the algae and pond weed finding that using an ordinary lawn rake is the most effective method. They capture most of the weed and algae drain it ready for lifting out onto the side in tidy piles for Council Staff to collect.

At the present rate it will about eight more



Sundays a couple of hours each time to clear the Top Lake and when complete should be easy to maintain thereafter. The volunteers will then turn their attention to the bottom lake.

Great care is taken to observe health and safety to protect the volunteers and the Council. The hard work, is good exercise and once you've recovered you feel better for doing it as well as completing a good deed. Once autumn is over it will

be necessary to flush both lakes dry and remove debri from the lakes. This might also encourage the Ducks to migrate to safer land so that Ducklings survive as most do not, due to attacks by other ducks and sea gulls as well as stupid individuals More volunteers are required to help with the work. "If just ten people turned up with rakes and waders we could probably do a lake in a day!" Arun Chandran

The school enjoys a highly productive working relationship with Durham County Cricket Club which stems from their involvement with the Woodham Sports Academy and has evolved to incorporate the Durham CCC initiative, Learning Beyond The Boundary.

Woodham is one of only two schools working in partnership with the LBB team where students are able to explore the different forms of media used to cover the game from their privileged position in the state of the art media centre. Sharing the stage with professional journalists from The



Northern Echo, BBC Radio Newcastle and The Journal, students wrote summaries of the game as well as regularly 'tweeting' to give updates as the game developed. At the game's conclusion the students prepared questions for Durham star and former England wicketkeeper batsman Phil Mustard and conducted a video interview on the game's highlights and key moments.

A further visit is scheduled for 25th July where a full stadium tour is planned, which will include the changing rooms and the Sky Television broadcast area.

CHARITY SHOWS ALTERNATIVE TO COURT PROCEEDINGS

A 61% rise in people across the North East representing themselves in family courts highlights the need for couples to seek out a more pragmatic solution for their family's future, instead of heading straight to court, says Changing Lives' Families Talking service.

Families Talking, part of the Changing Lives charity group, works across the Tees Valley and including Darlington, Peterlee, Newton Aycliffe. The charity provides practical information and guidance for adults and children who are experiencing problems and distress as a result of family breakdown, separation or divorce.

"Most couples across the North East who have decided to separate think their only option is to head straight to court," says Kay Duffle, Manager of Families Talking Service in Middlesbrough. "Legal Aid cuts introduced last year mean more and more people are representing themselves when they get to court because they cannot afford high cost solicitor fees."

Figures from a Freedom of Information request show the number of people representing themselves in private law child proceedings in the North East rose from 4,698 (April to December 2012) to 7,562 (Apr – Dec 2013), an increase of 61 per cent

"But the 'courtroom first' culture is deeply flawed," she adds. "There are alternative and better ways to settle disputes that put children first. Family mediation can provide long-lasting, common sense solutions that avoid a courtroom drama, especially for children caught in the middle of their parents' disputes. Mediation is quicker, less stressful, and it's cost-effective too."

Duffie ends: "Legal Aid is still available for mediation too – a cheaper and quicker way of resolving family issues than heading straight off to court. People who want to know more should call 01642 222967 or visit our website www.familiestalking.co.uk"

It follows the results of a survey carried out by the Bureau of Investigative Journalism, The Independent on Sunday and the Magistrates' Association, using a sample group of 461 magistrates sitting in a variety of courts across the UK. Nearly two thirds of magistrates think 'litigants in person' have a negative impact on the court's work.



MIDDRIDGE COUNCIL ARE JUST AFTER THE MONEY!

The latest letter from Middridge finally bares the truth, namely that to Middridge Council this is all about money. Council Tax as well as Community Infrastructure levy (CIL).

In 2011 the submissions from Middridge to the County Middridge to the Council on future housing provision theywere all opposed to any houses being built on Eldon Whins. Yet now Middridge Council is getting all upset, not because housing has been approved for that site for the future, but because Great Aycliffe Town Council dare to request that an area of future housing that will form a natural part of Newton Aycliffe should come under the Town Boundary.

The consequence of the houses (and at least 342 are envisaged by the County Council) are that if they remain in Middridge Parish boundary they get the Council Tax and CIL money from it. People in Eldon Whins will be geographically part of Newton Aycliffe, use Newton Aycliffe's facilities and services yet contribute nothing to Newton Aycliffe.

I totally support our Town Council in having the ort our having the changed, Boundary people will be part of Newton Aycliffe in every respect, and should pay their share just like everyone else in Great Aycliffe. Indeed by being within our boundary the

additional houses will expand the tax base on which Council Tax is calculated thus reducing everyone's council tax.

If it remains in Middridge's boundary, Eldon Whins residents will outnumber and out vote any Middridge Village attempt to stop further development. It's council will be out voted indeed elected decided by the majority in Eldon Whins on everything, out voting the original Village residents by at least 2 to 1.

The really stupid suggestion that we should wait several years for the houses to be built. then ask the residents which parish they wish to belong to. is the same as 'do turkeys vote for Christmas'.

If we wait for the houses to be built why would any resident choose to pay a higher Council Tax to Great Aycliffe Town Council, when they could simply choose to pay the lower tax to Middridge Council but still use everything in Newton Aycliffe without the cost that everyone else in Great Aycliffe Shares. This is what happened with the Chestnuts area of school Aycliffe. Our Town Council is absolutely right. Great Avcliffe Town Council have done the sensible and proper thing by asking Middridge Council to mutually agree the change hence it would have removed the need for a Community Governance review. 



Students Join in Remembering WW1

County Council Chairman Cllr John Robinson is to lead pupils from County Durham, France and Germany in an act of remembrance for WW1 veterans on June 30 3.45pm at County Hall.

The project also allows the young people to put their language skills good use and gives a strong purpose for effective communication "
