I waited until a Bay became vacant and then parked. I then noted the next five Bays adjacent to mine were occupied by five vehicles with no disabled badges displayed.

They were mainly top of the range new models including a Mercedes, obviously using the wider bays to avoid being damaged.

I pointed out that Tesco is a National organisation and their parking policy spreads across the U.K and was therefore applicable to all disabled using Tesco.




