Town School Delighted with Ofsted Rating



Pupils, parents, staff and governors at Woodham Burn are absolutely delighted with the outcome of the recent Ofsted Inspection which took place on the last two days before the summer half term. Woodham Burn is now officially a 'good' school, with all children making good progress from their initial starting points. By Y6 children are all at least in line with, or even above national standards, and this picture is improving with many children achieving far in excess of what was originally expected. The teaching of reading is noted in KS1 and children are said to do particularly well in the early years foundation stage where 'excellent opportunities for learning' lead to rapid

all teaching observed during the inspection, not even one lesson fell short of the criteria 'good' judgement and some teaching observed was



'Pupils' behaviour is also and their positive attitudes to learning contribute to the good progress being made in all areas of the school. The good work of leaders and governors was recognised in mproving the school since the last inspection and the high expectations and aspirations along with the caring, supportive ethos was praised. Head teacher Mrs Riannon Rowe and chair of governors Jason Steward acknowledge the very hard work which has gone into achieving these very good outcomes. Mrs Rowe stated that 'Since the Ofsted framework changed about two years ago the requirements of inspection have become all the more rigorous with nothing but 'good' being good enough. At Woodham Burn standards have been raised across the board and we are delighted that we have been able to work with all stakeholders at this school as well as our very supportive Local Authority to

The school now intends to follow Ofsted's advice to widen

the curriculum to provide even more opportunities for children to broaden their basic understanding and utilise their key skills in a range of contexts. The coming academic year will be a busy time for Woodham Burn. A new curriculum is to be introduced and this will incorporate lots of exciting opportunities for all children. The school aims to offer even more outings and 'hands-on' experiences; it will supplement the formal curriculum with more out of school clubs and opportunities. New developments are also planned relating to expanding our early years provision to include children of nursery age in the near future.

The school will celebrate this very successful report with a whole school trip at the close of the summer term. Invitation to Enter One of Eleven Categories

The judging panel will consist of the ABPC Steering Group, although members will not judge categories which either include their own company or firms associated with them. Guests will gather for a threecourse evening meal and celebration at the Xcel Centre on Thursday 18th September, which will start with a drinks reception and complimentary

A high-profile speaker will entertain before the winners are revealed, while a fully licensed bar will provide refreshments.

The glittering event will be sponsored to ensure it's affordable for all businesses. but any profits made will be donated to a local charity.

Rachel Townsend Green, a member of the Steering Group, said: "We want to add to the sense of community that we've already created on the park, as well as raise awareness of the businesses on the park. There are still a lot of businesses that we don't yet know about, some of which will have achieved great things over the last year or two



In line with the practice of most North East Councils they are not able to provide catch-ups as this relies on voluntary overtime, which given these circumstances of industrial action, the council would find extremely difficult to resource. They are however making some arrangements for the most vulnerable residents with clinical/medical needs.

Whilst Household Waste Recycling Centres will be open and can take excess materials, the council has confirmed they will also be taking bagged side waste of the appropriate waste type when the next collection is scheduled.

For recycling these should be in clear bags, otherwise the contents will be presumed be refuse. They hope that by taking this approach any additional waste can be cleared quickly and the service returned to normal. If you have any specific issues, the streetscene number is 03000 26 1000.





The Senior Citizens' Excursions are one of the most popular events provided by the Council. Each year, we organise a series of free excursions for the senior citizens (60 years or over) who live in our Parish.

The picture shows residents having lunch at the Coniston Hotel, Skipton.

The coaches provided are 49-53 seater executive coaches with toilet facilities. There is also a 53 seater executive coach with a wheelchair hoist to each destination. This ensures that even people with severe mobility problems can still enjoy a day out. The hoist

can be used for loading wheelchairs for those residents who need to travel in their wheelchair, or for use by people who cannot manage the steps on the coach.

The application forms and information booklets are available in April or May each year from the Council Offices, Golf and Sports Complexes, Recreation Centre (Beveridge Way) and the Library in the Town Centre.

This year, residents had the choice of visiting Whitby, Northumberland, Skipton, Scarborough, or South Shields for the day with a three course meal and tea or coffee provided in a good quality hotel with disabled facilities. Most of the excursions make a comfort break stop en route to the destination and also on the homeward journey. On one of those comfort breaks, the Council pays for morning or afternoon refreshments. The Skipton and South Shields excursions made no stops either way.

Each person who qualifies is entitled to one 'trip'. To qualify you must be aged 60 or over and must have lived in the electoral parish by 1st April in the year of travel. This year, there were 1337 applications.

MEDIUM TERM FINANCIAL PLAN

- Council Facing a Difficult Future

The Council has recently approved its latest Medium Term Financial Plan which sets out the Council's financial strategy for the five year period 2014/15 to 2018/19. The Plan highlights the various financial challenges facing the Council over this period and aims to put in place a financial strategy to address those challenges.

Of greatest concern for future years, is that the Council is now reliant upon Council Tax Support Grant funding paid by the Government via Durham County Council and which amounts to 20% of the Council's Revenue Budget. It has already been confirmed that this funding will be cut in each year of the Plan and there is always a risk that this funding could be withdrawn in its entirety.

The Council is also facing a number of other budget pressures including inflation, pay awards, other unavoidable budget pressures such as pension and national insurance changes, as well as a likely limit on the amount by which the Council will be able to increase the Council Tax, in future years.

The Plan has been prepared on the key principle of aiming to maintain existing levels of service and staffing structures, wherever possible, while keeping the increase in council tax to the current Government limit of 2% or less.

The Plan concluded that while the Council is currently in a strong financial position with a balanced budget and strong levels of balances and reserves, this position is likely to deteriorate over the life of the Plan making the process of achieving a balanced Revenue Budget increasingly difficult.

By the end of the five years, it is likely that the Council will be in a position where there is no contingency sum or contribution to capital reserves in the Revenue Budget and where there is no further scope for efficiency savings to be delivered. Therefore, whilst it is likely that services will be able to be maintained until the end of the 2018/19 financial year, assuming that the Council makes a 2% increase in the Town Council Tax each year, beyond this the Council is likely to need to begin the difficult process of considering reductions in services and reassessing its priorities in light of the limited resources available.

Additionally, if in any year, the Government limit on council tax increases is reduced from 2%, or worse that the Council Tax Support Grant is withdrawn, service cuts would be required earlier than this.

These issues will be considered in detail via future budget setting processes when options for delivering any required budget reductions and savings, if these are required, will be drawn up and agreed.

The Council will also continue the process of undertaking service reviews and undertake a reassessment and update of the Council's strategic aims and community priorities with a view to determining which services are to be protected and which services may be subject to budget reductions in the longer term.

Rev'd Chris Pearson, the Rector, (shown in the photo) said "It is great to see scaffolding go up and work start in earnest. A lot




