LETTER SHOCKS VOLUNTEER GROUP

I have to report my shock and dismay upon receiving a letter from Great Aycliffe Town Council on 13th August demanding, under the advice of our environment officer, we immediately desist and refrain from continuing the cleaning of our Boating Lakes. Seemingly we are depleting stocks of weeds! Volunteers have worked extremely hard over the last few months removing stinking algae, pond weed and sludge from the Boating Lakes, believing we were rejuvenating the lakes and the whole area under the authority and guidance of our town council officers for the benefit of the public of

The rubbish we removed the Boating Lake included mobile phones, golf clubs, push along scooters, articles of clothing, beer and vodka bottles, cider and soft drinks cans, bricks and pieces of metal such as electrical conduit, old pipes and a sign; which had at sometime been erected by

Newton Aycliffe.

our killjoy council saying "No Paddling".

Of course when children were paddling the water was clear and you could see the bottom of the lake. It should be a matter of some embarrassment for our council that the lakes have been allowed to fall into such a state of disrepair as they have not made any serious attempt over many years to remedy the situation or indeed have failed

I remain convinced that should the people of Newton Aycliffe have been informed the intention of the council to change the use of our lakes to a loosely defined pond with all the smell and ugly weed incurred they

(the public) would have complained bitterly.

Could someone tell me when this change of use took place and was it within the council chamber or in a more secluded secret Labour Party meeting? Minutes of this would not, presumably, be released to the public for fear of condemnation.

Just what is so unique about this stretch of water that is not present in any of the other numerous ponds scattered about our lovely town? Why has the water control system been allowed to choke up and fall into a poor state of repair?

Why was the boathouse allowed to be destroyed when all it needed was a few pounds spending on a wooden roof? I would suggest that if the boat house had been for the use of the golf course or the Oak Leaf Centre it would have been repaired under general maintenance.

Members of the public and the Friends group ARE interested in restoring the lakes to their former glory with families and model boat enthusiasts being able to use the lakes again. Also leisure boats being used by happy children; whilst still encouraging Swans, Ducks and, yes, Sticklebacks which

we all love. The very location of this lovely park on the verges of our estates and within easy reach of our town centre must be used for the good of the many and not just our environmentally, fascist ruling council elite.

I would like to send a strong message to those who would ride roughshod over public opinion by inviting members of the public to join our facebook page or come along to our meetings on the second Tuesday of each month, at 7pm, at the Royal British Legion.

Alternatively please register your complaint with your local Councillor or Great Aycliffe Town Council on 300700 and ask to speak to an officer of the council.

For your benefit, and as is your right, you may wish to contact the Deputy Leader of the Council John Clare on 318333 or Councillor Brian Hall Chairman of the Recreation Committee on 314105. I do however urge people to be respectful when telephoning and please don't ring after 9pm.

On a slightly different note the members of Friends of West Park listen politely to guest speakers, but many were upset and annoyed to be lectured and hectored by our August guest the Deputy Leader of the town council who appeared to talk down to members at the last meeting: unfortunately many people in the audience found his talk to be rude and offensive and for that I apologise. However, I believe in free speech and although I disagree with his point of view, I rigorously respect his right to speak. Ken Robson, Chairman

These volunteers have through sheer hardwork in their own time, unpaid and at their own expense cleared 90% of the top lake and part of the bottom lake. They have done a phenomenal free public service which nearly every resident acknowledges and appreciates.

West Park is not, I repeat not an environmental eco park for wildlife. It is a Public Park, a human recreational amenity, in open urban area between two sets of housing and is there solely for use and enjoyment of the public, families, children, residents and visitors alike.
The fact that Ducks, Swans

and Geese frequent the lakes for many years is an added and welcome addition but the weed and algae removal has not, and does not stop aquatic wildfowl from frequenting the lakes. After months of hard work by the Friends of West Park group, volunteering up to 3 days a week to clean the lakes at West Park of unsightly weed, algae and rubbish, we received a letter from Great Aycliffe Town Council instructing us to cease with immediate effect. Removing the weed they believe leaves the lakes critically low and will have an effect on the "eco-system", but state that there is no objection to the removal of rubbish.

Councillor responsible for this letter and he knows who he is; a single minded individual with one narrow, unbending opinion of what they want "OUR" lakes to be... and when I say "OUR" lakes I mean every resident of Newton Aycliffe. The Friends of West Park group wants to see this returned to its former glory and ensuring that the Swans, Ducks & Geese are tended for as they are an integral part of the park and will remain so for many years to come.

The Swans and Ducks are enjoying the clearer water and this is evident by the fact they now tend to avoid the filthy weed and algae filled parts that we have not yet gotten round to clean.

In the letter it states that

we can still remove the rubbish....this is obviously prompted by someone who has absolutely no idea what it is like to walk around in the lakes. It is an impossibility to filter the rubbish from the matted weed, the weed comes out with the rubbish. We have tried to keep the weed separate so that it

He has not responded to me and I wonder if he thinks that the rights of disabled persons are not important or if he ignores me he can protect his colleague.

The vehicle should be taken off the culprit and parked securely in a council depot and Durham Council do like other councils and repair street lighting through the

The driver should also be fined the same as the public unless on the other hand the bay is not legally for the disabled and improperly marked. Those that marked the bay should pay back the costs wasted from our council tax and I find it sad that my money, along with others is paying for this abuse by the Authority empowered to enforce the law. Reply from County Hall

Dear Mr Ewart,

Thank you for letting us know of your concerns. Your letter has been passed to me for investigation and response. I would like to assure you we have looked into this matter thoroughly and that we do not tolerate vehicles being council parked in breach of parking regulations.

My investigation found that on this occasion this vehicle was parked partially in the disabled bay for a few minutes whilst the driver changed over vehicles. While this bay is

only advisory the county council's policy is for our drivers to respect advisory markings at all times and all drivers will be reminded of this.

A number of these advisory bays were introduced under the former district council and while they are not therefore open to parking enforcement, they should be left available at all times for disabled badge holders.

We apologise for this incident.





UPROAR OVER WEST PARK LAKES FUTURE

The Friends of West Park have spent many weeks cleaning the lakes of stinking algae for the benefit of the public and the environment.
They were making great progress and had the support of the Town Council who deployed staff to remove the mess retrieved from the water bottom and surface.

However based on recommendation from the Council Environment Officer the group have been asked to stop work as they are apparently stopping the reproduction of insects and other wildlife.

The question to be asked is what is the purpose of the lake? Is it for pleasure and recreation or to sustain wildlife? The lakes are manmade and were provided for boating, paddling etc and as a pleasant feature in a public

park.
It doesn't seem logical to provide a public park which also encourages insects like midgies bothering It is counter productive to

have a nature pond in the same location as an amenity enjoyed by the general public. The town has other locations for nature study and the protection of wildlife, and these are found at the Angling Pond, the Nature Park near the Blue Bridge and a new pond at Cobblers Hall.

There is a public outcry in support of the Friends of West Park who have worked extremely hard to return the lakes to their former glory. There is also great resentment for the letter sent by the Town Clerk

It appears it was sent without authorisation from a meeting of the Council and there is fierce opposition to the Environment Officer's stance on this issue and we can expect a lively meeting of the council when it is discussed in September.






