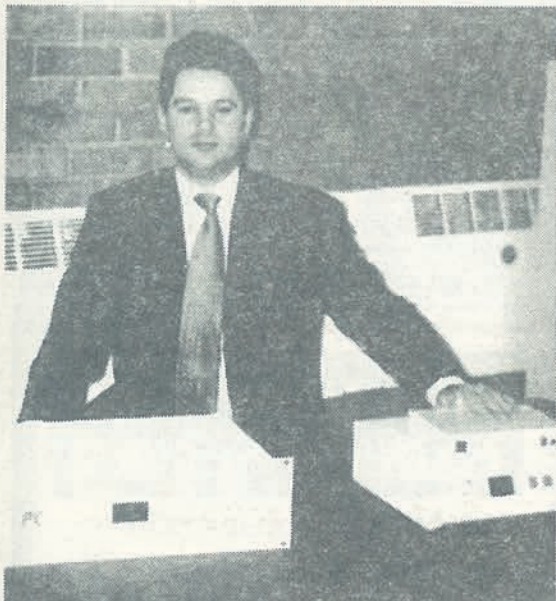

## Beware When Moving House

Dear Sir,  
In August last year, I moved to my present address in Woodham Village. I used local removal firm W.H. Williams Transport. As you may have read in recent editions of The Sunday Post and The Journal, over £3,000-worth of my possessions went missing during the move. Other families using the same firm also claim to have lost some, or all, of their possessions - people who moved in September, October and December of last year. A number of similar allegations are coming to light from the past. Even though the matter has been pursued through lawyers and the police, few have got anything back. Readers need to take care when employing a removal firm. I advise the following:

1. Use a firm which is a member of the British Association of Removers.
2. Make sure that your goods are insured during the move (most household insurance policies exclude possessions in storage). INSIST that you are given a copy of the insurance document.
3. IF you have to put your furniture in storage, INSIST on visiting the firm's storage facilities. Such a firm WILL cost more, but if I had followed this advice I would have avoided a great deal of loss and heartbreak. Pass the word: 'TAKE CARE WHEN REMOVING!'

## Somerfield Launch Scratchcard for Local Charities



Durham will be one of many areas to benefit when high street supermarket chain Somerfield launches a major charity initiative which will channel millions of pounds into local communities across the country. Launched on Tuesday 25 February, the Somerfield Community Charity will be funded through the sale of in-store scratch cards with Somerfield donating all its profits to boost the funds for local causes. Unlike the National Lottery, the Somerfield scheme also lets the public choose where the money goes. This means that customers front each of Somerfield's 450 participating stores will be able to nominate their favourite local causes. This could involve an individual, a local school or organisation, a sporting group

or local charity - it is up to the community to choose. The new charity hopes to donate £1 million in the first year alone and intends to become a major source of funding for local community projects with Somerfield guaranteeing more than 28 per cent of takings from the scratch cards to the charity in the first year. Although scratch cards will be the primary fund-raising mechanism, Somerfield hopes to swell the coffers through other in-store promotions. Donations from the charity will be made on a quarterly basis to a local good cause with the potential for four different causes per location being supported each year. Customers are now being urged to visit their local Somerfield store and vote for a good cause or charity which will receive the first donation due in July.

The scratch card scheme is being managed by Littlewoods Lotteries Ltd, the largest UK charity scratch card operators. Top prizes will range from £1,000 to £50,000 with thousands of smaller prizes ranging from £5 to £100.

The launch of the scheme is a further development of Somerfield's ongoing policy of supporting the community. For the past two years, the company has run a staff lottery which donated £100,000 to charity. Somerfield is also actively involved with the Institute of Grocery Distributors' Provision charity which gives food to local homeless people.

## Prayer Day

The "Women's World Day of Prayer" is on Friday 7th March, and to mark this event there will be a service at St Mary's Church at 7.00pm. All the churches in the Great Aycliffe area will be taking part and all ladies are invited to come along and share in this international service, which this year was prepared by the Christian women of Korea, the theme being "Like a seed which grows into a tree". The speaker will be the Revd Michelle Ferguson, curate in the Great Aycliffe Team Ministry. After the service everyone is invited to stay for light refreshments, which will be served in the school hall adjacent to the church.

## Woodham Appeal Ignored

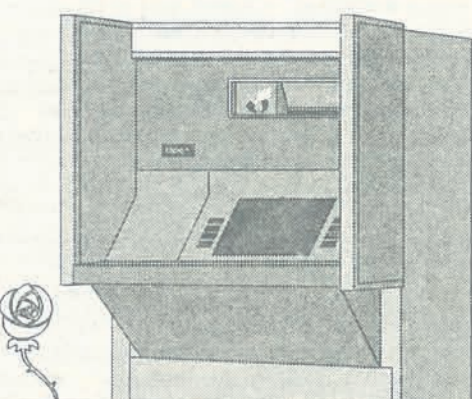

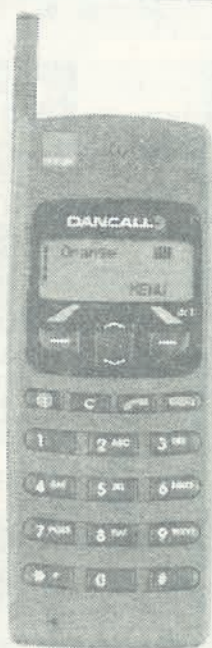

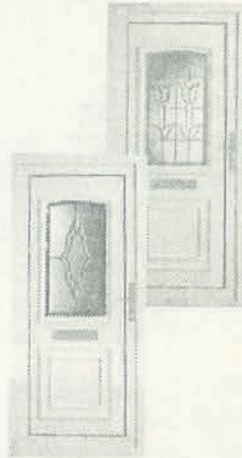

# BENEFIT FRAUD TIP-OFFS

Benefits Agency Investigators in Darlington received 740 tip-offs from local people during the 2 week Spotlight campaign. This is more than double what is normally received.

The campaign officially ends today, but the overwhelming response from the public means that investigations will be on-going for the next month. Some of the cases that fraud staff have already uncovered include:-

- Investigators visiting Catterick Racecourse Market are making further enquiries of 15 people claiming benefit from a wide geographical area as far a field as Leeds and Nottingham.

- A team of investigators took to the streets of Darlington looking for people at work - window cleaners, bricklayers, jobbing builders, joiners, double glazing installers, roof repairers - more than 200 people seen at work were interviewed with 22 cases of falsely claimed benefits uncovered.

- 5 people were found to be working and claiming unemployed benefits at a Darlington cleaning company, with a further 3 cases still under investigation as workers have been found to be using false names.

- A woman recently prosecuted for falsely claiming while working has been found to be working for a new company under a false name. Margaret Kirby from the Benefits Agency says, "It will be several weeks before the full results of this 'Spotlight' campaign will be known. The first campaign during August last year saved tax-payers £1.7 million and results of this campaign may be on a similar scale".
