# **BIG INVESTMENT** IN COUNTY HEALTH SERVICE

County Durham Health Authority will be investing an additional £5.6 million in health services for the people of County Durham for 1997/98.

In total over £400 million will be spent on health services during the 1997/ 98 financial year including £77 million by County Durham's 49 GP fundholding practices.

Additional investments will include:

\* An extra £2 million for resettling patients with mental health problems with learning difficulties.

An extra £770,000 on developing primary, community and continuing care, this includes additional funding for district nurses, health visitors, community psychiatric nurses, speech therapists, community recruitment scheme for DE new general practitioners known as "Career Start".

\* An additional £500,000 towards practice staffing in pact and easy to use GP surgeries.

\* An extra £740,000 for hospital care making a total of £230 million for hospitals and community services over the year. This includes £300,000 for the development of cancer services

A further £820,000 for the redeveloped Bishop General Auckland Hospital, making a total of nearly £2.3 million reserved for the new million hospital.

\* An initial £620,000 for the redeveloped Dryburn Hospital.

The Health Authority is also making an additional £755,000 available for continuing care, adult intensive/high dependency care and mental health services.

Andrew Young, acting chief executive of County Durham Health Authority said "we are extremely pleased to announce further investment in health services for people living in the County. The increases reflect local health needs and contribute towards our aim of improving the health of the population."

"We will be spending over £1 million a day on health services for people resident in the County, almost £13 a week for every mean, woman and child. Making

decisions about purchasing health services is not easy, however we will be ensuring that the money is well spent and that the health services available are of the best possible quality".

# **ORGANIC MEAT AVAILABLE IN** SUPERMARKETS

County supermarkets could soon be displaying a range of organic beef, lamb, pork, chicken and even organic sausages and bacon - as well as the already prominently displayed organic fruit and vegetables.

Local Euro MP Stephen Highes voted with the European Parliament this week to agree a new Euro labelling for organic meat. Mr Hughes, Euro MP for Durham and Blaydon explained "Today's supermarket displays of organic fruit and vegetables result from the EU agreeing a Euro-wide definition for organic plants. This enables organically grown fruit and vegetables from all over Europe to be sold in British and continental supermarkets.

Now the European Parliament has agreed a definition of organic meat. So County Durham shoppers can expect to see bigger and better displays of organic chicken, lamb, pork and beef and perhaps even organic sausages, bacon and meat pies in supermarkets."

# Beware of Lonely Hearts Ads

Dear Sir,

I write in the hope of highlighting a practice some unwary single/lone mothers use in their efforts to find a partner, which could and has put some children at risk.

The act of putting ads in "lonely hearts" columns is something I would not normally condemn, except when mothers state they are looking for a person who loves children.

I understand that not all who use these columns are suspect and many genuine people have found happiness, but a great many have also found heartache not only for themselves but for their children.

The stark reality is that paedophiles use columns such as these to search for new prey,

first by gaining the trust of the unsuspecting mother then moving on to abuse the child. I am aware that "Newton News" does not have a lonely hearts column, but our daily paper does and frequently carries adverts from mothers which state they have children. I have worked with children and young adults for many years, some of whom, have been abused, and it saddens me to see an advertisement carrying the innocent statement "MUST LOVE CHILDREN" knowing it can result in such dire consequences.

The increase in child abuse and the Authority's inability to stop it, prompts me to write this letter, and should it help to make one person aware of the possible dangers, it will have been well worth the effort. P. F. Harrison

# ARE YOU CLAIMING ALL YOUR BENEFITS?

For people on Income Support or Job Seekers Allowance there is help from the Benefit Department known as the

The Regulated Social Fund deals with such legally entitled grants as: Maternity Payments, Funeral Expenses and Cold Weather Payments.

The Discretionary Social Fund deals with three distinct areas of help: Community Care Grant; Budgeting Loans and Crisis Loans.

Community Care Grants - These are non repayable grants made to people leaving institutions to live in the community or to prevent people being institutionalised. To help families cope in exceptional circumstances; to help buy articles of clothing or household items, ie: cookers, fridges etc. If there is a definite risk to health and well being, physically or emotionally, these grants are made at the discretion of the Benefits Agency

Budgeting Loans - The loans are only available to people in receipt of Income Support or Job Seekers Allowance for at least 26 weeks. These loans are repayable through benefit deduction set at an amount that the claimant is able to pay repayable to a maximum period of 78 weeks.

Crisis Loans - These are loans that can be paid to meet short term needs due to an emergency, ie: fire, flood or burglary, it is not necessary to be in receipt of Income Support or Job Seekers Allowance, but the claimant must have no savings and there must be a serious risk to health and well being. The maximum loan is £1000.


