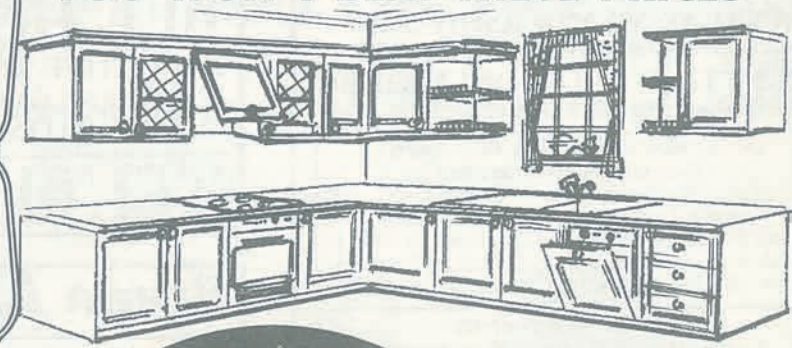

The town's youngsters, led by team coach Neil Robinson and supported by an army of parents and friends, did Newton Aycliffe proud by performing heroics before eventually being beaten in the semi-finals. The lads came through a tough league stage unbeaten with 2 wins and 3 draws with the highlight being a thrilling creditable 2-2 draw against Young Owls, Sheffield Wednesday Centre of Excellence youngsters. In the quarterfinals, Aycliffe dominated their opponents, Rushden Rangers from Northants with a 2-0 win with goals from Liam Cooper and John Johnston.

With the heat taking its toll after 6 games in the 'Majorca' like conditions, the whole team played their hearts out and were desperately unlucky not to send the game into a penalty shoot-out when the opposition scored after a dubious free-kick in the very last minute of the game. Matthew Dodds took the Man-of-the-Tournament award for his never-say-die attitude and Newton Aycliffe should be proud of their youngsters for doing so well in this their first attempt in such a prestigious tournament.

New Summer Walks

A record 90 walks covering about 500 miles from the high Pennines to urban streets make up a new summer guided walks programme in County Durham. Arranged by Durham County Council, the walks, which start in June and go through to the end of August, have, for the first time, been classified according to their difficulty.

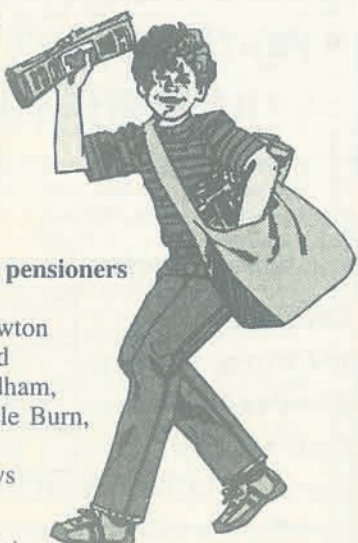

Huntsmen Move from Doom to Boom

STUART HODGSON has worked wonders for Huntsman Football Club, taking them from almost doom to BOOM in his two year reign, writes Martin Walker.

He joined the Club when they were the Sports Complex - and when they moved to the Huntsman, he was appointed Team Manager.

It wasn't long before he won the new title of Director of Football, but that didn't win games, as you can read on.....

'The History of Hodgson, at the Huntsman' - Aug. '95: Hodgson is appointed Director of Football at Huntsman, but begins managerial career with poor league results. Nov. '95: rumours that he would be axed were rife following another string of poor results, but wins a vote of confidence from the committee. May '96: Finishes his first season as boss in a mid-table position.

On reflection, Stuart said: "that year was excellent, despite our poor league position and a clear lack of silverware - the team spirit and crack was top notch." Jun. '96: Lays down plans and a new structure for the 1996-97 season before a mid-season committee meeting - resulting in another vote of confidence.

Jul. '96: Brings four new players to the Huntsman - and introduces new training sessions that he promises will bring success to the Club. Oct. '96: Starts new season with a nine match unbeaten run, steering Huntsman to the top of the league. 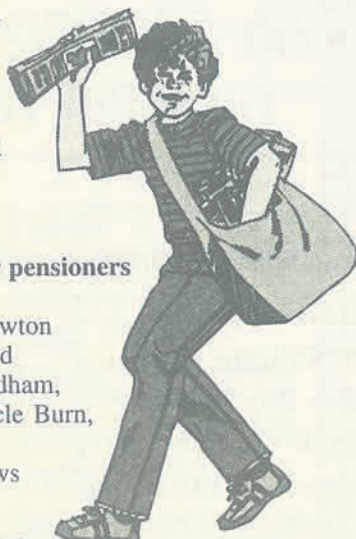

Huntsmen Move from Doom to Boom

STUART HODGSON has worked wonders for Huntsman Football Club, taking them from almost doom to BOOM in his two year reign, writes Martin Walker.

He joined the Club when they were the Sports Complex - and when they moved to the Huntsman, he was appointed Team Manager. It wasn't long before he won the new title of Director of Football, but that didn't win games, as you can read on.....

'The History of Hodgson, at the Huntsman' - Aug. '95: Hodgson is appointed Director of Football at Huntsman, but begins managerial career with poor league results. Nov. '95: rumours that he would be axed were rife following another string of poor results, but wins a vote of confidence from the committee. May '96: Finishes his first season as boss in a mid-table position. On reflection, Stuart said: "that year was excellent, despite our poor league position and a clear lack of silverware - the team spirit and crack was top notch."

Jun. '96: Lays down plans and a new structure for the 1996-97 season before a mid-season committee meeting - resulting in another vote of confidence. Jul. '96: Brings four new players to the Huntsman - and introduces new training sessions that he promises will bring success to the Club. Oct. '96: Starts new season with a nine match unbeaten run, steering Huntsman to the top of the league. He then swoops for former player Rob Lothian, and was forced to offer Lothian a multi-toasted deal to get his signature. The gaffer said: "When we were at the top of the league, every game was a pressure for both myself and the lads. You keep wondering when you're going to slip and it's like waiting for the earth to end".

Dec. '96: Hodgson denies reports linking him with moves to Nottingham Forest, Man City and Quaker Sports, and then pledges his future to the Club by singing a new four-year contract. Jan. '97: Turns down the Newcastle job, amid speculation that he was seen playing golf with Sir John Hall. Feb. '97: A bad pitch ends any hopes of championship glory. Dave Lee is appointed Assistant Manager, allegedly being groomed for the top job in the summer. "Nearer the end of the season when there was no chance of winning the League, we just played for pride and concentrated on the cup" said Stuart. "That's when you can sit back a little and just enjoy the crack".

April '97: Hodgson announces his intention to resign at the end of the season - but then he takes Huntsman to their first major cup final after five years, beating DCS in the semi's of the ASE Cup. May '97: Hodgson resigns as the best Manager in the Club's history. A modest 5th in the League with the ASE Cup Trophy in the Cabinet. He was probably the first ever Director of Football in Sunday Morning Pub Football - but he leaves Huntsman a highly respected manager. Hodgson is now Huntsman's Technical Director of Football. Last year's Assistant Dave Lee has been appointed the new Director of Football, who will take care of affairs back home. Lee will have the players back in training in about six weeks - preparing Huntsman FC for the 1997-98 championship assault.

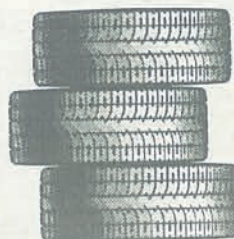
