Some are drivers, other motorists, pedestrians or cyclists. Their one major failing - aside from being an endangered species - is that THEY CAN'T BE SEEN.

That means they are putting YOU and THEMSELVES at risk. But Dimwits can become BRIGHT SPARKS

All they have got to do is follow a few simple rules. Read on Who knows if your a dimwit, you could become a brightspark and save someone's life.

DRIVERS - Be alert to other road users; people in a rush, kids, elderly shopper. Think once, think twice, think bike! Remember, they may not see you, day or night. Lights are important, use them at night or in poor visibility. Then you can see and be seen.

PEDESTRIANS - Be seen. Don't walk into danger. Fluorescent for daytime - Reflective at night, old or young, it lets others know you are there. At a pinch, wear or carry something white., be bright, it makes sense.

Police Station CYCLISTS - Don't be an accident victim, be wise, survive ... At roundabouts and road junctions be safe, be seen. Kit you and your bike out properly!" Get something fluorescent for daytime wear, reflective for night. Consider spoke reflectors, reflective pedals, tyres and spacers for your bike. And prepare for the road, check and clean front and rear lights and reflectors before setting off.

LATCHKEY KIDS

Who are the Latchkey Kids?

There are numerous children who let themselves in or out of empty houses and supervise themselves for an hour or more each day. Called "Latchkey Kids" because of the tell-tale key around their neck or in their pocket, they are usually children of a single parent home or a home in which both parents

How old should a child be?

Each case should be looked at individually. Each case should be judged on all surrounding information. In order to be left alone, a child should want to assume the responsibility, should not be afraid to stay alone, should be able to follow directions and should be able to solve problems independently. Factors such as the amount of time the child will be alone, how safe the neighbourhood is, the accessibility of a parent or other adult should all be taken into consideration.

How can a parent know is a child is ready to be left alone?

The simplest way is to ask the child is he or she wants to stay alone. Any signs of fearfulness or doubt about being left alone, turning on lights etc should be a warning signal that the child does not feel ready to be home alone

How long can a child be left alone?

The time should be kept to a minimum. Parents should come home as soon as they can and postpone errands until they can take the child with them

What should a parent do to make the Latchkey Kids experience work?

The experience should be a positive one, reinforcing the child's and anxiety. A carefully considered set of rules, emergency procedures and back up systems should be developed and discussed with the child so that he or she is aware of what is expected by the parent. The main issue for a parent in deciding if a child can function as a latchkey kid is whether he or she is capable of following agreed rules, completing homework and accomplishing chores.

Giving your child a key is not an ideal situation, but we do recognise that on occasions it may not be possible to avoid it. If you follow our simple guidelines and use common sense you can avoid putting your child at risk.

It gives access to some beautiful areas, and it connects to other walks, which have been developed by CAPS volunteers, and published in the Newton News. Also, it will be a continuous wildlife corridor which will enhance the ecosystem of the whole

As not everyone appreciates the environment, the Ranger will liaise with schools and voluntary organisations to educate and involve them.

The Plan will address every aspect of the Town Council's land. It is not enough to look at the state of West Park's lakes. We need to formulate a Plan for West Park as a whole - including not only management of the lakes but also biodiversity, better play areas, cultural features and its links to other areas:

Please don't expect overnight change. Town Council wants to move carefully and get this right. We will need to study our land for a year to develop the Management Plan. And we hope to stay within our existing budget.

But you should notice gradual differences. In some

Associates, a training consultancy group based in Aycliffe. The course began initially through a County Durham & Darlington TEC programme called Skills for Small Business.

He was presented with his NVQ by Dr. Philip Riseborough, national chief executive of the awarding body NEBS Management at a special ceremony on September 1 "Dr. Riseborough said "This is a tremendous achievement, the first such award in the country and one which Mr. Wadkins has worked very hard for. I am delighted for him."

The Owner-Manager qualification is a comparatively recent addition to the NVQ lists. Under RFI Associates guidance, Mike was led through a 12-month programme designed to increase business efficiency.

That included looking at key areas of his business: drawing up a company training plan devising a sales and marketing plan and, vitally a financial plan covering management accounting.

Mike said: "We went to RH Associates because we felt basically, that the business was under

"It's improved staff morale tremendously. Everyone seems to have a better idea of where we are going and what we are doing," Mike says.

And finally, Mike reckons it's even produced benefits for his customers: "They get a much sharper service and we have been able to hold prices down because of the other improvements we have made."

RH Associates is a Newton Ayeliffe-based Training Consultancy specialising in management skills. It also trains key company personnel to return to their own firms as training officersaiming to spread management and business skills as widely as possible by "training trainers". It is headed by Ruth Hardwick.

Alan Wadkins Ltd was set up in Darlington in 1962 by the father of present owner Mike Wadkins. It deals principally in hand and power tools for trade and industry, agricultural ironmongery, workwear supplies and protective clothing.
