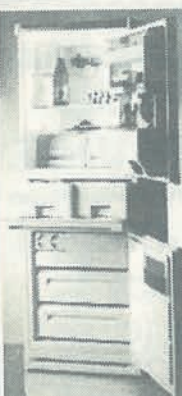

# Talk on Cragside

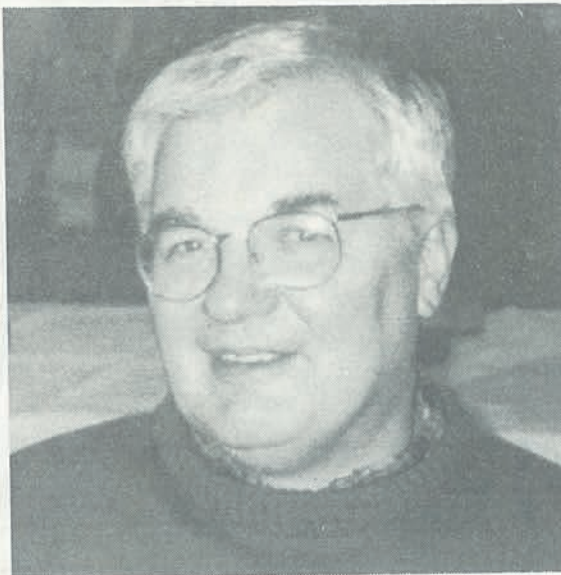

At that February meeting we heard people afraid that the value of their house might drop if the men moved near them. Others were frightened for their children's safety. Let me tell them they have more to fear from "normal" people and I only hope they never have children with handicaps or learning disabilities.  
I can only think the people of School Aycliffe must be more caring and understanding and I thank them for accepting these lovely men into their community.  
My one fond memory will be the time I saw two of the residents walking to the town, arm in arm, singing "Don't laugh at me cos I'm a fool".  
I wonder who really are the fools and I will certainly miss their smiling faces around our area. Horndale will not be the same!

# Shafto's Home Bought by Local Entrepreneur

Former Gretna Green Inn owners, Geoff and Christine Hamilton have gone into partnership with the Directors of JRW Builders to purchase Whitworth Hall at Spennymoor, once the home of "Bobby Shafto". 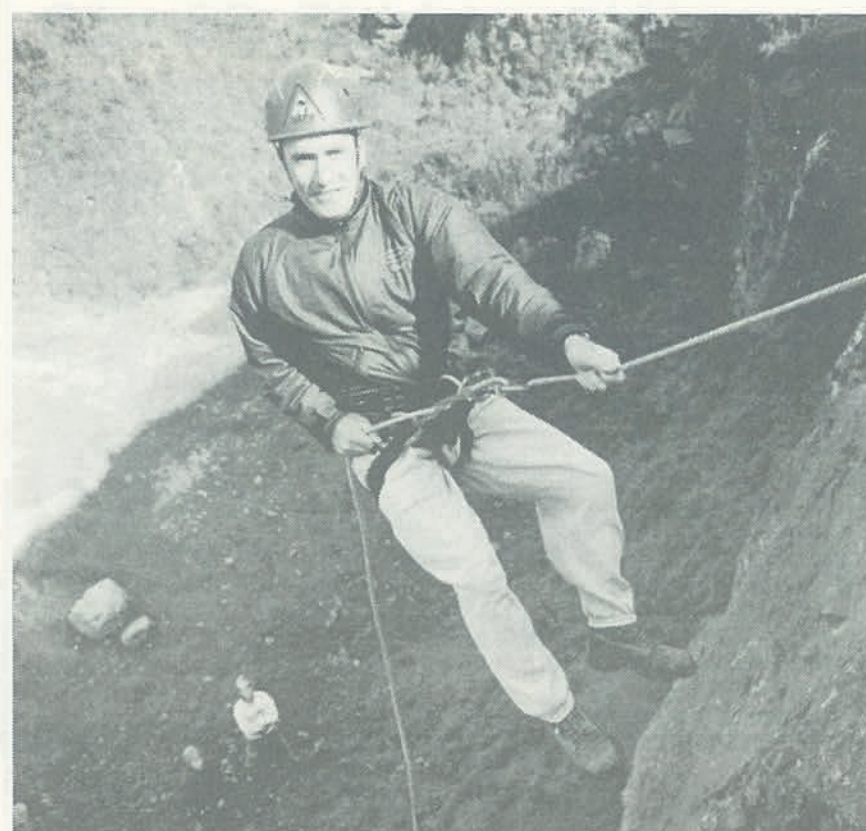

Organically-grown vegetables are tasty, healthy and good  
for the environment. Supermarket chains are starting to stock  
organic produce, but it may be cheaper to find a local organic  
grower, or 'grow your own'.

Organic growing relies on traditional methods, without using  
chemical fertilisers, pesticides or other artificial compounds.  
Most modern farmers use these compounds because they  
produce a bigger crop, even though they are potentially  
harmful to the environment.

Fertiliser run-off from fields can enter rivers and cause  
pollution, while pesticides kill-off many insects which birds  
and animals need as food.

Recently, there has been a severe fall in the number of  
skylarks and other insect-eating farmland birds.

Organic produce may be smaller, but it often has other  
benefits in addition to being better for the environment.  
Very often it is from a local source, so it is fresher, tastier,  
with higher levels of important vitamins.

Manure and compost are used to improve the soil and a  
wide diversity of plants, animals and birds are encouraged  
to deter pests and diseases.

The first step to becoming an organic gardener is to produce  
your own compost from garden and kitchen waste.

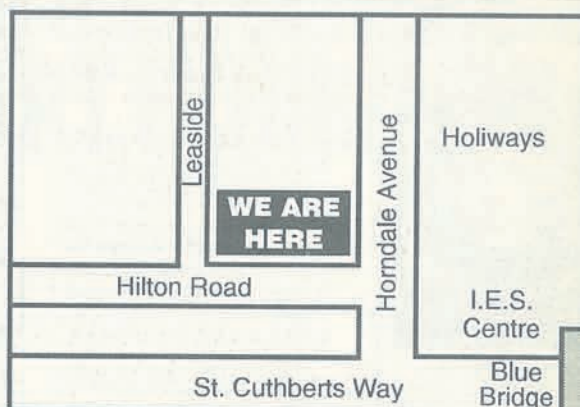

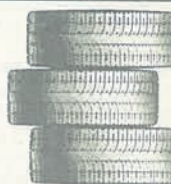
