Independent Inquiry Begins

County Durham Health Authority launched an independent inquiry this week into the NHS care received by a man living in the Sedgefield area. Adrian Jones pleaded guilty to the manslaughter of Douglas Heathwaite following an incident at a bus stop in Newton Aycliffe in June 1995. Both had received treatment for a number of complex mental health problems at Winterton Hospital.

The inquiry will look at issues including the Treatment, care and supervision; Assessment of risk to themselves and others; Adequacy of collaboration and communication

Retired Newcastle solicitor Arthur Taylor will chair the independent inquiry which also includes a consultant psychiatrist, a senior nurse and senior manager responsible for mental health services in a social services department.

The inquiry team will submit a report to County Durham Health Authority which will subsequently publish the main findings and recommendations made. Dr John Woodhouse, director of public health at County Durham Health Authority said: "It is crucial that we examine closely the type and the quality of treatment that both patients were receiving prior to this tragic incident to ensure that there are no more lessons to be learned."

Survey on Minimum Wage

Businesses in County Durham have made their support for the impending minimum wage legislation clear but have warned of a possible negative effect on the region's economy in a business survey commissioned by solicitors Blackett, Hart & Pratt.

Results showed that the majority of business people in County Durham were for the government's policy, but many felt that the effects on the local economy would be negative. A majority 62% of respondents were for the policy, and called for the minimum wage to be introduced at a level above £3.50.

The TUC's recommendation was agreed by only 9% of the businesses, while 18% would be more comfortable to see the implementation of the CBI's recommendation to increase the old Wages Council figures in line with inflation.

The range of figures suggested for the new minimum wage level varied from £2.00 to £4.50 and 72% of businesses went for figures at the higher end of the range, with a level of between £3.50 and £4.50 favoured by most.

Among the specific problems highlighted by local businesses would be higher wage bills and an increase in the cost of supplies. Over 24% of respondents said that the new policy could lead to job losses in their workforce.

One of the strongest messages to come out of the survey was the need for exemptions to be included in any legislation. 60% felt that workers undergoing training as part of their job should be excluded from the new minimum level, and over 56% felt there should be some exemption for

workers under 21 years old. Only 14% of respondents agreed with the government that the minimum wage would stimulate the local economy by increasing the level of money in people's pockets, while 47% felt it would be a negative influence. The remaining 39% said it would make no difference.

Blackett, Hart & Pratt are sending the results to Professor George Bain, Chairman of the Low Pay Commission, to put the view of the business community in County Durham. Business leaders throughout the area were consulted for their view on the level at which the minimum wage should be introduced.

Whilst the Government is committed to introducing a minimum wage within the lifetime of the current parliament, the debate over the level at which it should be set and the inclusion of any possible exemptions is far from over. Blackett, Hart and Pratt undertook the survey to bolster the voice of the local business community, and in particular small businesses, and intend to send these opinions to the Commission in London.

Charles McCain, Employment Law specialist with Blackett, Hart & Pratt, said "It is vital that the local business community, and small business in particular is not left out in this consultation process. The survey results show that business people in this area have strong opinions on the way things have been conducted so far. By sending our results to the Low Pay Commission, we are ensuring that the voice of business in County Durham and beyond is heard."

COUNTY COUNCIL'S 'LICENCE TO THRILL'

Durham County Council is to receive its national 'licence to thrill' for young people taking part in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award. The Award's operating authority's licence will be presented to the County Council on Thursday, January 29, by Andy Reade, regional officer for the Award.

The licence, which is renewed every three years, is granted only after the Award scheme is sure the operator can undertake certain responsibilities such as designating a specific Award Officer, authorising Award programmes and maintaining an approval system for instructors.

Councillor John Dormer, Chairman of the County Council's Community Education Panel, will receive the award on behalf of the Authority which has been operating the Duke of Edinburgh's Award since its inception in 1956.

In County Durham, there are 42 units operating the award including youth clubs, schools, colleges and universities which are supported by the Community Education Service.

Last year, 287 young people gained an Award and there are currently about 1,000 young people working through the Award in the County. The Local Education Authority has also been granted an Adventure Activities Licence covering hill walking, mountaineering and kayaking.

Following the canoe tragedy in Lyme Bay in 1993, the Activity Centres (Safety of Young Persons) Act 1995 was passed requiring mandatory licences for centres or people who offer leadership or training in a range of outdoor activities to anyone under 18.

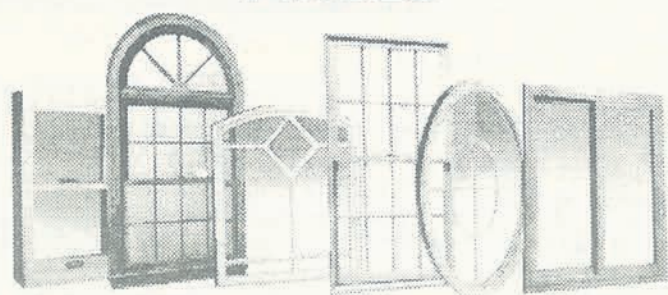

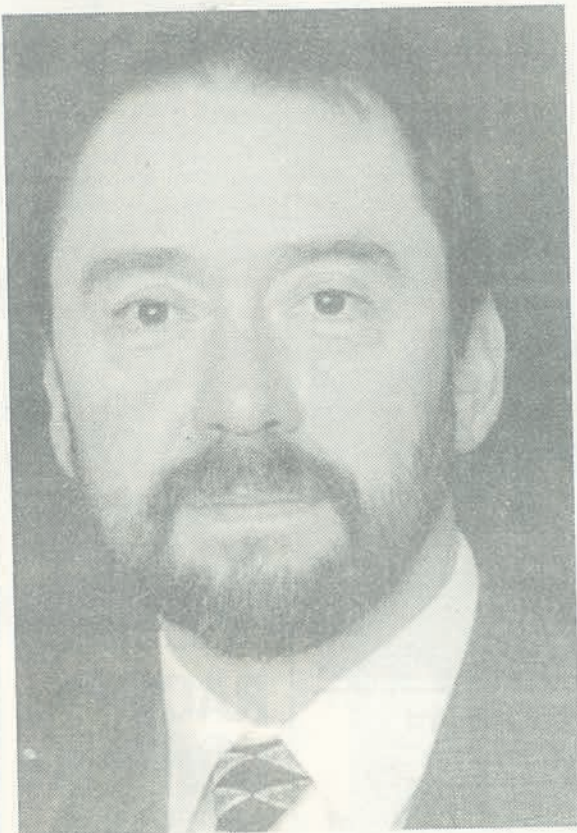

LOCAL INQUIRY ON AIRPORT EXPANSION

Moorfield Estates plc
("Moorfield") today
announces that John Prescott,
Secretary of State for the
Environment, has announced
his intention to hold a local
enquiry to determine planning
approval for the company's
proposed development at
Teesside Airport.

Moorfield has submitted plans
for the 1.8m sq ft first phase

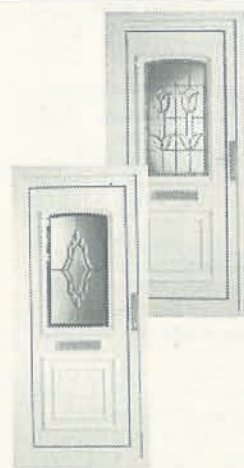

Schools Get Wastewise

Youngsters in County Durham are getting set to lead the race to wise up on waste.

A new partnership project - thought to be the first of its kind in the country - is to run in the County's schools to bring sustainable waste and resource management into school buildings, grounds and the curriculum.

Based at Chilton Primary School, the project is a partnership between Durham County Council, Groundwork East and West Durham, and the school, and is funded by County Durham Environmental Trust.

A schools wastewise education officer will be employed by Groundwork East Durham to develop resource efficiency and sustainable waste management schemes in schools.

The project will be an extension of the already successful School Grounds Project which helps to improve the design, use and management of school grounds as an educational resource.

Some of the key elements of the new wastewise project, which will cost £75,000 over two years, are:

- * practical composting and recycling programmes in schools
- * professional waste and energy audits
- * sustainability training for teachers and governors
- * litter awareness and control programmes
- * using waste materials for inside and outside arts and play equipment
- * visits to landfill sites, recycling centres and businesses with

exemplary waste management and minimisation practices

- * links between schools and local businesses
- * a locally relevant resource pack on waste and recycling for schools

It is also hoped to extend the network of local businesses already offering waste materials such as quarry stone, wood off-cuts, waste paint and packaging materials to schools.

Mike Tones, inspector for environmental education, said: "We believe this to be the first project of its kind in the country to involve children and the whole community in waste and energy management under the banner of Local Agenda 21.

"Children are great ambassadors for environmental education projects and quickly bring on board their families, friends and the rest of the community," he said.

The wastewise officer will work with schools, pupils, teachers and governors as well as the local community. They are the link to reduce the production of waste by schools, encourage recycling and sustainability, and they will also be the link to local industry whose waste can often be used in schools.

John Wearmouth, Chairman of County Durham Environmental Trust said: "We are delighted to be able to assist in this partnership. The project will ensure that children in the County understand sustainable waste management practices which, in the long term, can only be to the advantage of future generations."



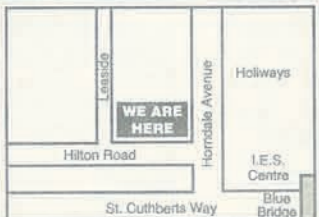
