IS ANYONE INTERESTED IN BEING A COUNCILLOR?

Dear Sir,

At the meeting of the Policy and Resources Meeting of Great Aycliffe Town Council the Committee had to decide on how we would replace Councillor Len Cockfield who recently resigned from the Town Council.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Len for the many years of commitment he gave to our town. Although he was of a different party to the controlling group, he never

failed to put his opinions forward.

This led to more balanced debates on many issues and although I often disagreed with Len's point of view I respected

him for his commitment and integrity.

Len will be replaced by co-option by the council. The co-option will take place because no one was prepared to call a bye election.

This is a pattern which is becoming prevalent. It is increasingly difficult to persuade people to stand for the Town Council. Aycliffe Town Council is made up of 30 elected members and the tendency is for many of the members to be elected unopposed or co-opted. The next elections for the Town Council will take place next year and it will be good for democracy if more residents of Newton Aycliffe and Aycliffe Village stand for election.

The columns in the "Newton News" are full of letters from people who have strong opinions as to how our local Council should be run. Next year is when they have the opportunity to show their commitment to the community of Great Aycliffe, by standing for election. Members of the Council will usually attend eight meetings a month and the majority of these meetings are held on an evening. Contrary to the myths which circulate from time to time, members will not receive any payment for attending these meetings or any expenses for travelling to the Council Offices.

Payment will be made for attendance at meetings outside of Newton Aycliffe. At the time of writing this letter the total expenditure for members expenses since April 1997 is less than £250.

I have been a town councillor for almost eleven years and I believe during this time I have attended almost two thousand

Middlesbrough F. C. on the Wembley Trail

The vast majority of Middlesbrough's 28,500 Red Book and season ticket holders have applied for tickets for the club's Coca-Cola Cup Final clash against Chelsea on Sunday 29th March.

Within the first week of the tickets going on sale, thousands of postal applications have flooded into the club's special PO Box and club staff are now busy processing the applications.

Every Red Book and season ticket holder is guaranteed a ticket for Wembley but no tickets will be sent out until March 10th at the earliest. Only is applicants have not received their tickets by Wednesday 18th March should they contact the club.

Boro have been allocated the tunnel end of Wembley stadium. All Boro Red Book and season ticket holders are guaranteed a ticket for the game provided their correctly completed application is received before Tuesday 10th March. All applications should be posted to PO Box 1986, Middlesbrough TS3 6TB. Applications will NOT be accepted at the Cellnet Riverside Stadium.

The club has received the following allocations for Wembley: 1200 for the Olympic Gallery at £90 each; 300 for the Olympic Gallery at £70 each; 3300 at £53 each; 4000 at £46 each; 10000 at £40 each; 6200 at £34 each; 6500 at £26 each; 500 at £20 each

The club has already been inundated with callers asking about discounted family tickets. Only 2200 of these were received for Wembley and they will be allocated to those applicants who have applied for tickets in the £40 and £26 price range and who have children under the age of 16 in their party. However, there are already far more applicants in this price range than the 2200 tickets available at discounted rates and the half price tickets will be allocated on a first come first served basis from those applications already received.

An announcements will be made on or around 20th March with regards to any general sale of tickets. Meanwhile, the police at Wembley Stadium have used a statement warning fans only to buy their tickets from authorised distributors. Supporters who buy tickets from a tout, will NOT be allowed into the stadium.

CRIME VICTIMS HELP POLICE GET TO GRIPS WITH OFFENDERS

FED-UP crime victims have played a significant role in pushing down levels of offending across County Durham to a new low. Latest statistics confirm Durham Constabulary dealt with 44,487 reported crimes in 1997 - over six per cent fewer than the 47,451 recorded in the previous 12 among.

Detective Superintendent David Grey, head of the County's CID, said while the cumulative effect of a number of home-grown police initiatives in Durham had underpinned the latest successes, growing public resentment to the activities of persistent offenders had made a welcome and important contribution.

"The public's new-found intolerance of anti-social behaviour and persistent offenders is helping us get to grips with crime. Very often the victims know or have reasonable suspicion of who is responsible for committing an offence. In the past they may have been reluctant, for one reason or another, to come forward. But there seems to be a noticeable change in attitudes.

"People are justifiably browned off when thieves ruin their lives and as a result they are prepared to do something about it by coming to us with information or reporting suspicious incidents or people acting suspiciously," added the superintendent.

Key elements of the force's tailor-made community-based style of policing are the hundreds of partnerships which have been established with local authorities and core agencies in both the public, and private sectors.

Neighbourhood Watch - which embraces half of the 200,000 homes across County Durham and Darlington - and the introduction of a special scheme to help those who are targets of repeat offending, have also played an important and continuing role in the overall success during the year, said Det. Supt. Grey.

Crime hit an all-time high in Durham in 1993 when a total of 62,813 offences were recorded. Since then year-on-year reductions, on one occasion the highest fall in England and Wales, have produced a cumulative percentage fall of a third, (-5% in 94; -11% in 1995; -11% in 1996; and -6.2% in 1997)

During 1997 the number of house burglaries fell by three per cent to 5,737 (5,889) while vehicle crime slipped by 13 per cent from 12,596 to 10,996. Violent crime, which included six murders (7 in 1996), four attempted murders (7), one manslaughter (10) and 75 rapes (59) rose slightly from 2,472 to 2,416.

"We feel our crime strategy, launched four years ago and still being evolved, is really starting to bite home. It in turn is reinforced by the wider force-wide use of intelligence, allowing uniformed officers greater opportunities and time to investigate offences.

"The use of all the information provided by our intelligence gathering focuses and co-ordinates the work of uniformed officers, detectives and civilian back-up, in particular an increased emphasis on scientific support and fingerprints. At the same time cooperation between neighbouring forces is helping combat the activities of travelling thieves" said Det. Supt Grey".

In the face of the latest successes the superintendent has, however, struck a cautionary note about the future collation of crime statistics to moot changing Government requirements.

"Some minor offences which in the past we have not been required to record as crimes, will from April of this year be picked up in the returns of every police force. The result will be a statistical rise in some offending," he added.

Employers Invited to T.A. Open Day

At an Open Day recently, industry leaders and Local Government Officers learned all about the benefits that would accrue to them by having more of their employees join the Territorial Army - as well as what those who joined might get out of it.

The working lunch had been organised by 201 (Northern) Field Hospital (Volunteers) at Newton Aycliffe TA Centre in Greenwell Way. As spokesman, Captain John Martin said, "It's obvious what the TA soldier gets out of it, up to £1,200 in their first year, a new trade and the chance to travel and make new friends. What is perhaps not so clear is the amount of benefit the employer gets - and at no cost. They will have someone who is more self-assured and confident and not afraid to respond to a new challenge".

At the TA Centre employers were shown a video which explained the benefits that both recruit and civil employer might expect and were treated to an exhibition and a presentation by one of the unit Officers.

So impressive was the display that one of the employers enlisted on the spot herself and others expressed a keen interest on what was on offer.

The manager of the Newton Aycliffe branch of Woolworths sent along representative Zoe Clark, a potential management trainee to see what it was all about and she said later, "It was very impressive. I'll probably join myself and I certainly will encourage others to take part".

Darlington College of Technology representatives Donna Joyce and Jim Harker are Lecturers in the Department of Catering there and as a result of their visit they have both decided to enlist. They have also organised a 'Look at Life'-type weekend where they will in March take 24 of their catering students to Otterburn for the weekend as guests of this important TA unit to see what goes on. Said Jim "It seems a fantastic opportunity for our students to earn something extra whilst at college but it will also extend their range of experiences. But it's not just the Army way of catering they learn. They could learn other trades instead. Travel, training, extra cash - fantastic."

Indeed, there are opportunities in all trades one might expect in any hospital from nursing and First Aid to security - and all paid at Regular Army rates of pay.

Newton Aycliffe Being Steered Toward "Learning Town" Status

Last week saw the publication of a new government consultation paper "The Learning Age". This has been heralded by some as the start of a learning revolution which will transform Britain and have the same degree of impact as the Industrial Revolution in the last century. As David Blunkett, the Secretary of State for Education and Employment commented, "people must be allowed to develop learning where they wish to and how they wish to." The idea is that instead of going to institutions to team, the institutions will come to the people, wherever they are.

Steps have already been taken to facilitate this in Aycliffe. The idea of Newton Aycliffe as a Learning Town was launched at an inaugural meeting at Greenfield School last July, and since then a number of Steering Group meetings have been held to attempt to bring the idea closer to reality.

The aim is to encourage everyone to see Lifetime Learning as taking advantage of learning opportunities throughout their lives, not just at school. It goes further than this though, in that the Steering Group (which includes representatives from local industry, government, community and education) are working together to promote learning not only as a key issue to advance people's personal prospects, but also the economic future of the whole town. The main focus for this year's activities is a plan to set up a "One Stop Learning Shop" in the Town Centre. This will provide facilities for everyone to see just what education, training and learning facilities are open to them locally. People will be able to get advice and guidance and, hopefully, be able to use the latest Information and

Communications Technology to help them (Cyber-Cafe here we come!). Remember, "who learns wins..... Lifetime learning is now a necessity for all. We must acquire new knowledge and skills throughout our lives to help us improve our chances of getting a job, of getting promotion or of improving our leisure time. Above all, learning should be fun! The Steering Group hopes to be able to display some of its plans at the Rotary "Community and Business Fair" in June and will be carrying out some market research to see what people would like out of the Learning Town. In the meantime, should you have any queries or questions, or wish to attend one of our meetings, please contact Karen Robson, Deputy Headteacher, Greenfield School and Chair person of Learning Town Steering Group.

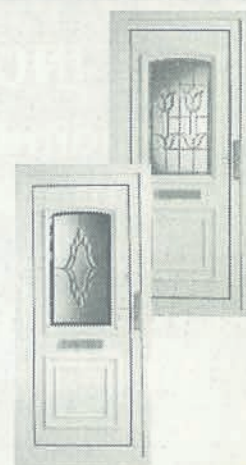

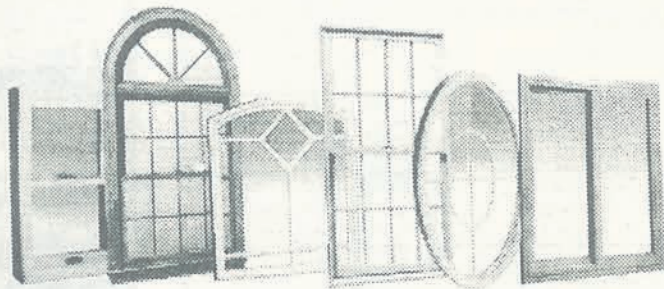
