

AVENUE SITE TOO SMALL FOR NEW TOWN CENTRE PLAN says Town Council

Great Aycliffe Town Council don't think the Avenue School site is big enough to accommodate all the proposals in the planing brief for a re-modelled Town Centre.

They have asked the County Council who own ex Avenue School land what plans they have for the detached playing field, west of Woodham Comp., suggesting it could form part of the development. As a consequence the County Council has written to the planners, Sedgefield Borough

Council requesting they include the 10.6 acre site in the overall package so that the Town Centre objectives can be met.

Whilst this would make the package even more attractive to a developer it is unlikely to succeed as this piece of land has been designated as "open space" in the Local Plan and

would take a lengthy procedure to change.

The County Council did object to this part of the local plan, but public opinion and the need for open space in this area prevailed. They obviously wanted to sell the site and raise a lot of cash and the suggestion by the Town Council gave them the opportunity to try again.

If the County Council accept they cannot sell this land they could put it in the hands of the Youth Centre who, when the Avenue site is developed, will lose the playing fields they are currently using.

A number of junior football teams use the field and they will have nowhere to

Peter Sheen declined to make a very interesting speech as Aycliffe welcomed the lads from Medomsley Road this week for a return friendly match followed by the international and sedate refreshments.

In the first leg of what looks like becoming a regular home and away event, Aycliffe were tonked by the Crisp men. Not so on Saturday. Aycliffe were able to choose from 23 players as people returned from injury and in response to the club's resurgent mood, coach Malvern stuck with the side that finished last week with the addition of Mark Hill and Neil Shaw in the centre.

GOLF PRICE RISE MISUNDERSTOO

I suspect that the 'Veteran Golfer" who complained about an increase in season ticket charges has misunderstood the Town

Council's pricing

policy.

The Council has not increased the over-60's season ticket price at all, it has kept last years price of £100.00

It has, however, changed the conditions of the reduced ticket, so that over-60's golfers taking advantage of this very low price can play only on weekdays (Monday-Friday). As most retired people do, in fact, play on weekdays only, very few over-60's golfers will be inconvenienced by this change of rules. And a keen retired golfer cans till play Monday through Friday




