COUNTY DURHAM LEADS THE WORLD IN GOOD ENVIRONMENTAL PRACTICE

Seven hundred delegates from across Europe are to hear how County Durham is setting the global pace in tackling world environmental problems. They are to attend an international conference on the best of 'green' practice

held in Bonn, Germany, this week. (June 2 and 3) David Miller, head of environment with Durham County Council's Environment and Technical Services Department, will present one of three international examples of good practice in carrying out Local Agenda 21. The other two presentations will be made by representatives from Austria and Denmark, while among the speakers at the two-day conference will be the former French premier Valéry Giscard d'Estaing. "We have been asked to show what the Local Agenda 21 Partnership in County Durham is doing to one of the most environmentally-conscious nations in Europe," said David Miller. The work of the Partnership - which involves more than 450

individuals from over 300 organisations within the County - was used as an example of good practice at the second Earth Summit held in New York last summer. "We are well up to speed in producing the kind of local projects that are urgently needed if we are to meet targets for reducing global warming and pollution," he said. A recent progress report on the Partnership contained 50 sustainable projects, including energy and transport initiatives, and 25 tough targets such as developing renewable energy to provide for 12 per cent of local needs by 2006, to address global problems locally. "The message is that you have to make global issues local and I hope to get that message across at the conference using the World Cup as an example," he said.

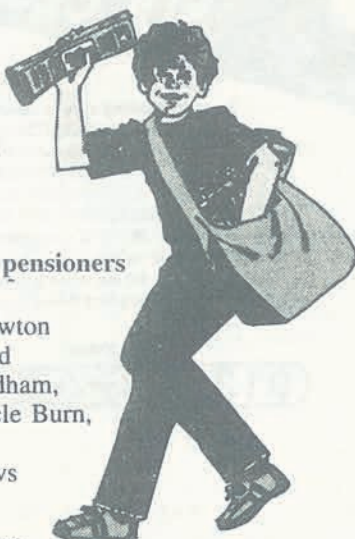

COUNCIL SPONSORS ANTI-THEFT INITIATIVE

On Tues 19th May 1998, the Mayor Counc. Brian Avery and Police Superintendent Derek Hall, launched a Sedgfield Borough Property Marking Initiative at Ferryhill Leisure Centre.

'The Challenge' is sponsored by the Sedgfield Borough Community Safety Panel and the partnership includes - Sedgfield Borough Council, The Police, Neighbourhood Watch, Carelink, the Community Rangers, the Great Aycliffe and Sedgfield Village Crime panels together with Community Safety Coordinators who have all pledged their support.

The initiative will run from May - October, 1998 and will then be evaluated between October, 1998 - March 1999. The aim of all involved is to 'Post Code' property in every dwelling in the Sedgfield Borough area, almost 40,000 dwellings in all.

Dwelling burglary has been highlighted in the new Divisional Policing Initiatives with a pledge to reduce the number of house break-ins. In 1997-98 there were 810 house burglaries in the Borough - and this initiative is seen as a positive step in the reduction process.

As part of the plan, Police and Neighbourhood Watch are offering a U. V. Pen marking kit, which includes Ultra Violet Pen, Home Office

advice leaflet and property record together with two window stickers, for sale at 50p.

Other marking options will be made available to Neighbourhood Watch Groups, such as Select-a-mark, and 'Smart Water'. D.C. Neil Langthorne, Crime Prevention Officer advised everyone to 'take the initiative and come on board', urging the public to 'post code' their valuables to photograph and keep records of jewellery and be in a position to give police an accurate description of property if stolen.

He said the public often miss the point of these initiatives, marking property can often increase the chances of bringing charges against the Thieves and Handlers of Stolen Goods.

It is of great frustration to Police Officers when goods seized from Criminals have to be returned to them because of lack of identification. Residents wishing to purchase a marking pack can do so by calling at Newton Aycliffe Police Office. Further advice regarding marking your property can be obtained by contacting the Community Safety Department or Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator Lin Craddy. Tel. 314401.

COUNTY COUNCIL GIVE MORE POWER TO THE PEOPLE

Durham County Council is taking power closer to the people from this week by giving members of the public a more direct say in decisions which affect their lives. And Chester-le-Street has been chosen to serve as the 'test bed' District where the new scheme will be launched on Thursday 4 June.

The County Council is to establish a network of 'Locality Forums' in key areas of the County where representatives of local communities can meet senior council officers and their local elected members for discussions on major issues and initiatives involving the Authority.

It is intended that once established, the Forums will meet at least twice a year in a bid to make the Council more responsive to local needs and more publicly accountable.

The Locality Forums were first promised in the County Council's submission as part of the Local Government Review and will meet in a network of 12 'Locality Centres' - new one stop shops to be established in key centres throughout the County so that, in the main, no resident is more than six miles away from a County Council service access point.

County Council Leader Don Robson said the move would enable the Authority to respond more quickly, effectively and more positively to locally determined needs and preferences.

"We intend that the new Local Forums will serve as focal points for consultation on major issues and will provide a valuable mechanism for the expression of local opinion on matters of interest and concern, both to localities and the County Council itself, on both local and strategic issues," he added. "The overall intention is to add another potentially significant means of Council Taxpayer involvement in the County Council's activities, performance and policy formulation.

"While similar initiatives known as 'Citizens' Juries' were launched in the UK last year, I believe our Forums - with their less rigid, less formal style - are more suitable.

"As a local authority, we have always considered we have an overriding duty to provide the best value for the people we serve and we firmly believe that our Council Taxpayers and service users have an important role in helping us achieve it."

The first locality forum will meet in Chester-le-Street Civic Centre on Thursday 4 June to mark national Local Democracy Week.

It will involve an invited audience representing a cross section of the local community, including businesses, voluntary and statutory organisations and ordinary Council Taxpayers.

Once firmly established, it is intended that the meetings will be advertised more widely and involve more of the general public. High on the agenda will be a review of the County Council's corporate plan - the framework which governs all of the Authority's activities up to the year 1999.

"Work is about to start on a follow-up plan to take County Durham into the new Millennium, and the Local Forums will provide an ideal opportunity to hear the local community's views on what it should contain," said Coun Robson.

* It is proposed that the full network of Locality Centres - in which the Forums would meet - will be based in Consett, Chester-le-Street, Durham City, Peterlee, Bishop Auckland, Barnard Castle, Stanley, Seaham, Stanhope, Crook, Spennymoor and Newton Aycliffe, where possible in existing council properties such as libraries.
