TOWN'S 50th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS BRING ARTS AWARD NOMINATION

Newton Aycliffe's 50th anniversary celebrations which brought art, history and the environment

together, have been nominated for a regional arts award.

Great Aycliffe Town Council's first foray into the arts world has resulted in an entry in the Arts Promoter category of the well-supported Northern Electric and Gas Arts Awards.

A week of celebrations this summer were just the tip of the iceberg in the County Durham new town's 50th birthday.

A lasting reminder of the anniversary is the creation of Great Aycliffe Way, a five-and-a-half-mile circular walk through the town bordered by newly-commissioned sculptures.

Andrew Bailey, the Town Council's Director of Leisure and Environment, said the Council was determined the celebrations would be a community experience which would last a lifetime.

"We wanted to create something which would carry on for the next 50 years," he said. "The work which has been done will be here for perpetuity."

A partnership with

Sedgefield Borough Council ensured the success of the project, with other Councils and companies adding their support to the milestone celebrations. Alison Wood was commissioned to produce a tapestry, photographic and video community records have been kept and artists encouraged undersevens to develop story telling and make papier mache masks.

Durham County Council's Arts, Libraries and Museums Department commissioned and funded some of the arts projects.

The awards each carry a prize of £3,000 with runners-up prizes in some categories.

The competition is supported by Northern Arts, Tyne Tees Television and Border TV.

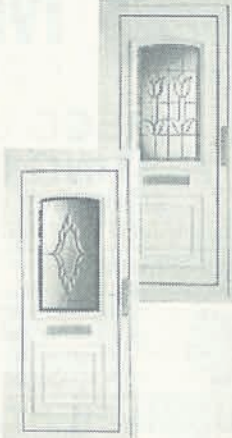

POLICY ON STRAY DOGS EXPLAINED

Further to your recent article in the 'Newton News' and our subsequent telephone conversation, I have detailed below the procedure for dealing with stray dogs as specified under the current legislation and I have included a list of charges which may be incurred.

For your information this Authority picks up over 400 stray dogs every year which in itself is a sad fact. I can sympathise with any genuine caring owner who loses their dog, but there are precautions which are highlighted in the legislation which dog owners can take e.g. tagging.

Having regard to fines and charges when a dog is seized, the maximum anyone would have to pay at the current time is £57.00. I do not believe that this sum is excessive bearing in mind the normal costs incurred in responsible dog ownership e.g. veterinary care, bedding, food, toys etc.

In the case concerning Mrs. Thompson, I can inform you that had the dog been wearing a collar and tag stating the dog's address an attempt would have been made to return the dog before it was taken to the kennels and in the event of Mrs. Thompson not being at home she would have been notified in writing of the whereabouts of the dog.

I understand from the owner of the kennels that he was informed by Mrs. Thompson, or a relative, that the dog would be collected on Sunday, 5th July. No-one came to collect the dog and regrettably it was destroyed on Friday, 10th July.

As you suggested therefore it may be advisable to remind the public of the stray dog procedure which I have detailed for your information as follows:-

1. Where the Council's authorised officer finds a stray dog in a public place he must seize it and detain it. In the case of any other land he can still seize the dog provided the owner or occupier agrees.

2. If a member of the public finding a stray dog they have a duty to report the matter to the Local Authority or the Police Authority. If they fail to do so they would be committing an offence. There are however powers within the Environmental Protection Act for the Local Authority to allow a member of the public to keep a dog that they have found.

3. Where the authorised officer knows the name and address of the owner of the dog he must notify that person in writing that he will dispose of the dog unless it is claimed within 7 days and the Local Authority's expenses are paid.

N.B. In Sedgefield Borough if a dog is found and is wearing a collar and tag the dog warden will make an attempt to return the dog to its owner before taking it to the kennels.

4. In addition, The Control of Dogs Order 1992, which is enforced by Local Authorities requires dogs in a public place to wear a collar with the name and address of the owner inscribed on it. If not so worn, the owner commits an offence under the Animal Health Act 1981.

5. The Local Authority must provide and arrange for the detention of dogs and for them to be properly fed and confined. Costs involved in the kennelling of dogs are recoverable from owners who require the return of the animal. The current kennelling costs are £4.00 per day up to a maximum of 8 days i.e. £32.00. In addition under the Environmental Protection (Stray Dogs) Regulations 1992, the owner of a dog which has been found straying and subsequently seized must pay a fine of £25.00. Dogs cannot be released unless the kennelling costs and statutory fine are paid in full.

6. After the expiration of 8 days the Local Authority may dispose of the dog. These are statutory deadlines for which the Local Authority have no control over and it is not possible to enter into ad-hoc arrangements with individual dog owners. Although the Local Authority may have some sympathy with a small minority of dog owners who have genuine hardship problems an extension to the time that the dogs are kept at the kennels cannot be given nor can the Local Authority enter into any arrangements for the payment of kennelling fees or fines other than those that have already been specified.

I hope that this clarifies the current position for you and should you require any further information or advice please do not hesitate to contact me.

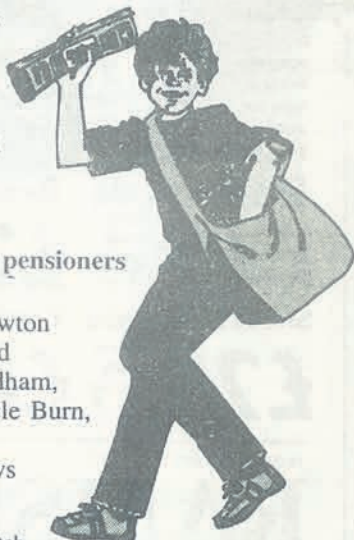

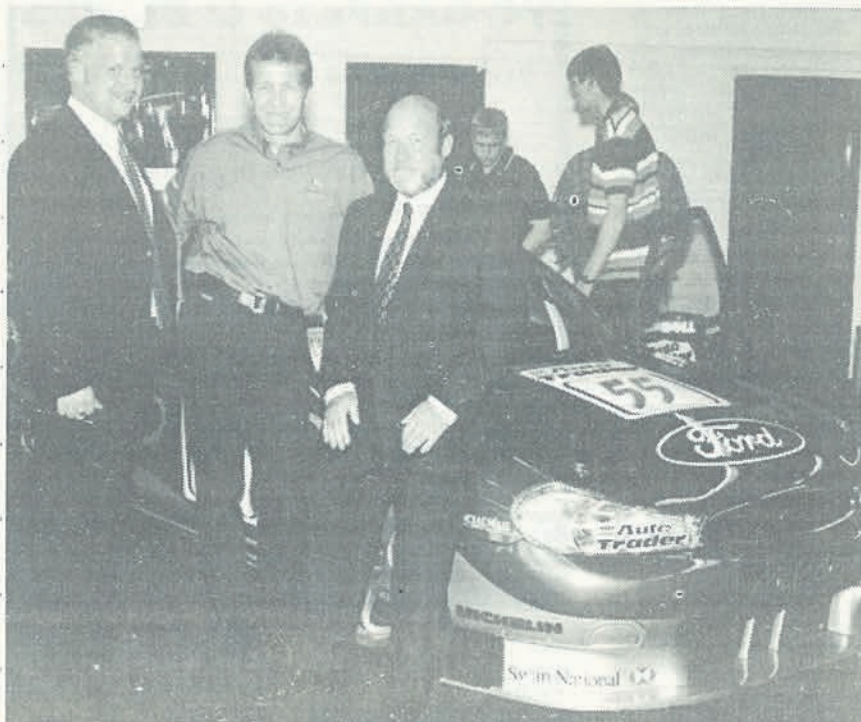
Teenager Wins Adventure Course

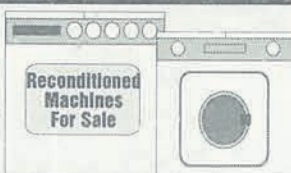
