Horndale residents held a meeting this week following the disclosure that Greenfield House was to become a hostel for ex-criminals.

They were unanimously opposed to the scheme which will bring ex drug offenders into a residential area which has two schools, a nursery and an old people's residential home. However, more people are wanting information and were a little annoyed at not being invited to the hasty meeting organised by Counc. Tony Moore.

Due to this demand, Counc. Martyn Locklin, who lives in the area, has called another meeting to give more people an opportunity to express their views and hear the latest information.

The Open Public Meeting will be held next Thursday, 24th September at 7pm in Greenfield School Hall.

"Everyone interested is invited, as this project affects the whole town and residents will want to support the neighbours of Greenfield House in their opposition to what is happening." said Counc Locklin.

MP's VISIT TOO LATE FOR FUJITSU STAFF

Wednesday saw the Prime Minister Tony Blair visit the town to convey his sympathy and support to the 570 workers from the tragically redundant Fujitsu.

Mr Blair met some of the beleaguered workforce to portray the governments intention to help find the redundant workers new jobs. There has been a job centre set-up on the factory site so that one to one advice can be given. There has also been a task force assigned to begin a world wide campaign to find a buyer for the plant, though due to the collapse in the world market optimism is quite low.

The Prime Minister blamed the closure on a volatile global market which no-one has control of, the government could do nothing. This sparked opinion amongst the workers that the visit has come too late. This could also be said of the new funding that has been offered to the North East Regional Development Agency.

The visit coincidentally came on the same day as the release of the current unemployment figures. The figures show that unemployment is standing at 1.8 million and is at it's lowest since 1980. It must be remembered that these figures are for last month and the recent redundancies in the north east will not yet be registered.

Fujitsu is the largest employer in Newton Aycliffe and the closure in December will deal a devastating blow to the whole community. Not since the closure of GEC Telecommunications just over ten years ago has there been such effect on the town and it's surrounding provinces.

More than ever the community must pull together and support the unfortunate families who have been most effected. Peter Tennick

M.P.'s REQUEST FOR EURO AID FOR UNEMPLOYED

In Strasbourg, Stephen Hughes, Durham's Euro MP has met with Dr Monika Wulf-Mathies, Europe's Regional Development Commissioner to press for a firm commitment of continued European Regional money post—1999 and immediate extra assistance to help with unemployment looming for the workers of Fujitsu, Siemens, Kverner and even possibly Phillips - all based in the area.

Stephen Hughes made the case for those workers currently threatened with unemployment due to the closure of the new technology plants. Following Stephen Hughes' plea, Commissioner Wulf-Mathies indicated that her services were standing by to respond positively to any approaches the local authorities, Government Office North East and other regional bodies might make to re-allocate money already ear-marked for the region or underspend in other regions or in the Community initiatives.

The sort of money we can expect from Europe will help with training and retraining, any additional infrastructure works, business support and start-up assistance to help establish small and medium-sized companies in the area.

When Stephen Hughes asked whether fresh and any projected job losses would be taken into account by the Commission in relation to the post-1999 funding, Commissioner Wulf-Mathies said she could guarantee that the judgement will not be based only on historical figures but upon any current or projected job losses in service and new technology sectors as well as traditional sectors.

Speaking today, Stephen Hughes said:-

"The meeting was a complete success. I will continue, to work closely with Durham County Council, Government Office North East and the other partners in the area to be sure that Europe does all that it can to help with our difficulties here.

"I believe the Commission needed to be made aware of the very real difficulties we are facing as a result of the collapse of these major inward investment players.

"I am confident that the European Commission will be doing all it can to help us to help ourselves through this temporary difficulty caused by global forces beyond our control."




