
#### SHIELDS BEAT TOWN'S U/12's

# FRAUD IS COSTING THE NHS £MILLION

County Durham Health Authority has welcomed the seriousness with which the law is treating NHS fraud. This follows the sentencing of a County Durham optician to nine months imprisonment, suspended for two years at Teesside Crown Court.

The Health Authority has recovered £30,000 from the optician which had been wrongly claimed.

Director of Finance John Flook said: "The NHS is losing money from fraud committed by a small minority of its contractors such as opticians, pharmacists and GPs. Fraudulent misappropriation of NHS funds is not a victimless crime. A fraud committed against the NHS means less money to treat patients.

"Prescription fraud is costing the NHS millions of pounds each year. It is good to see this issue being taken seriously. The NHS, Police and Crown Prosecution Service need to continue with their efforts to ensure that those who defraud the public are brought to account".


