

Durham County Council has confirmed it has launched an inquiry into the break-out of three teenagers from secure accommodation at Aycliffe

The Centre's General Manager, Ken Black, said the break-out had been particularly violent and that one member of staff had been taken to hospital with a suspected fracture of the skull.

Mr. Black also expressed his sympathy to the family of the crash victim, David Brook, adding that his death should serve as a salutary reminder of the all-too-often consequences of young people becoming involved in the theft of motor vehicles.

FLYMO JOBS BOOST FOR AYCLIFFE

Another 135 new jobs are coming to Newton Aycliffe with the expansion of local company Flymo, aided by a £400,000 Regional Selective Assistance (RSA) grant from the DTL

Flymo/Partner, part of the world-wide Electrolux Group, is to expand production facilities at Newton Aycliffe to allow the further development of its Partner range of petrol-powered lawimowers.

The project, costing a total of £2.1 million, will safeguard 53 existing jobs as well as adding another 135 to the 525 people currently employed by Flymo at Newton Aycliffe, where the company has had a base since 1965.

DTI Minister Barbra Roche said: "The Electrolux Group operates in 60 countries around the world and could well have made this investment elsewhere, including the United States, where it has a similar plant which could have absorbed this increase in capacity.




