COUNCIL SHOULD ACT NOW TO CLEAN TOWN CENTRE

Opponents are complaining strongly about the filthy state of the Town Centre and are urging Councillors responsible for the environment to force the landlords to clean-up or out.

Councils have the power to make landlords clean up their property if it affects the enjoyment of the environment.

The Town Centre pedestrian areas are owned by private London landlords and come under Council responsibility for general cleaning and litter.

However a landlord can be made to keep those areas clean and tidy. If they don't, the Council can take necessary action, including carrying out work themselves and forcing the landlords.

Newton News' has always favoured the action of the former Aycliffe Development Corporation selling the whole Town Centre, including the common walkways, to a private company.

The pedestrian areas in transferred to the Council along with other public assets a number of problems relating to the environment and policing could not have arisen.

Have often called on the landlords to pass these areas over to the local authority, who can better look after this important Town Centre facility.

Letter to the Editor APPLICATION FOR SCRAP YARD NEAR NATURE PARK IS RIDICULOUS

Dear Sir, I would like to bring the following to attention of Aycliffe residents.

This morning I received notice from Sedgefield Borough Council of an application by Don Ward Limited to change the use of a site on Groat Road, Aycliffe Industrial Estate to that of a Metal Processing and Servicing Centre, complete with weighbridge, storage, and baling facilities.

This Is Quite Clearly A Technical Description For A Scrap Yard.

I have scoured Groat Road and have been unsuccessful in locating any premises used by Don Ward Ltd, and will need to scrutinise the planning application for the exact location of the proposed development. What I would like to know is how Sedgefield Council can even consider siting such a development so close to a residential area already suffering from the dust pollution of Plasmor, and the noise pollution generated by Tallent Engineering.

Both of these Companies are still under investigation by the Dept of Environmental Health after repeated complaints by local residents.

The noise pollution from Tallent Engineering has grown steadily in proportion to its expansion

over the last 4 years, without any consideration for local residents.

The ash heap at Plasmor has reduced in height recently but still produces a dust storm when the weather is dry and windy.

The original stated use for this land when the green belt was fenced off was for the storage of finished bricks. Sadly the letters from Plasmor and Aycliffe Parks Dept are no longer in existence due to naively believing what I was told. Tallents also have an eyesore of a scrap yard of their own in the grounds of the old Darchem factory.

The attitude seems to be that as they provide employment for the people of Newton Aycliffe they can therefore do as they wish.

Are Aycliffe Councillors aware of this proposal? Have they raised any objection to this being submitted, especially as they are trying to promote the adjacent Nature Park for school field trips?

I urge residents to express their disapproval and write as soon as possible to Mr. Roy Merrett. Planning and Technical Services, Sedgefield Borough Council, Council Offices, Spennymoor, Co Durham DL16 6JQ.

ALUMINIUM CANS AND FOIL:

As you may already know, this year's Blue Peter Appeal to raise money to help children in Mozambique, is a collection of aluminium foil and cans. These can be collected at any Oxfam Shop, Asda, or Safeway Store.

There are two important things to remember when collecting aluminium for the Blue Peter Appeal: - **Only aluminium cans** are being collected - not steel ones or food tins. To help make the recycling easier, the foil should be washed and deposited separately from the cans (e.g. in a carrier bag). **Aluminium foil should never be stuffed inside the cans** as this makes recycling very difficult.

RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES:

Old rechargeable Nickel-Cadmium (Ni-Cd) batteries can be taken for recycling to the Black & Decker Service Centre, Green Lane, Spennymoor. This type of battery is used in rechargeable power tools and in rechargeable batteries (which come with their own re-charger). Other types of battery are **NOT** collected by Black & Decker.

Recycling Nickel-Cadmium batteries ensures that the cadmium they contain is re-used, and does not leak into the environment.

YELLOW PAGES

Yellow Pages are about to distribute their new directories to households. Anyone wanting to recycle their old directories can leave it at one of the special collection points at Heighington Lane, Aycliffe, Civic Amenities Site this January.

At the end of January, the directories will be taken to Newton Aycliffe to be recycled by NE Recycling Ltd. The paper will be used to make incontinence pads.

Have You Been Conned this Xmas?

Shoppers were warned this week to be on the look-out for shocking Christmas stocking fillers. Durham County Council's Consumer Services receive complaints every year about so-called bargains which later turn out to be poor quality, unsafe or counterfeit.

Phillip Holman, head of Consumer Services, said rogue traders seize on the Christmas rush to cash in. "With so many families under increasing financial pressure this year, the temptation will be to seek out so called bargains from less reputable sources", he said.

"However, cheap toys may have paint on them containing excessive amounts of heavy metals, or detachable parts which could choke a child. "Counterfeit" Playstation CDs may not even play on your Playstation and those copied 'Disney' videos can turn out to be either unwatchable or blank," he said.

"In the last minute run up to Christmas, people are at their most susceptible and shoppers should be wary of 'knock-down' prices and avoid buying from suitcase salesmen or from a man in the pub as there is little chance of redress if things

go wrong", he said. Councillor Ken Manton, chairman of the County Council's Environment and Technical Services Committee, said: "We all want Christmas to be a happy and safe time for our families, so it's important to remember to keep your head and purchase wisely."

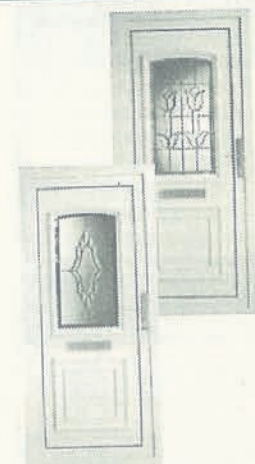

COMMUNITY XMAS CONCERT IMPRESSED CIVIC VISITORS

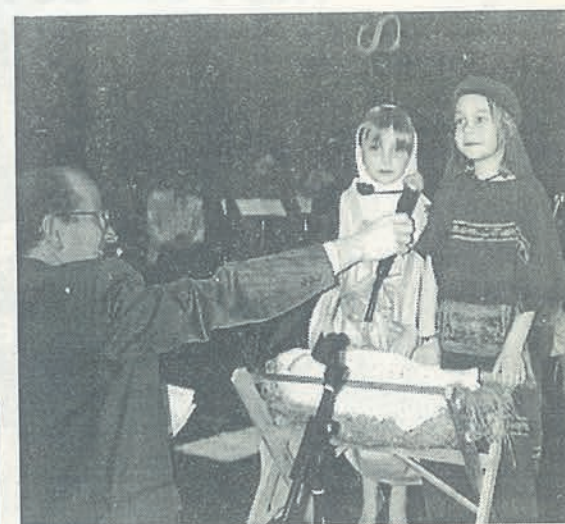


The 7th annual Community Xmas Concert organised by the Rotary Club was a glittering affair this year with the Mayor and civic dignitaries from other towns in attendance.
