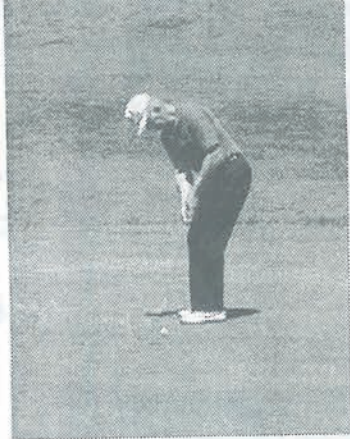

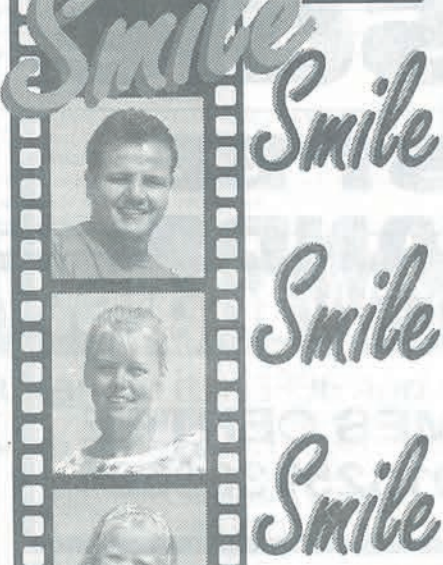

Agnews Waiting Since 1982 for Play Areas

Dear Sir,
In the Cobbler's Hall developments being planned for by Sedgefield District Council there are potential areas outlined for Playgrounds and Sports facilities, which will be determined 'as required at a later date', according to the recent committee report.
I reminded the Committee that the predicted need for Play and Sports facilities were already clearly defined, in the Northern Area Study, years ago, for all families in that area. A floodlit hard surface pitch suitable for a variety of games such as 5-a-side football, tennis, basketball and also bowling greens for mature residents use and Children's Play Areas, covering 15 acres. Those facilities were intended to meet the needs of the residents and families of the Agnews, as well as any future Rope Moor and Cobbler's Hall residents when eventually developed.
Residents and families in the Agnews developments have been deprived for years of access to those much needed facilities whilst awaiting provision of them since that 1982 Northern Area study report. I sincerely hope that Agnew residents ensure that their views on family recreational and sports needs, are made known and listened to and taken heed of when consultation takes place. Those facilities should meet the needs of and be available to all families in the northern area, as was originally intended in the report. Especially those in need of them for too long now.
I hope all residents and families concerned will ensure their views and opinions are sought and listened to when that provision comes up for consultation. They've waited long enough.

"TOWN CENTRE HAS LITTLE TO OFFER"

Dear Sir,
Recent comment in the Newton News (6/1/96) regarding the lack of shoppers in our Town Centre can be explained

by the large number of residents who go elsewhere, and why not? The town centre has little to offer and some traders take us for granted, the largest store, after 2 days Christmas holiday, remained closed on the Wednesday, a greengrocer has produce outside to the edge of the canopy which is intended for the shelter of shoppers and, for no excusable reason, all outlets double or trebled the price of mushrooms, tomatoes and lettuce over the Christmas and New Year period, and in March cynical price increases of essentials occur in preparation for Pension and Benefit increases starting in April.

Parking in the town centre is inadequate and will possibly reduce when the Avenue Site is developed, the lower and middle floors of the Multi-Storey are dark and forbidding.

Only one pedestrian crossing is near the town centre and the general appearance at all entrance points is appalling.

Aycliffe Development Corporations planning of the town centre was a disaster, but it is no good for recriminations against the Development Corporation as it no longer exists.

Positive initiatives are required by Sedgefield District Council and our Town Council to have the town centre owners provide better facilities and for Traders and litterers which degrade it, to clean up their act. If those faceless and nameless owners fail, why not build a new town centre owned by the Local Authority on the former Avenue School site and let the existing one continue to decay!

CAR BOOT SALE INCREASE OF 42% TOO MUCH!

Dear Sir,
We could not let John Noble's reply to our letter on his Car Boot Sale, pass without comment.

It seems that we were misinformed about the timing of the increase in charge from seven pounds to ten pounds, however, we feel that this was the only inaccuracy in our letter and stand by everything else we said.

On our penultimate visit to the UMM car boot sale, in the summer of 1995, we were charged seven pounds for a 'pitch'.

Mr. Noble has himself confirmed that the rent was increased to ten pounds in October of the same year, a rise of 42.86 percent at a time when the annual inflation rate was less than 5 percent!

We are also told that ten pounds is, on average, 50 percent cheaper than for other indoor car boot and market fees.

It is unfair to compare a properly organized and strictly regulated market, such as the one in Newton Aycliffe Town Centre, with a car boot sale.

We do not know of any other car boot sale, particularly in this county, which charges twenty pounds for a small car.

(Maths Lesson:- fifty percent of twenty is ten, twenty minus ten equals a charge of ten pounds, i.e. fifty percent cheaper).

Although we might accept that our views are those of a minority, we would not agree that our opinions are isolated.

Perhaps some fellow Newtonians and readers of the Newton News would like to respond.

Do you think that our comments on the car boot

sale are totally unjustified? Have you ever had any doubts about rents, admission charges, toilet facilities, hygiene standards, sale of new goods, fire risks, first aid cover, sale of food, sale of Sunday Papers, dubious Hoopla and Tombola stalls, the sale of pirate tapes or faulty/dangerous electrical goods etc., etc.?

Any action Mr. Noble takes to obtain ten pounds from us will be contested vigorously, as we do not feel any moral or legal obligation to make such a payment.

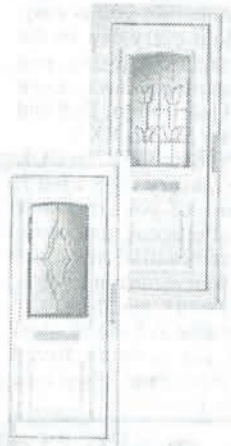
