The Community Health Council is asking all of the Town and Parish Councils in the Sedgefield and Wear Valley Districts to give their views as well as local Primary and Secondary Schools and is encouraged by the level of response to

We are also extremely interested to hear what individual members of the public and local industry think about the possibility of a hospital with no Consultant Led Accident and Emergency Department and little or no emergency surgery being available. The

CHC's Public Consultation Register is being used to seek the views of local people but we are asking everyone who has a view on the proposals to write to us. On 1st February the CHC will hold a meeting which is open to the public in the Assembly Hall, Bishop Auckland General Hospital starting at 2pm when the proposals for the future of Bishop Auckland General Hospital will be discussed. Valerie Bryden, Chief Officer of the CHC, said the Hospital is an integral part of the community in South West Durham and it is critically important that the value which people place on the services provided there is made known to the Health Commission and the Department of Health.

If there is to be a comprehensive range of services available and within easy travelling distance for the people of South West Durham then I would encourage people to let us know their views and to come to the meeting on 1st February when they can have any questions they

might have answered. The Community Health Council is the public's representative in the National Health Service and before the formal response is submitted to the Health Commission in early February we want to ensure that we have heard as many views from the public as possible.

VILLAGE SCRAP YARD PLAN **BLOCKED**

Strong objections from villagers have prevented land at Aycliffe being used as a Scrap Yard.

Trust Midland Bank applied to the S.D.C. to return the land to its original use and brought a storm of protest from the village fearful the business would create an eyesore in one of the County's beauty spots.

But the applicants failed to establish the land was previously used as a scrap yard, producing no documentary photographic evidence to support their claim.

Had they done so, there

was nothing to stop them carrying on the business. The S.D.C received 37 letters and a petition carrying 250 signatures against the proposal, stating it would be detrimental to the appearance of the area and a highway hazard.

John Farquhar, Town Clerk told the S.D.C that since he took up his post in 1968 the area in question had never been used as a scrap yard.

Based on this the application was refused, but the applicant has the right of appeal and could force a public inquiry.

HUNTSMAN WIN MUDDY GAME OF FOOTBALL

A swamp like pitch produced what must have been one of the worst games of the season, in a week when long-standing club member Dave Nicholson finally decided to hang up his boots, writes Martin Walker.

After months of pondering over a return with the Huntsman, Dave Nicholson has followed doctors instructions not to play again due to the severe breaking of his leg in training last summer.

A dejected Nicholson said: "I wanted to start playing again next season, but the doctors have told me that if I was to break it again, they wouldn't be as successful with the operation. It would be a possibility that I'd have a permanent limp, and it just isn't worth the risk. Besides, I think I was getting a bit old for the game anyway!"

It ends almost a decade of Nicholson playing for the same team, but he will no doubt stick around to support his mates.

In last week's game, Stuart Hodgson reverted to a dissimilar formation, consisting of a sweeper, two centre-backs, two attacking full-backs, three midfielders and two centre-forwards.

The new idea wasn't really given a chance to work, with a mud-pit of a field to play on and little enthusiasm in the Huntsman camp. But they managed to beat a rather poor side, with a performance that would bring shame to any half decent side.

Goalscorers were Wayne Marram, Martin Haigh, Chris Walker(2) and Jim McCabe.

Huntsman could make it two wins from two this Sunday, as they entertain Quaker Sports. Huntsman were 8-2 victors in this previous fixture, and this week should produce another three points for a team desperate to climb up the table.

Top goalscorer Morgan Fielding will be out off action for a least four weeks, it was revealed last weekend. After playing in the Sports Complex Thursday night league - he was taken to hospital with torn ligaments. It's a bitter blow for Huntsman, who often rely on his service for goals.

Meanwhile, Trainee Manager of the Huntsman pub, Andrew Deverell, will be leaving this week for the 'Coach and Horses' of Newcastle. The 22 year old is to undergo further training for his Managing course at the Newcastle pub.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRE TO BE OPENED

A new vocational training centre for Sedgefield District should be operational by the end of September 1996. Based at Couson Street, Spennymoor, it will replace the existing centre at Chilton and have a wide catchment area throughout the District. Building is scheduled to start in April 1996 and the cost including construction, furnishing and equipment will be around £600,000.

The centre will undertake the District Council's business technology and clerical training programmes and a range of vocational courses developed with local colleges, employers and other local training agencies.

The training centre is designed for a range of training activities and will also incorporate a resource centre with individual computer workstations for open learning, self tuition and interactive learning techniques.

The resource centre will be available to local businesses, colleges and individuals. It will be co-ordinated by the Council's college partners and provide a facility which is unique in the District.

A European grant of £221,000 has been obtained, along with funding from three local colleges. The balance of fur ling will be provided by the District Council.

Councillor Brian Stephens, Leader of Sedgefield District Council said "We believe the new centre will open up training opportunities for both the business community and individuals pursuing vocational training. It will also enable the Council to improve the training resources available to school leavers and unemployed people within the District".

ENGINEER FROM HYDRO WINS TOP AWARD



GRAEME FERGUSON, an engineer with Hydro Polymers at Newton Aycliffe, is presented with a National Training Award in the individual category from former England rugby star Rob Andrew.

"With training, personal commitment and the will to succeed you can realise your full potential."

Graeme's 12 hard years of further education have moved him from apprentice to graduate engineer. These years have demanded considerable sacrifice, not only in holding down a job while studying most of his spare time but, in the process, parting from his fiancé because he had so little time to spend with her. Nevertheless, Graeme is now employed in the responsible position of Instrument and Electrical Workshop Manager, where he is able to utilise many of the skills he has learned over the years.

When Graeme successfully obtained a four-year apprenticeship with Hydro Polymers, he considered himself particularly fortunate. He had left school at 15 with a handful of low-grade CSE's having failed all the O Levels he had taken. He realised that his casual and dismissive attitude to work, demonstrated at school, had to change and that he should make a severe effort at self-improvement.

As part of his craft/technician apprenticeship, Graeme was also enrolled on a BTEC ONC course in Industrial measurement and control. The first year was spent at South West Durham Training Centre, while the following years of study found Graeme based at Hydro Polymers and doing day-release studies.

The first year provided him with good grounding in engineering principles, but he had to work hard to keep up in academic subjects. He found the mathematics element of the course particularly difficult, and failed units of the maths exams at the end of the first and second year.

But the Prospects of failure spurted him to work harder and take extra tuition. In the last year of this four-year apprenticeship, 1987, with only one maths unit to complete for his ONC, he enrolled on an HNC to stretch himself further. This involved a day and a night a week, and many hours of personal study. Graeme also completed an HND in 1991, when he also realised

that his prospects of promotion could be hindered because of the influx of graduate engineers joining the company. He pushed for and was accepted on a degree course in Instrumentation and Control Engineering at Teesside Polytechnic. Despite the inevitable hardship of working a full week and studying every available spare hour, Graeme was triumphant in 1995 with the award of his Honours degree.

During the last two years, the knowledge and experience he gained through further and higher education have been utilised on several major projects that have benefited Hydro Polymers, repaying the long-term investment the company has made in Graeme.

DOCTORS TO **ESTABLISH** URGENT CARE CENTRE

s in Bishop Auckland area have decided to establish an Urgent e Centre to improve patient care outside of normal working This has been welcomed by County Durham Health Commission as a sensible and effective way to improve patient

care and to allow GPs to work more effectively. The Urgent Care Centre will provide out of hours cover for practices within a radius of Bishop Auckland of approximately eight miles, and it will be based at the Bishop Auckland General Hospital. This will give patients access to important facilities that would not be

tilable if GPs visited everyone at home. Ambulance transport to the centre will be provided for those people who do not have or cannot use their own transport.

This is part of a national trend to ease the enormous burden that the increasing number of night visits has put upon GPs (nationwide,

the number of night visits more than doubled between 1983 and 1993). Last year the Government agreed with the doctors' professional association, the British Medical Association, to make it possible for local GPs to develop their own solutions to this problem. One solution, which is being adopted in many parts of the country, is to establish Urgent Care Centres - a concept which, according to a national survey, is widely supported. Andrew Young, Executive Director at County Durham Health

Commission, said: "We welcome the decision by GPs in the Bishop Auckland area to act decisively in responding to what is a major national problem of increasing and unsustainable demand for night visits. This will also help the Commission's drive to attract more GPs to County Durham as we believe that in some areas recruitment may prove difficult unless arrangements for out of hours care can

The Urgent Care Centre will provide better, more comprehensive care and allow doctors to use their time more effectively in treating patients rather than visiting them at home in all cases. Those patients who cannot leave their home for any medical reason will still be seen by a GP who will be available with a vehicle and driver throughout the out of hours period."

Dr. Martin John, co-ordinator of the Urgent Care Centre, said: "We believe that the Urgent Care Centre will improve the quality and speed of care for people who are seriusly ill out of hours.'






