Social Services are in the process of purchasing two private houses in the area, one on the Byerley Park estate and the other in Greenfields with the intention of housing some of the residents from the home there.

My annoyance is that they have not had the courtesy to inform the residents of Horndale or the residents of the estates as to their plans and it is my intention to organise a massive public campaign against the Social Services policy which moves the men out of their stable environment in order that Horndale House can be turned into an office block for Social Services

# DISTRICT COUNCIL **GIVE £6,000** TO SET UP CRIME RING

Sedgefield District Council have agreed to donate £6000 to the Newton Aycliffe Police Station which is setting up a 'Crime Ring' computer system designed to reduce crime. Crime Ring, which is a computer databank into which is placed details of contacts and the times at which they can generally be contacted by telephone e.g. Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinators. The system allows for a spoken message to be given to the computer and transmitted to the contacts at the earliest opportunity. Once received the contact can give a message back to the computer, thus providing a two-way flow of information. A printer provides a log of calls whether received or not and gives reasons for unanswered calls. The system has two distinct function:-

transmission or first available opportunity. This would be used to transmit information quickly to contacts about a recent or ongoing incident.

b) Mailbox Facility - A group of people can be left messages so that when they ring in they can access the information. Some Police forces use this facility for their officers in outlying areas to contact the central station to access information. It can also be sued to give historical

The system has many applications including Neighbourhood watch, School watch, Pub Watch, Taxi Watch, Shop watch and Farm Watch. The system has also been used to circulate information about missing persons. Detective Chief Inspector Peart feels that "the main benefits to the people of Sedgefield District being in the area of total community safety" and the costs are "minimal compared to the benefits that could accrue to

# THE COST OF PERSONALISED **CAR NUMBER** PLATES

The Driver and Vehicle Licensing Agency has simplified the prices for its 'choose your own' personalised registration scheme with prices starting at £250 and the majority of marks available for under £400. There are two price bands; Premium for three letter combinations which spell attractive works or names such as BOB and SUE, and Standard for all other three letter combinations. Prices within each band are set at two levels according to the choice of numeric digit with the number '1' given a separate rate to all other available number combinations.

'N' prefix registrations start at £399 for Standard rate marks featuring any numberic character other than '1' which is priced at £999. Premium prices for 'N' marks begin at £699 with any number '1' mark priced at £1999.

All other prefix marks available, which comprise A, H, J, K, L and M, are priced at £250 and £500 respectively for the Standard rate and £399 and £999 for the Premium rate.

Prices include assignment fee of £80 and VAT. Prices for the DVLA's Classic Collection sales are set at auction and are not affected by the new price structure.

# EURO M.P. CALLS FOR **CHANGES IN** LAW ON

Stephen Hughes, Durham's Euro MP has called on the Council of Ministers to make changes to the EU Treaties at the inter-governmental conference this year in order to plug the many legal loop-holes and gaps which leave children vulnerable to abuse.

Mr. Hughes took up the case of a North East special needs boy who was sexually assaulted by his teacher on a school trip to Spain. The young boy was too frightened to say anything about the incident until he returned home, where he immediately told his mother what had happened. Astonishingly the police in the UK could do nothing.

Mr. Hughes wrote on behalf of the family to the Head of Public Prosecutions and to the Home Office. He was told by the Home Office that, "Our courts have no jurisdiction over acts of buggery or indecent assault committed abroad, and it was therefore not possible to prosecute (name omitted) for his alleged assault."

"It is generally not realised how existing national and community legislation can have unintended adverse effects on children," says Stephen Hughes.

The free movement of labour in the European Union means that men convicted of sexual offences against children can seek employment in child care establishments in other countries within the European Union without it being possible for the new employer to check with the police about a previous criminal record of the employee. Paedophiles are notorious for "targeting" their victims and are attracted to work in children's home and other places that give unrestricted access to children. Within the UK, we are able to check police records but there is no possibility of checking the records of applicants from other EU Countries. A mention of children in the revised Treaty would allow action to be taken to overcome these difficulties at European Union

Speaking today, Stephen Hughes said: -

"Children may be adversely affected by unintended consequences of such things as:- open frontiers, the free movement of people and changes in broadcasting and other communication technologies.

"Our experience tells us that it is not possible to put geographical boundaries on the well-being of children. Specific examples include the cross-border impact of the increasing breakdown of marriages and divorces within the EU, and the trans-national dissemination of child

We need to examine the impact of our actions or inaction at European level and set about including safeguards for the children of Europe.'
