

Safer Travel

Minibuses and coaches carrying three or more children will have to be fitted with seat belts from February 1997, Road Safety Minister Steven Norris announced this week. The "3 for 2" concession, which allows three children under 14 to sit in seats fitted with two seat belts, will end

Mr Norris said: "I believe these measures will further improve the good safety record of minibuses and coaches and will go a long way towards reassuring parents who may be concerned for the safety of their children when travelling in these vehicles.

"I am pleased that we have been able to introduce these measures independently and ahead of our partners in the European Union"

The minimum requirement will be for a lap belt to be fitted to each seat used by a child aged 3 to under 16.

Mr Norris said that regulations for fitting seat belts to all new minibuses and coaches, whether or not key are being used for carrying children, will be introduced as soon as the necessary agreement has been reached in Europe.

The regulations will apply to:

- minibuses used from 10th February 1997;

- coaches used from 10th February 1997, if they were registered from 1st October 1988.

- coaches used from 10th February 1998, if they were registered before 1st October 1988.

The timetable for fitting seatbelts in minibuses and coaches used for carrying children was decided following a consultation last year. This showed that there can be technical difficulties in fitting seat belts to some older coaches. Operators, therefore, have been given an additional year in which to fit seat belts to these vehicles.

NEW DIRECTOR APPOINTED TO BOARD

Car Con Returns

The Finance & Leasing Association (FLA) is very concerned that the plague of vehicle transfer agencies, whose activities in the past cost consumers millions of pounds, may be returning on a large scale. Vehicle transfer agencies operate by placing advertisements in the press to attract members of the public who have a car on hire purchase or lease and are having difficulty keeping up with keeping repayments.

In return for the car for which the company claims to have a buyer, it promises to pay off the outstanding debt. Research carried out by the FLA when vehicle transfer agencies came to the fore in the early 1990's revealed that in over 90 per cent of cases this did not happen. As a result the consumer is dealt a double blow. The finance company remains the owner of the car throughout the agreement and so even if someone has handed over their car, they are still liable to meet the payments. The law does not allow the liabilities to be transferred to a third party so the consumer is left without the car but still owing money.

Dissatisfied Golfers

"making a large profit". This being the case, why then, when I enquired about reduced rates for those people out of work, long term sick etc., was I told by a leading Councillor that "the money was not available to provide concessions"?

I was also informed that the Golf Complex was "modelled" on Stressholme Golf Golf Course at Darlington. They DO provide such a facility!

I am a current season ticket holder, and, because of health problems, I have been unable to play golf since September of last year.

This will not be a situation that will change in my case, and there are many more in the same boat

Because of the weather, the

banning of trollies when wet, etc., I cannot play till about April each year, so I am only getting six months for my full

Under the new system, Ladies are being allowed a reduced rate, and the situation could arise where dozens of Lady Golfers from outside the area can come along twelve months of the year and enjoy cheap golf. Nothing wrong with that, but I do think people like myself who pay taxes within the area, and therefore subsidise the course, should be considered first.

As a golfer of long standing at Aycliffe, I should advise the powers that be that there is a lot of dissatisfaction in their handling of the new system, and they would do well to take note and LISTEN to the people who play the game, and who will be paying their future fees, myself included. Contrary to rumours, I am not against the new system as such, however, there is room for improvement from which we will all gain in the long

CHANGES TO THE HEALTH AUTHORIT

The new Health Authority for County Durham was launched this week. The Health Authority is responsible for buying health services and planning improvements in health and health care for people living in the County. The new organisation combines purchasing and planning hospital and community services with developing family doctor services.

Following Government legislation the new organisation replaces the previous three Health Authorities, North and South Durham Health Authorities and the Durham Family Health Services Authority. Over the last two years the three Authorities Health operated as County Durham Health

Commission. The creation of a single Health Authority allows substantial greater reductions in management costs as there will be one chairman and five nonexecutive directors - a

reduction form three chairmen and 19 nonexecutive directors.

Dr. John Marshall, Chairman of County Durham Health Authority said: "The new Health Authority will face many challenges in ensuring that people in the County receive the best possible health care. These challenges include the development of services available locally in GP Surgeries, development of hospital services, reduction of waiting times for hospital treatment and tackling the problems of recruitment.

Tony Jameson, Chief Executive said: "The new Health Authority will continue to work closely with Health Professionals, Health Authorities, Community Health Councils and the voluntary and private sector to improve the health and well being of people living in the County.

The other evening at a Christian act of Worship, I was listening to the words of a song, "From A Distance". There was repeated the line: "God is watching us, from a distance"

At the moment, there is a great interest in things "Celtic". You have only to look in our local Christian Bookshop to see Celtic knotwork on cards, and I bought, this week, a lovely new book published locally, entitled "The Book of Escomb". It is a selection of prayers and texts in the Northumbrian tradition of illuminated

St. Cuthbert, one of our local and most revered of Celtic Christians would not have seen God as watching us "from a distance". For him, as for those early Christians, he was close at hand. One of the prayers in the book goes like this:

As the rain hides the stars, As the autumn mist hides the hills,

As the clouds veil the blue of the sky,

so the dark happenings of my lot hide the shining of thy

face from me.

Yet if I may hold thy hand in the darkness it is enough
...... since I know that though I may stumble in my going THOU dost not fall.

"Holding thy hand" is not God from a distance, but a God near at hand. The true Christian meaning of Easter is about God, made flesh in Jesus, coming to save and help the world, and also Me, hence the words from St. John's Gospel......

God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him, should not perish

but have everlasting life.

So, do join with other Christians this Eastertide as we celebrate God with us in Jesus our Risen Lord, for as the writer of the Acts of the Apostles says......

for He is not far from each one of us, for in Him we live

and move, in Him we exist.

Samuel Medley in his Easter Hymn puts it this way:



Letter Please Keep Calm

Dear Sir,

As one of the many townsfolk who took an active role in the campaign to stop the Labour Councillors from twice trying to close Greenfield Comprehensive School, I would appeal to all parties to keep calm regarding the provision of a 5-a-side football pitch, arts centre and sports hall.

The residents of the Greenfield Estate have every right to express their concerns on the effect the complex would have on their properties. I attended two public meetings and on both occasions found the residents to be well mannered and orderly when expressing their concerns. At no time during the meeting did anyone object to the school having the facilities. Quite a number of families have children who attend the school. The unanimous concern was the nearness of the floodlit 5-a-side football pitch to their homes.

Sedgefield Council, as the planning authority, have received a petition and letters requesting that the pitch be moved to the south side of the school premises.

I would ask that the matter now be left to the Planning Committee to deliberate



Letter to the Editor **40 HOURS** OF NOISE POLLUTION

I feel compelled to write in response to Mr. Dorkin's letter in last weeks Newton News as my perception of the Greenfield School Expansion plan is somewhat different. I would like Mr. Dorkin to know that originally only 7 residents were informed of the plans to expand at the school and that the Steering Committee only took the initiative to modify their existing plans after pressure was brought to bear by the local residents at a Public Meeting organised by Councillor Tony Moore. The modifications only go

part way to addressing our concerns. You can improve the look of the pitch as much as you want, plant trees, turn it round but the main problem, which none of these amendments will contain, is the noise form the enthusiastic players and supporters. Furthermore, you fail to mention that the pitch is the size of 3 tennis courts, therefore 3 five-a-side games can be played at once, and that the pitch will be available for 40 hours per week, that is every evening and every weekend. Of course, if you live at the other side of town you can enjoy the benefits of the Centre without having any of the aggravation.

Although it is true that the Centre did invite a resident to attend the Steering Committee Meeting, you did not mention that the first meeting to which this representative has been invited is not until 27th April, by which time the Planning Committee will have met and made its decision. The time to invite a resident onto the Committee would surely have been at the beginning of the project not at the end.

There are over a hundred people on the estate who are concerned about the all weather sports pitch and who have declared their support to re-site the pitch to the south side of the school. If the Steering Committee are so confident that they have fully considered the residents of the estate and have every confidence in their proposals, why do they feel the necessity to gather further support form local industry and residents of the town?

Finally, in response to Councillor Bergg, I would like to say that if the 'powers that be' fully thought through the consequences of the projects they support, then perhaps there would be less of the 'not in my backyard' attitude. I resent the fact that, after paying a fair proportion of Council Tax to the Town Council, no consideration has been given to the affect the expansion to the Greenfield Centre will have on the nearby residents. We may only constitute a small part of the ommunity, but we have the right to fair representation. The disadvantages to the community should be fully considered. Although there may not be any weight in your opinion to the protester's

arguments as far as planning considerations are concerned, surely there is an environmental issue which need to be addressed, i.e. NOISE POLLUTION.

Feel free Councillor Bergg to place the sports pitch 150 yards from your backyard, because quite honestly I do not want it in mine. I too am interested in education and use the facilities at the school, but at least my pursuits do not disturb or cause stress to my neighbours.

The proper place for an all weather sports pitch for 40 hours community use is at the Leisure Complex and not in the immediate vicinity of a local housing estate. In my opinion the Town Council has every right to be a little embarrassed that they have gone ahead with their support for a project that may well have a detrimental effect on the well being of the local residents.

Drivers who smoke in their cars may find selling them a drag, says the AA.

Lighting up behind the wheel could make all the difference between the easy sale of a car, and being lumbered with a "mobile ashtray" that is difficult - and expensive - to get rid of, according to AA research carried out for No Smoking Day (13 March). "Around 10 million second-

hand cars change hands every year," says John Anderson, the AA's Consumer Affairs Manager, "but most used-car buyers want smoke-free models, sometimes refusing even to look at those previously owned by

smokers. The AA asked used-car dealers for their views on puffing on the move. All agreed that "smoking" cars are harder to sell, and that resale values can be considerably less than those of "clean" vehicles, particularly if the previous owners smoked heavily. In the words of one dealer: "It's the first thing some customers ask about. "It can be costly and timeconsuming to clean up a smoky car," says Anderson. "Around £70 for a full valet. which takes about five hours
