Plans to give Aycliffe Industrial Park a facelift were launched this week with the award of Sedgefield District Council's first Environmental

The grant has been introduced to encourage external improvements to older buildings on the Park and the District Council's first award of £30,000 to Industrial Estates (Scotland) Limited will be to improve the appearance and surroundings of the former UMM building at the entrance to the Park. The award to IES is for external cladding, landscaping, fencing, resurfacing and a new traffic management scheme.

Owners, owner occupiers and tenants of pre 1975 buildings, particularly on the main routes through the Park, are being urged to apply for the grant. Projects can include building elevation improvements, for example cleaning brickwork or recladding facades, and improved boundaries including gatehouses and barriers, new fencing, walls and railings. Landscaping, car parking and traffic management schemes can also be eligible, for a grant.

Councillor Terry Ward, Chairman of Sedgefield District Council, Development Committee said, "We hope that companies will take advantage of the new grant and upgrade the appearance of their older buildings. We have some help from the European Regional Devolvement Fund and will operate the grant as a pilot scheme in 1996/ 97. If it's successful, we should like to extend it for two more years".

The new Club's first League match will take place in the week beginning 8th May, and the first Youth Competition will be held on 29th May, as part of the Sedgefield District Council Festival of Life celebrations.

Bob Fleming said: "This is a wonderful start to the new Oak Leaf Golf Club, and I am delighted that the first meeting showed good will on all sides. Now the Committee can get on with the business of building a successful club."



VOLUNTEERS HAVE NO RIGHTS

Dear Editor.

I have been a volunteer at a local town centre charity shop since it opened just over seven years ago. For the last three years as a volunteer I have suffered from an illness called depression. I continued to work during my illness as it was of great help to me and I thought of my fellow volunteers as fiends. I except that at times they may have found my depression difficult to deal with as it is so misunderstood, but on my worst days I did not go to work.

During this period I was never told that my depression was causing any kind of problems. Then in February of this year I informed the shop that I would not be into work for a while as my mother was terminally ill. When I did return to the shop on two separate occasions I was suddenly told I was unfit to

I could not believe what was happening and contacted the Area Manager to hear what she had to say, she also stated that I was unfit to work. I have written to the Regional Manger but so far have had no reply. As a volunteer I have no legal rights and as someone with a mental health problem

So I can take no further action. I just want the people involved to know what they have done to me, because since the incident my mother has died.

The shop was an important part of my life and I cannot understand why I have been treated in such a way. I have lost my trust in people and now feel very lonely and isolated. They did not even contact me after my mothers death to offer a few kind words of sympathy.

Depression is such a misunderstood illness and sufferers can be made to suffer more though thoughtless actions. People in many walks of life suffer from depression and it does not mean they are insane, unintelligent or have no feelings. I and other sufferers just need some understanding and support in a time of crisis. So I hope the people I worked with realize

what an effect they have had on my life, and I only hope they can learn something from their actions.



NEW TOWN PIONEERS RETURN



Geoff and Enid Mackey who, after living in Devon for the last 10 years have returned to Newton Aycliffe to be near family and friends. They had previously lived on the town for 34 years, Enid coming as a schoolgirl with her parents in the early 50's. Many residents will remember her as secretary of "The Avenue" from 1970-1986. Geoff's work took them to Devon in 1986. They decided a couple of years ago that they would eventually return to the North East and the closure in August of the firm Geoff worked for, gave them the incentive to return and they arrived in time

for the birth of their first

grand-child.

completed a business course at Morton Park Business Training Centre and Geoff has now started his own business as a quality glass engraver offering a service of individually drawn designs enabling the customer to receive work produced to exact requirements. He has been engraving glass for over twelve years. He engraves by hand using diamond burrs in a dental type drill and also uses diamond and tungsten points. Either clear or coloured glass can be engraved to use light to create work of great interest and beauty in this unique medium. During his years in Devon Geoff furthered his glass engraving skills by joining the Guild of Glass Engravers as a Lay Member as the primary aims of the Guild are to promote the highest quality of creative design craftsmanship. He attended many engraving courses, which were practical tutorials in the many differing aspects of glass engraving. He also attended courses in Calligraphy - a very important element of his work. In 1991 he submitted pieces

of engraved glass for assessment and received high marks and became an Assessed Craft Member of the Guild of Glass Engravers. The Crafts Council invited him to

register with them and he is in their directory of quality craftsmen. From 1990-93 he was secretary of the South West of England Branch of the Guild and helped to organise a large exhibition of engraved glass held in the Bishop's

Palace at Wells, Somerset One of his first commissions has been an engraving of Trimdon Church on an oblong glass tablet for our local M.P. Tony Blair. A glass plaque commemorating the opening of a new silica glass factory is his latest piece to be Geoff completed. demonstrated his skill recently in the Library for their Arts Week and Morrisons at Morton Park have asked for photographs of his work that they can enlarge and display

in their building.

Over the years his commissions have varied from wedding, birthday and special occasions lettering to pictures of birds, animals, yachts, buildings, churches and individual houses. He also engraves crests, club and military badges, society emblems and logo's on glasses and tankards. A lot of his work has been for special presentations nationally and internationally the latter being in other languages such as French, Dutch, German and Polish. The last commissions he completed before leaving Devon were a series of glasses for the Bugatti Owners Club and a special bowl engraved with lettering in Polish to be presented to the Polish Ambassador.

If you don't get a tax return, it won't affect you directly. From now on you must keep records so that you can fill-in a tax return if you get one.
