MEN SUFFER DISCRIMINATION ON TOWN'S GOLF COURSE

Dear Sir,

May I, hopefully once and for all, correct the ramblings of some of our local Councillors, and lay to rest the on-going saga of what is taking place on the local golf course. I am sure the local people who subsidise it would like to know the truth.

In a recent "Front Page Letter" (w/e 11th May), Councillor Locklyn states that, "because the course is Council run, there cannot be seen to be any form of discrimination". He has obviously got hold of the wrong end of the stick. The people who are being discriminated against are not the Lady Members, but MEN. How can it be that one group of people who have exactly the same access to the course, and the same playing rights, pay £65 less than another group, and the Council claim there is no discrimination!

He mentions the reduced fees for Juniors. The original Club, some time ago, reduced their Club fees to £5 for Juniors and, with the help of a local teacher, who happens to be a County Golfer, almost begged the Council to reduce the Course fees for Juniors from £90, which at the time was the highest in the county. All to no avail, until they form their "own" club, and

these things are no longer a problem. As to there being no Lady Members when the old Club was forced off the course, in the early 1980's when I joined that Club, the numbers were made up of 10% of Lady Members, which is a much higher proportion than they have today. There were several reasons why the Ladies Section disbanded, not the least being the fact that the Council, despite numerous requests, did not see fit to get the Ladies Tees properly measured. This has, of course, now been done. I cannot close without commenting of the fact that the Council is claiming that they have 400 Members. This is totally misleading to the public, as what they have is 400 season ticket holders, several of whom were not aware when purchasing a ticket, that they did not have to join the club. As a club they have no more members taking part in events than the

old Club, whose members at least used the bar facilities afterwards! 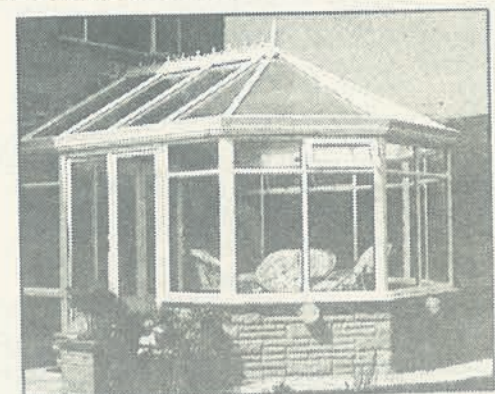

OBITUARY Win Dormer



It is with great sadness we report the sudden death of Win Dormer, one of the town's most respected public figures. Win, who was 68 years old, collapsed at a Civic function she and her husband John were attending in Consett, last Monday night. Win was rushed to Shotley Bridge Hospital where she later died.

The Dormers moved to Newton Aycliffe in the late 50's and quickly became involved in community life, serving as Councillors and on numerous committees.

Win had the distinction of being Newton Aycliffe's first Mayor when it achieved Township status in 1974.

She served for many years as a School Governor at the Woodham Comprehensive and Vane Road Primary School. Both Headteachers have expressed their deep shock at the news and paid tribute to her contribution to their schools' life.

Her jovial and witty personality endeared her to all she met. Her presence and support will be sorely missed by the various organisations to which she belonged.

25 years loyal service to the Labour Party was recognised with an award by Tony Blair last April, soon after he became Leader of the Party. He commented on Win's dedication and hardwork for the community.

From the Mayor Counc. John Moran . . .

"As the newly elected Mayor of Great Aycliffe it was with great sadness I learned of the tragic and sudden death of my colleague Win Dormer. Her involvement in the political and social life of Newton Aycliffe was well known, and though she came from the south of England her first love was for this town and its residents, whom she served faithfully throughout her period in public office. The shockwaves which will be felt by her death will not become truly apparent until the amount of work and commitment she gave is missed by her absence. On behalf of the residents Mary and myself extend our sincere condolences to John and his family at this sad and distressing time."

From the Town Clerk John Farquhar . . .

Although Win Dormer achieved high office she was the type of political figure who went about her duties in a quiet, efficient and unassuming manner. She never set out to further her career, but rather to dedicate herself for the benefit of the townspeople. Over the many years of our association she became more a friend than a political colleague and during the 1970's as the Leader of the Council she was able to steer the Authority in the right direction to achieve its aims. Her statesmanship-like qualities will be a loss to both the Council and the Labour Party and whilst Win is no longer with us, the achievements and warm affection which was felt for her, throughout the town, will live on as a tribute to her memory."

A Civic Service will be held on Tuesday 28th May at St. Clares Church at 11.30 p.m. followed by a private interment at Newton Aycliffe Cemetery.

"Newton News" extends sincere condolences to John and the family on behalf of the community Win served so admirably.

We share the family's grief and hope Newton Aycliffe's appreciation of Win's contribution to its development will be of some comfort in their bereavement.

During his recreational time his hobbies include golf, reading biography's and going to the theatre.

As the Town approaches its 50th Anniversary he sees it as a gateway to new opportunity. His principle aim is to, at least, set in motion improvements to the town centre and to formulate some future plans for the former Avenue Comprehensive School site which he sees as an ideal opportunity for a new beginning for the town as it approaches the Millennium.

A BETTER PIZZA ALL ROUND

BLACK COMEDY TO BE STAGED AT SPENNYMOOR LEISURE CENTRE



For the theatre goes in the North East, **NOT THE NATIONAL THEATRE** is bringing Simon Block's black comedy **"NOT A GAME FOR BOYS"** to Spennymoor Leisure Centre on Saturday, 8th June.

With enormous humour and

understanding, the play explores responsibility, dwindling ambition and competitive obsessions, as seen through a game of ping-pong.

"Not a Game for Boys" is a comedy set in the deserted bar of a shabby North London Table Tennis Club. A team of three London Cab Drivers, Eric, Oscar and Tony, are playing a crucial match to maintain their place in the premier division.

As the tension builds, and the match moves towards its climax, the mood swings between hilarious black comedy and moments of poignant drama, as each character faces a personal crisis.

In August 1995, "Not a Game for Boys" opened in London to unanimous critical acclaim.

WARNING AS FRANCE REDUCES DRINK-DRIVE LIMIT

The AA is warning British motorists travelling to France that the drink-drive limit has again been reduced - to 50 milligrams of alcohol per 100 millilitres of blood. The UK limit is 80 milligrams.

It is the second time in as many years that the French limit has changed. In 1994 it dropped from 80mg to 70mg; now, with a limit of 50mg, France comes into line with Belgium, Bulgaria, Greece, the Netherlands, Norway, Portugal and Turkey.

"British drivers who start their holidays with a few drinks on the ferry could easily put themselves over the limit for driving in France," says Andrew Howard, AA Head of Road Safety. "The rule is simple: if you're driving, don't drink ANY alcohol."

Blood-alcohol limits are unchanged in other countries: 80mg in Austria, Denmark, Germany, Italy, Luxembourg,

Spain and Switzerland; 2 in Poland and Sweden; ZERO in Finland, Hungary and Romania.

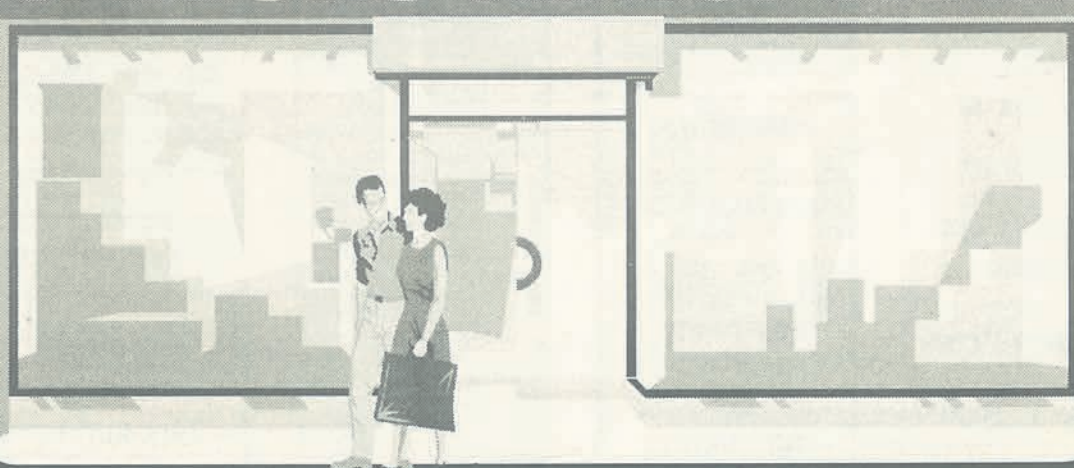

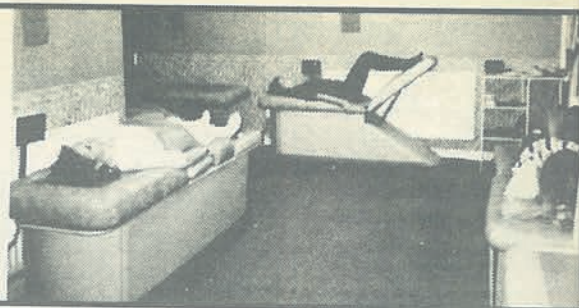
