FRONT PAGE LETTER

"AYCLIFFE TOWN CENTRE IS DYING ON ITS FEET"

Dear Sir

I read with great sadness in your columns about the demise of more good quality Town Centre shops. I particularly regret the passing into history of "Kookies Cafe", as I found the staff very friendly and there was always a good atmosphere there.

A high quality shop like "Escom" is also a grave loss to the shopping area which visitors to the town must think is dying on its feet.

It all boils down to ignoble capitalistic charlatans in London who I think are below the lowest form of parasite. These greedy, avaricious cretins are systematically destroying the whole fabric of Aycliffe Town Centre.

They should hang their heads and inflated egos in shame as they are sounding the death of knell of the area. The only thing that Aycliffe has going for it now is free car parking!

The findings of pupils at Stephenson Way Primary School are depressing - not one shopper questioned would stay in the town to go on a shopping spree. This is a pathetic and scandalous situation.

I take issue with your statement that Newton Aycliffe is the second largest town in the County.

Darlington, of course is the largest, but Bishop Auckland has about 32,000 people compared with Aycliffe's 25,000.

A quick look around at the shopping facilities in other nearby towns is a real eye-opener.

Take Ferryhill, about

half the size of Aycliffe, which has an excellent mix of shops for a place of its size and puts Aycliffe to shame.

Even Barnard Castle with a population of little more than 5,000 has a thriving little Town Centre.

It also has that old-fashioned, indefinable charm which Aycliffe lacks in abundance.

Personally, I find the Town Centre a soulless place, probably because it has no fulcrum or focal point.

Compare Aycliffe with Northallerton, admittedly North Yorkshire's County town, but it still has a population less than half of Aycliffe's at just over 10,000.

Town Centre planners should take a leaf out of its book. Northallerton's list of quality shops is seemingly endless: Bakers, Lewis & Cooper, Woolworths, Dressers, Gateway, B & Q, Wm Low and Sons etc.

There would be plenty of room for Aycliffe to expand if it went out to the former Avenue School site and the Youth Centre.

Admittedly, it would mean the demolition of some buildings and compensation settlements, but in 1996 there is nothing to entice

the bargain-hungry shopper to what is fast becoming a shoppers wasteland.

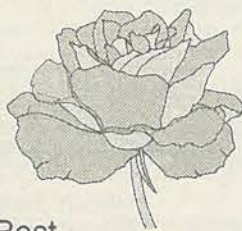

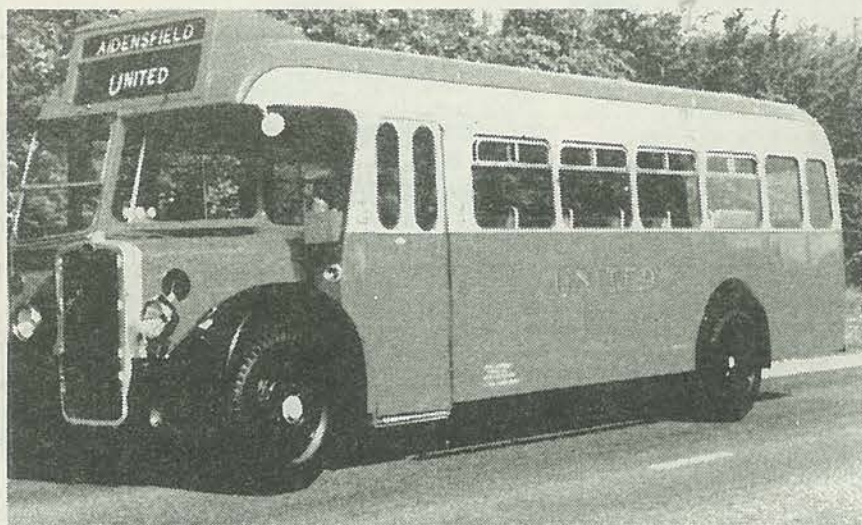

Calling all "Heartbeat" fans - the Newton Aycliffe Scouts Supporters Association will be holding a fete on the 20th July 1996 at its Headquarters in Bluebell Way, and are pleased to announce the arrival of one of the heavyweight stars of one of the new series. NOMINATE A VOLUNTEER FOR AN AWARD

A new partnership between the UK's two leading award schemes for volunteers was launched in England on Friday 31st May 1996 - at the opening of Volunteers week.

The Whitbread and Make a Difference Volunteering Awards are a joint venture between the Whitbread Volunteer Action Awards, which recognise individual volunteers, and the Government's Make a Difference Awards, which recognise volunteering groups, to create a definitive award scheme covering all elements of volunteering.

The Whitbread Volunteer Action Awards have been running for 14 years and have attracted hundreds of nominations annually from supporters of Britain's 21 million volunteers. Make a Difference is a major Government initiative launched in 1994 to promote voluntary involvement in the community and ensure that voluntary activity continues to be seen as an essential and enduring feature of modern society. The Prime Minister launched the first Make a Difference Awards in September last year.

Run in association with The Volunteer Centre, the National Volunteer Development Agencies of Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, and the National Youth Agency, the Awards will offer £25,000 in prize money. This is divided between separate Whitbread and Make a Difference winners in seven English regions, together with Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland: two special youth awards made to a young individual and group involving young volunteers: a Whitbread Changemakers Award given to a young person or group of people working together as part of a school or college project: and overall UK individual and group winners.

Individual winners will receive £1,000, half for the cause for which they were nominated and half to be spent at their discretion. Winning organisations will receive £1,000 to be used for developing volunteering in their organisation. The overall winners chosen from all the categories, will receive a further £1,000 to be used in the same way.

As well as the financial prizes, winning a Whitbread and Make a Difference Volunteering Award helps to promote and publicize the work carried out by the individual or group.

Whitbread's 1995 Volunteer of the Year, Jakara Islam, who supports the Bangladesh Youth League points out: "Since winning the award, individuals and organisations are much more aware of the nature of the depth of the services provided by the organisation and myself. As a result, the organisation has received increased funding and I have found paid employment". Sarah Benioff from Dalston Youth Project, the 1995 UK winner for the Make a Difference Award said: "We were thrilled to receive the award. It proved really helpful in recruiting more volunteers and in raising much needed additional funds for our work."

National Heritage Secretary, Virginia Bottomley said: "The Government actively supports volunteering in this country and aims to encourage others to give volunteers the profile and credibility they deserve. If you know a volunteer or an organisation or group involving volunteers who deserves formal recognition for the contribution being made to their communities, please nominate them."

Entries for this year's awards must be received by 27th September 1996. Independent panels of judges select the winners who will be invited to a presentation ceremony in London at the end of the year.

Letter to the Editor PRAISE FOR SCHOOL ON TOWN CENTRE SHOPS SURVEY

Dear Sir,
I was very interested to read your two articles about the falling retailing standards available to our town's residents and must admit to agreeing with the sentiments expressed.

The information collected by the children of Stephenson Way School was not only very informative but also a realistic exercise for them in data gathering from the adult world.

A hearty well done to the enterprise of the children and their teacher! I think everyone in Newton Aycliffe is concerned about the problems we all have to tolerate when we need to buy anything special for ourselves or our homes.

There is one misconception arising from the information presented however, when you reported the deficiencies in the range of shops available to us - "Other shops identified as lacking included: food shops, gift shops, music shops and DIY Stores."

There is in fact a very good DIY shop to the rear of the Town Centre on Greenwell Road - Homeplan DIY. This shop not only competes in terms of price with the 'big boys' like Dickens and B&Q but they also stock an extensive range of goods - and offer a free local delivery service, as well as advice and help with DIY projects.

I have been shopping at Homeplan since it opened in the Town Centre proper in 1987. Bob, the first owner moved the shop to its present site, not only in response to rising rents, to allow him to maintain price competitiveness but also to allow better access for loading and unloading bulky DIY materials - the shop is surrounded by free car parks.

I hope that you are able to rectify this reporting oversight and give credit to one little shop that is still providing a competitive and helpful service to all of our residents.

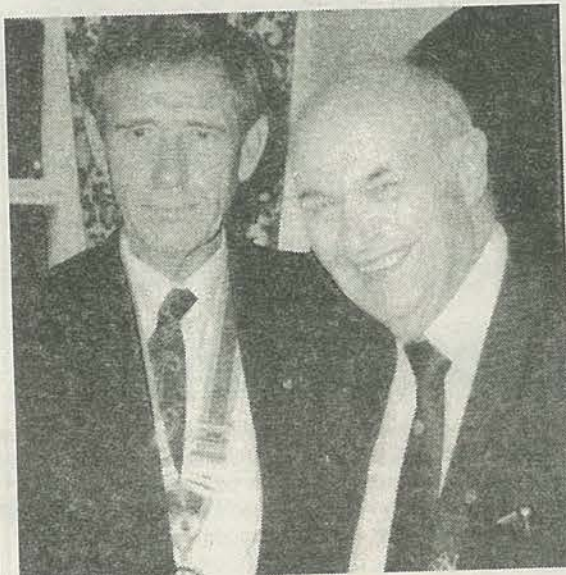

FINES FOR SLOW PAYERS PROPOSED BY EURO M.P.

The European Parliament this week backed a Labour proposal, strongly supported by local Labour Euro MP Stephen Hughes, for legal penalties for companies that pay their bills late.

The proposal, penned by Labour Euro MP Lyndon Harrison, calls for legally binding rules including a statutory right to interest on payments made late.

Stephen Hughes, Labour Euro MP for Blaydon and Durham said "Late payments cause big cash flow problems for small businesses and have driven many firms to the wall. Late payments are responsible for throwing far too many workers onto the dole. With more and more British firms doing business with companies in other EU countries this is a problem which requires a European solution."

But the plan supported by Stephen Hughes for legally binding European rules on late payments clashes with the European Commission's proposal for a non-binding recommendation to member states. Stephen Hughes wants the European Parliament to

stick to its guns and persuade the European Commission to replace its weaker stance in favour of Labour MEP's tougher plan for an enforceable Directive.

He said "There is an urgent need for rules backed by the force of law. Recommendations will just be ignored." Stephen Hughes added "The money tied up in late payments could generate many new jobs if only the money could be released."

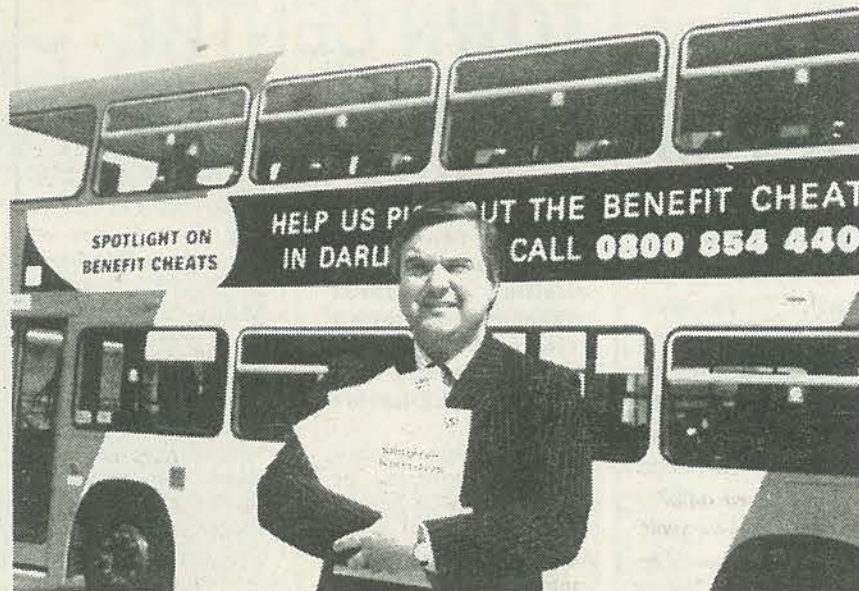

REPORT FRAUDS WHO CHEAT US OUT OF £MILLIONS



OLIVER HEALD MP, Social Security Fraud Minister, launches the 'Operation Spotlight' clamp-down on benefit cheats in the Darlington, Newton Aycliffe and Teesdale Areas on his visit to Darlington last week.

"Spotlight On Benefit Cheats", the anti-benefit fraud campaign will be focusing on Darlington and the Newton Aycliffe and everyone is urged to co-operate in stopping the millions of pounds it costs the ratepayer each year.

Oliver Heald, the Social Security Fraud Minister announced this as the twenty first area to be targeted in a campaign which will extend to other parts of the UK over the next few months.

Some recent cases which have come to light in our area include:

- * Four men renovating a house were found to be working whilst receiving benefits, primarily Income Support. *Benefit savings amounted to around £12,500;*
- * An exercise involving local police and Benefits Agency fraud investigators led to a raid on a new construction site, where people were working while receiving benefits, mainly Income Support. Eleven people were interviewed, resulting in *benefit savings of almost £17,000;*
- * An exercise mounted by traffic police and other agencies involved checking vans, and produced *benefit savings of £28,000.* These primarily involved people claiming Income Support and Unemployment Benefit;
- * A joint operation between Benefits Agency and Contributions Agency investigators revealed a person who was receiving Income Support while running a double glazing business. *Benefit savings amounted to more than £7,000.*

Extending the 'Spotlight' campaign, Mr. Heald said: "Benefit fraud across the country costs the taxpayer some **£3 billion a year.**"

Benefit fraud is a particularly selfish crime. Every pound lost through fraud is a pound that could be going to those in genuine need.

"Intensive publicity alerting local people to the new campaign will begin this week. 'Spotlight' aims to encourage those who have drifted into abusing the benefit system to report any changes in circumstances and put their claims right."

"Overpayments will be pursued as a matter of course but the fact that someone has come forward will be one of the factors taken into account when weighing up whether to take prosecution action, in particular for a minor offence."

"In just four weeks, 'Spotlight' in Haringey and Enfield netted £3.1 million, over half of last year's annual fraud savings total of £5.6 million in that area. Results from other Spotlight areas are similarly striking. Less than three months after the start of action in the first Spotlight areas, we estimate over £22 million in fraudulent benefit payments have been stopped."

"After two weeks of intensive local publicity to warn people to put their affairs in order, a crackdown will begin involving:

- * a "freephone" hotline number - 0800 854 440 - to tell DSS staff in confidence about suspected fraud;
- * local data-matching exercises to identify cases meriting investigation;
- * special drives on types of employers and self-employed likely to be involved in benefit fraud;
- * higher profile for Housing Benefit fraud, particularly where landlords may be involved;
- * extra home visits on new and existing claimants.

"Let me stress that the choice of Darlington area does not mean it has a particularly high level of fraud - indeed, fraud levels are broadly similar around the country, and this campaign will be targeting many other parts of the UK in the coming months. They were selected simply because they are compact areas where the DSS and other Agencies are geared up for this project."

The Benefits Agency detected more than £700m of fraud across the country last year. Fraud investigators are set to achieve savings of over £1 billion in 1995/96. The amount of fraud savings in Darlington in 1995/96 was about £3.6 million.

Local Villages Receive Generous Lottery Grants

Flourishing amateur dramatics groups in the villages of Bradbury and Mordon have gained a new multi-purpose hall, with facilities fit for a professional theatre, thanks to a £63,500 National Lottery Arts Council grant.

Mordon Village Hall has

thrown open its doors to the public for the first official viewing, with 80-year old Harry Young - the man responsible for the first village hall - as the guest of honour. The original hall began life as three army huts, which were cobbled together in 1947 to form a well-used community

facility which - as well as a social centre - doubled as a polling station and a church.

Functions have changed - quiz nights, yoga classes, and the renowned village pantomime are now the order of the day - but the village hall remains equally central to the local community.

COULD YOU HOST A FOREIGN STUDENT FOR A YEAR?

Youngsters from 20 different countries have been selected to come to Britain to take part in an International Student Exchange Programme organised by the Educational Foundation for Foreign Study, a world wide non-profit organisation whose aim is to promote international understanding by giving youngsters between 16 and 18 the opportunity to participate in an International Cultural Exchange Programme.

The youngsters are here not only to improve their English but to learn about our culture and way of life. They do this by living with a British family, as part of that family - not a guest or a lodger - and attending a British school.

The programme has been running in England for the past 10 years, Britain has offered to host 200 students, almost double last years figure of 116, and are hoping that, once again, the people of the North East will open their homes and welcome about 30 youngsters and once again show the rest of the country that our hospitality is the best. Every year since the programme began the people of this area have responded more positively than any other area in Britain, and Newton Aycliffe people have been wonderful at rallying to a plea for help. Last year 5 families in Aycliffe hosted youngsters, and 4 have already come forward to host again - one family for the eighth time. However, if a few more people could come forward and offer to help a youngster that would be magnificent, and I'm sure the families would get a lot of enjoyment out of having a new member of their family. I'm sure that once again the people from this area will come forward to show that not only are we the most hospitable and friendly area of the country but most internationally minded. It is hoped that young people from as far afield as Japan, Scandinavia, South America, Holland, USA, Canada, Hong Kong and Germany will make this community truly international.

Time is running out -

Although they are not due to come to their families until the beginning of September most must have a family willing to host them by the end of this month or they will not be able to come and their dreams will be shattered. To be selected they must complete very detailed applications, submit school grades and references, some are selected for interview and are interviewed in both their own language and English as their English must be of a reasonably good standard as they must take on a full curriculum at school. Some will also have a written test. The lucky ones are then selected. - Just think how disappointed they will be after surviving the trauma of all this only to find at the last minute they can not come because there isn't a family willing to host them.

Could you help? - Host families are volunteers and come from all walks of life, it is not essential to have children of your own - often a

host family's children have grown up and left home and they miss having youngsters around the place. All we require is that a family provides a bed and an extra place at their table and most important a friendly caring atmosphere in which a youngster can feel safe and happy. The students have their own pocket money for personal effects, bus fares, entertainment and clothes. I'm sure that Aycliffe people will want to show true North Eastern hospitality and open up their homes and their hearts to these youngsters once they know about the programme and how the dreams of these youngsters are depending upon them.

Families choose - Local voluntary co-ordinator Gloria Williams would match up family and student interests and the families will be given information about several students and they choose the student they think will fit into their way of life. The youngsters go to local schools or 6th form colleges and this is all organised by your local co-ordinator, who is there all year to help with any questions or give advice.

Last week many tears were shed as this years students departed for their home countries as they had truly become "One of the family", many calling their host parents "MAM and DAD". Some families are already planning a holiday at their new "sons or daughters" and all students want to come back to their second home.

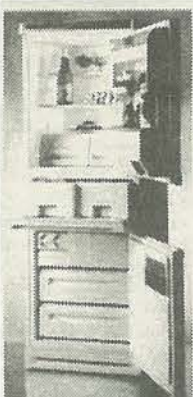

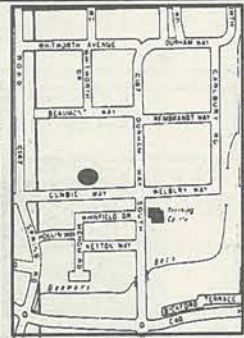

BREAKTHROUGH IMMINENT ON EARLY DIAGNOSIS OF ALZHEIMERS DISEASE

Research into Alzheimer's disease is on the brink of developing techniques for early diagnosis and treatment which could give people five more years of quality life, says Professor Jim Edwardson of Newcastle General Hospital's Neurochemical Pathology Unit. Professor Edwardson said,

"At the moment there are around 10 classes of drugs being developed or in clinical trials which offer real hope for the future".

"And because there is increased understanding of the genetic basis for the disease and more detailed brain scans have just been

developed, we are very optimistic that treatments that could halt the worst effects of this devastating disease will become available in the next decade".

One of the world's leading experts on Alzheimer's disease, Dr. Zavan Khachaturian from the Ronald and Nancy Reagan Institute in the USA, will join Professor Edwardson in the North East during this year's Alzheimer's Awareness Week to discuss the dramatic recent developments aiding research into the disease, such as Dr. Nick Fox's 3D brain scan.

A carer from the region will be present to talk openly about their experiences of looking after a person suffering from Alzheimer's disease. Representatives from local branches will also be attending to give more locally focused information relating to the work of the Society.

Alzheimer's Awareness Week (7th to 13th July) Opening the Mind aims to raise public awareness and understanding of Alzheimer's research, highlight the need for more funds for research, and counter the prejudices, misunderstandings and fears about dementia that still exists.

Holiday Scheme for Disabled Children

Throughout the scheme volunteers assist the children in a variety of activities including play sessions, outings, swimming and soft play. The Scheme is fun and rewarding as well as giving people valuable experience in working with children.

Volunteers need to be aged over 15, have a caring attitude, enjoy working with children and can commit themselves to one or more days during the scheme.
