COUNCILS CAN SAVE EMILLIONS ON POINTLESS ADVERTISING

Moves by Durham County Council to cut the costs - and the red tape - involved in publishing statutory notices could result in more than £1m worth of savings for local authorities throughout the Country.

Present legislation requires highway authorities to publish notices of any permanent road traffic regulation order in local newspapers and the London Gazette, both before and after the order is made.

These publishing requirements account for a substantial element of the overall costs of making an order.

The orders in question are those made by County Councils, Metropolitan Authorities, London Boroughs and the new Unitary Authorities under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and include those restricting or prohibiting waiting by vehicles, imposing weight restrictions, introducing residents' parking schemes,

Coun. Ken Manton, Chairman of the Authority's Highways and Transportation Sub-Committee and its representative on the Association of County Councils' Environment Committee said that in recent years the Council had questioned the requirement to advertise orders relating to County Durham in the London Gazette. "I estimate that at present it costs us around £17,000 a year to comply with the requirement, and local authorities throughout the country a combined total of around £1.5m," he added.

"However, following our latest approach earlier this year, we have now learned that the Department of Transport has secured Ministerial approval to lay regulations before Parliament which will remove the need to advertise in the London Gazette," he added.

"We very much welcome this development. The County Council makes a considerable number of orders each year and the proposed changes will result in savings of some 30% on overall advertising costs involved in making road

"Highway Authorities through the country will also benefit from the move and hopefully it will not be too long before the regulations are laid before Parliament and become effective."

Coun. Manton said it was understood that the existing provisions would be replaced by a requirement for local authorities to consult more widely with national bodies, although the requirement to advertise in local newspapers would continue.

Sedgefield District Council are also saving money in this department, bypassing the requirement to spend £1,000's on large expensive statutory notices in the regional newspaper. Realising these notices are not getting to the right people they now take much less advertising space informing everyone the full details are printed in their own Magazine "Inform" and available at the Council

VISUAL ARTS EXHIBITION

Another major exhibition in the Year of Visual Arts 1996 opens at Darlington Arts Centre. Images From Landscape by Peter Hicks goes on show at the Myles Meehan Gallery on Saturday 14th September until Saturday 2nd November. The exhibition will feature some of his most recent work which has been specially prepared for exhibitions during the Year of Visual Arts 1996. A well known local artist, Peter Hicks previously taught art at the Queen Elizabeth VI Form College in Darlington and now works full time as an artist from his Danby Studio.

Images From Landscape shows Peter Hicks' strong association with the landscape of the North Yorkshire Moors where he now has his home. His large canvasses illustrate the dramatic beauty of the

area and draws inspiration from the tradition of British artists such as Turner and Blake. He has said: 'In my work I attempt to celebrate the values of the visionary as many 19th century artists did, but in the context of 20th century painting practice'. Accompanying the exhibition will be a free gallery tour with Peter Hicks on Wednesday September 25th at 2.00pm This will be followed by a lecture on the same evening at 7.00pm. The Myles Meehan

Landlords will Speak to the **District Council**

We have discussed your concerns in some detail with your Landlords and it is agreed that arrangements shall be made to hold a meeting with representatives of Sedgefield District Council, with a view to undertaking a joint exercise for seeking to enhance the function of Newton Aycliffe as a district shopping centre. It is hoped that these discussions shall result in positive proposals and action.

It has been stated that the rents are ever increasing and their levels unjustified. However, having reviewed the levels of rental for various rent reviews to shops between 1986 and 1996, it is quite clear that the levels of rent within Newton Aycliffe Shopping Centre have actually grown at a rate less than the level of growth in the retail price index, which is probably the best way of gauging increases in costs of items charged by retailers.

A number of shop units have been let over the last five to ten years, which helped to show the levels of rent people are willing to pay for shop units within the Town Centre. After the shop units are initially let, the rents become subject to review, most commonly on a five yearly basis. The majority of tenants are represented by surveyors, so there can be no question of rental levels being unjustified as your professional advisors have agreed that the relevant rent is suitable for your premises.

In certain cases there have been disputes between the Landlords surveyors and the tenants surveyors, the rents have subsequently been determined by an Independent Surveyor, all of which helps to establish the fact that a certain level of rent is appropriate to certain locations within the Town Centre.

2. Mix of Shops.

The mix of shops within any shopping area is determined by the perceived requirements of the retailer. You Landlords would similarly like additional major retailers within the shopping centre, but the research undertaken by the retailers presumably shows that there is insufficient catchment area. Normally the major retailers shall carry out extensive research into particular towns and conurbations, in order to determine whether there is a sufficient catchment area to cover the costs of them opening within those locations. Whilst the costs payable to the Landlord may form a major part of expenditure for a sole trader or small company, it is in many instances a relatively minor element for national and large regional companies. At the end of the day, it is not possible to force different shop types to take leases within Newton Aycliffe.

From time to time shop units have become vacant and have been actively marketed either by Landlords agents, or agents appointed on behalf of individual tenants. There have been occasions when potential new tenants have been refused, in order to avoid excessive competition for the

existing tenants.
You shall probably be aware of the proposed development on the former Avenue School site. Your Landlords have been actively involved in liaising with both Durham County Council and Sedgefield District Council, in conjunction with other advisors in order to try and determine the most appropriate use for this site, whilst seeking to maximise the benefits for the Town Centre, but minimising the adverse effects upon existing tenants.

Another development of which you may be aware was the proposed retail warehousing development upon the former Moores factory site within Newton Aycliffe. At the time when the proposal was put forward we wrote to all tenants within the Town Centre, the letters being delivered by hand, seeking views and comments. It was perceived that any retail warehousing development upon the periphery of the town would be detrimental to the levels of trading within the shopping centre and upon this basis, and objection was submitted. Following consideration of the planning application, together with the objections, the Council decided that planning permission should not be granted. Upon the basis of the foregoing, it is hoped that you shall appreciate that your Landlords have sought to protect existing users within the Town Centre, whilst actively seeking to encourage other users which are not already

3. Service Charge and Trading Environment Within any Town Centre, there are mevitably I with vandalism, Newton Aycliffe is no exception. In conjunction with the local Constabulary your Landlords seek to discourage vandalism and graffiti, which effects the overall appearance of the Town Centre. This particular aspect probably goes hand in hand with the question of

service charges. It is always possible to spend considerable sums of money in maintaining a development such as Newton Aycliffe Shopping Centre. However, it is also necessary to try and temper the levels of expenditure incurred, in order that too many items are not allocated against any one year. In terms of comparative levels of service charge expenditure. the development does compare favourably with other developments and in general it would appear that, as a percentage of rent these service charges run at less than

We believe that it is important to emphasise that your concerns are not going unheeded and discussions are being held with the Local Authority with a view to seeking to improve the Town Centre generally. There is no one single answer to the concerns which have been raised, it is probably a number of factors on both a regional and national basis.

Letter to the Editor "ACCESS ONLY" FOR HGV's MIGHT BE THE **ANSWER**

Dear Sir,

In the last issue of your newspaper, there was an article which criticised the odd positioning of new road signs prohibiting vehicles exceeding 7.5 tons weight from using School Aycliffe Lane.

The writer suggested the signs should be removed and repositioned at the Heighington roundabout and at the west side of the Hydro entrance. That would prohibit all vehicles exceeding 7.5 tons from going along the road in either

The Lane is the only access to School Aycliffe. Should all heavy goods vehicles delivering to the village be banned and other services including Removal Vans, Refuse Lorries? There has to unrestricted access for all heavy vehicles from the railway bridge junction to the Hydro entrance. A weight restriction from Hydro to the Heighington roundabout, and vice versa, would not work!

Should HGV drivers, who intend to go to the Heighington bypass, and who see a weight restriction sign at the Hydro entrance, go into Hydro's entrance to turn round?

"Access Only" plates displayed below the signs would perhaps be one answer, if Hydro was not there, but the "7.5 ton weight limit ahead" sign, which is opposite the entrance to High Barn Road, does not deter drivers going past it towards Heighington.

If they were law abiding citizens they would turn to their right and go down High Barn Road and up Eastfields Road, through School Aycliffe, to return whence they came. Is this what the legislators of this traffic order would like to

The problem at School Aycliffe is not heavy vehicles, but speeding vehicles of all kinds, A 'chicane' near High Barn Road junction, which was constructed 2-3 years ago to hinder speedsters, only slightly irritates drivers.

It was not put there to aid pedestrians for there is only one footpath, Vehicles tear past at high speed with out the slightest deviation and as a speed reducer the 'chicane' is

But nothing will change unless a Road Engineer, who really understands the problem, redesigns the alignment of the Lane where it approaches High Barn Road. There needs to be a truly effective speed reducer at that place, something that will make every driver slow down and drop a gear or

Until it happens, the weight restriction, speed limits and all the other clutter are a waste of time and money and a source

I have heard it suggested that 'sleeping policemen' humps would do the trick, but airborne traffic crashing into nearby gardens would probably be a daily occurrence, and why should the innocent suffer.

Perhaps the local Constabulary could tell us, if and when a speeder at School Aycliffe, has been successfully prosecuted, or a driver who has ignored a weight restriction

Yes, Barnard Castle has them, but there are cameras at that place to identify offenders.

I do not think that our Police Superintendent would be happy to instruct his traffic officers to use up valuable time sorting out this problem. If I am wrong, why have we not read of

Well-meaning people conjure up these schemes, but why do they not think them through, before much time and money is squandered?



more complete picture should be available by the end of September 1996 when the majority of investigations are likely to be concluded.

Results have been achieved from investigations following tip offs from members of the public on the Freephone 0800 854 440, which is now the National Fraud Hot-line, as well as through special antifraud initiatives.

* Investigators accompanied police in Darlington and Newton Aycliffe to 10 spot check traffic stops of transit and small vans, resulting in 22 people withdrawing claims to unemployment and incapacity benefits with benefit savings of £62,000.

* Visits by investigators to more than 40 bedsit properties in Darlington uncovered 14 false claims to benefit giving savings of £30,000. A further 6 claims are still under question.

Six people working at Darlington Market withdrew claims to unemployment benefits after a visit to the market by investigators.

Other initiatives have included building sites, small unit industrial estates and restaurants across the area.

Margaret Kirby of the Benefits Agency says, "The end of 'Spot Light' does not mean the end of our anti-fraud activity. We investigate allegations of false claims 52 weeks of the year."

"More than 50% of our investigations lead to benefit being withdrawn reduced. Our investigators must establish concrete evidence before a claim can be withdrawn and honest people with genuine claims to benefit have nothing to fear.'
